The ATCV recommends any prospective adoptee organises an independent veterinary and dog behaviour assessment before making any commitments to take ownership of an adult Airedale Terrier.

Once you have registered your interest in adopting an adult Airedale the Club representative will add your name to a waiting list. When a suitable adoptee is registered the Club will contact you with details. All negotiations following that will be between you and the prospective adoptee.

After a period of 12 months a Club representative will contact you to ascertain whether you wish to remain on the waiting list. If you obtain a dog and wish your name be removed from the list please contact the Club.

The Club strongly recommends a fee be paid for the adopted dog. In line with the RSPCA adoption fees an amount between \$200-\$400 or an amount agreed to by the Breeder of the Airedale.

A checklist of 'to do's' before taking on ownership of an adopted adult:

- Research the breed – talk to experts, experienced owners/breeders.
- If possible visit a breeder or attend a Club function to meet owners and dogs.
- Read information on the breed supplied by the Club
- Check the household environment for suitability to house a dog.
- Be familiar with associated costs in keeping a dog – veterinary costs, annual immunisations, worming, suitable diet, grooming costs, kennelling costs if going on holidays, ability/willingness for daily exercise
- Time to devote to daily care of a dog.
