Tremenheere's Ch Balliol Gellert Grindalwald.





Dangerous Foods for Dogs

(Thank you to David Finch for this article)

Caution owners against feeding certain human foods.

Here are some common examples:

Chocolate: contains theobromine, which is a cardiac and nervous system stimulant. Ingestion of chocolate, particularly dark chocolate, can lead to heart arrhythmias, tremors and seizures.

Sweet biscuits: are high in fat and sugar with low nutritional value.

Bones: certain bones can splinter and may stick in the throat or intestine (Chicken). They could also damage teeth and may cause constipation, recommended you use the uncooked lamb leg bones, this helps to clean the teeth and reduce bad breath.

Sultanas, grapes, raisins: may lead to acute kidney failure in dogs.

Onions (and to a lesser extent, garlic): can cause damage to the membranes of red blood cells that results in a haemolytic anaemia. Any form (raw, cooked or powder) can lead to this severe anaemia. Signs generally develop days after ingestion and include breathlessness, weakness and blood coloured urine.

Avocado: contains a toxin called persin which leads to gastrointestinal irritation, including vomiting and diarrhoea.

Raw egg whites: contain avidin that can interfere with the absorption of biotin (a B vitamin). Chronic biotin deficiencies can lead to a poor growth, lethargy and dermatitis. Raw eggs may also contain salmonella.

Macadamia nuts: can cause locomotory problems such as weakness, tremors or paralysis in the hind legs. A toxic dose of roasted macadamia nuts may be as little as one nut per kilogram of body weight in the dog.

New Supreme Champion



Congratulations to Shane Thomas who had a wonderful weekend on July 8th when his when his dog Kingsley Best in Show and gained his final points to make up his Supreme Championship title.

He will now be known as Supreme Champion Toi Toi North'N Kiwi

This was his 14th Best in Show Award- an achievement to be proud of. He was also the first Griffon in Australia to gain this title so it was a fabulous weekend of firsts.

Kingsley was bred by Sue

Berkhan of New Zealand and came over to Shane as a pup. I am sure it is a proud achievement for her.

What is a Supreme Champion?

The Supreme Champion title is a new title that was introduced into Australia on 1st July 2012. It is the highest award that a show dog can win and in order to do so they have to have beaten a large number of dogs over a period of time.

How does this work?

Here in Australia we have three show titles – The Supreme Champion, the Grand Champion and the Champion.

Champion: In order for a dog to become a Champion a dog has to win 100 points at shows. To win the points they need to be 6 months of age or older and the award that they win is called the Challenge. Shows offer a Dog Challenge and a Bitch Challenge and the number of points that they win are based on the number of dogs that they defeat. However no matter how many dogs they beat they cannot get more than 25 points at any show.

Grand Champion: Points for the Grand Champion title are gained in the same way as for a Champion, however for this award the dogs needs to win 1000 points.

Supreme Champion: To become a Supreme Champion a dog needs to have won 1000 points and they also need to have won either 3 Best in Show awards or 10 Best in Group awards. To get this title means that they have to beat a lot of dogs in very difficult competition



Congratulations to Diana Norman and Tim Mills who have a new Champion – Ch Tzani Launchpad McQuack.

He is sired by Donzeata Royal Star (imp UK) and Ch Tzani Blueberry Tart (AI) and is the first Champion for both parents.

Diana wrote; He is only 10 months old so has done well considering the increased competition up here these days. He has won several nice big BOB's and a few class in groups along the way to his title. The most memorable would have to be his first show last New Year's Eve when he won Baby in Show. He barked at the judge and every big dog in the line up, strutted his stuff like a profession but hardly ever put all

four feet on the ground at once! He was a real crowd pleaser that day and the applause for his win was louder than it had been for the Best in Show winner!

Congratulations to Tim and Diana again for breeding another Champion - **Ch Tzani Kiss Me Kate** who is owned and handled by Naomi Lawrence.

Congratulations to Terri O Dell for gaining another Rally Obedience title. This time with

Ch Nagpuni Jellybean Jazz RN who gained her final pass on her 4th birthday making her the second ever griffon in Australia to have achieved this title. The first Griffon was Jazzy's sister Brooklyn who was featured in the last edition.

This is a fantastic achievement as two years ago Jazzy injured her back and had badly pinched nerves preventing her from using her hind legs. With lots of massage, physiotherapy and gentle exercise Jazzy slowly got her

movement back and has now achieved this title. It is a credit to the care and training that Terri has put in to Jazzy.

2011-2012 Point Score Competition Results

The 2011-2012 Point Score competition was another successful competition with a total of 24 Griffons belonging to club members competing in the competition.

At some shows we saw large entries of Griffons – The Flat Face Show in April had an entry of 25 Griffons making it one of the largest breed entries in the show while a number of other shows also saw entries of 17 & 19 Griffons

We had wonderful support from our members for the fabulous Point score prizes. Terri and Grant Odell of **Pets on the Park** donated a dog crate for the overall winner of the Point score and some MicroTech Grooming products for the Runner up. - This competition is open to Puppies from 3 months of age up to the age of 18 months. (Baby Puppy Junior)
- 2. Points will be awarded in the same way as the Open Point score competition.
- 3. Puppies may compete in the Open Point score competition and the Puppy Competition simultaneously
- 4. Points will be awarded to exhibits at designated point score shows of the Griffon Fanciers Association
- 5. Points will be awarded in the following manner:

Best in Show	50 points	Challenge (without BOB or Runner up)	6 points
Runner Up in Show	40 points	Reserve Challenge (without BOB or Runner up)	5 points
Class in Show	30 points	First in Class	3 points
Best in Group	25 points	Second in Class	2 points
Runner Up in Group	20 points	Third in class	1 point
Class in Group	15 points		
Best of Breed	10 points		
Runner up in Breed	8 points		

- 6. Points awarded to the exhibit will be highest result gained by an exhibit. They will not be accumulative at a single show.
- 7. The total points gained by each exhibit will be added together and published in The Phoenix
- 8. Puppies will compete in this until they reach the age of 18 months. All points accumulated up to the age of 18 months will be counted towards the point score. All points gained after the age of 18 months will not be counted in the Puppy Point Score but will go towards the Open Point Score
- A separate recognition will be given for the best Puppy in the Point score and the Runner up.
 Non Members will not be eligible in either Point score

First Point Score Show 2012-2013 Results

The new Point Score competition has already commenced with the first show at the **North of the Harbour International Show on Saturday 21st July.** This is a large show of about 1500 dogs with a full international panel of judges.

The entry was down with only 11 Griffons entered. This was because of a variety of reasons - injury



and inability to attend by some exhibitors.

The judge for the Griffons was Mr Ekarat Sangkunakup (Thailand. He was a friendly judge with a sense of humour and he chatted and joked with the exhibitors which made showing a pleasant experience for everyone. He seemed to like the Griffons and he particularly liked the smooths, putting them up into both major awards. He was also willing to put young dogs up and the BOB came from Minor Puppy at just over 6 months of age while the Bitch CC was a Puppy and the Reserve Bitch CC from the Junior class.

Best of Breed was new Griffon exhibitor Ashleigh Barber with her smooth red boy Cricklewood Night of Magic in Paris (imp NZ)(Neville). He was bred by Sandie Feaver and David Fifield and is from CH/NZ Ch Paris Night Fever and Mowacre Cynthia Darling.

This win was a lovely surprise to Ashleigh as it was Neville's first show as a minor puppy and he was only

just eligible for the Challenge. To top off a great win he then went onto win Minor Puppy in Group.
