and two


black and tans, one boy and one girl of each colour.


mating and he also whelped the litter.

History of the Breed (Part Three)

The Period between the Two World Wars

World War One had a drastic impact on the breed.

In 1913, the year before the war started a total of 162 Griffons had been registered with the kennel club in England. In 1918, that final year of the war only 3 Griffons had been registered.

The economic impact of the war on the country was enormous and food was heavily rationed making it difficult for people to feed themselves, let alone feed their dogs. Government edicts against hoarding food and stiff penalties for those who disobeyed made it even more difficult to maintain a kennel, much less breed dogs.

In Europe, the impact was even greater. Belgium had been the battle field of much of the war and was left a crushed weakened country. Unremitting heavy shelling, trench war fare and the use of mustard gas had destroyed villages, roads and valuable farm lands. There was little food available for the Belgians and they could scarcely feed themselves much less their dogs which had become a luxury.

However despite the hardships in both Britain and Belgium some kennels did manage to survive and

save their breeding stock even if they could not breed during the war years.

In Belgium one of the top winning Griffons of 1914, a rough dog named 'Bouquet' survived and was considered to be the truest to type that the breed had known.

Immediately after the Armistice breeding in Belgium began and progressed by leaps and bounds, so much so that within a few years there were rumoured to be about 5000 brood bitches in the vicinity of Brussels.¹

In England 3 of the 4 leading Griffon kennels managed to survive and commence breeding when the war ended.

They were :

- Copthorne (Mrs Handley Spicer)
- Glenarty (Mrs Whaley)
- Sunnymeade (Miss AJ Johnson).

Such growth continued well into the 1920's and 1930's when Griffons became quite fashionable little dogs.

The extract below from the 1931 *Women & Dogs* magazine shows how Griffons were the fashionable ladies dog of the time

In addition the Partridge Hill kennel of Mrs Parker Rhodes and Vulcan kennel of The Hon Mrs Ionides also survived leaving Britain with a very strong foundation with which to recommence breeeding.

England, like Belgium saw a rapid and enthusiastic growth in Griffon breeding in this period between the wars. As well as the established pre- war kennels a large number of new English kennels began during this time.

They were:

"Me and darling Pinkie". Wrote Mrs Patrick Campbell (1865-1940)- the greatest British actress of her generation and original Eliza Doolittle in George Bernard Shaw's Pygmalionon this photograph of her little monkey griffon. A German "lady's dog", she was presented to the actress by King of the Belgians. The breed was the height of fashion and, as was only fitting for such a grand little thing, she dined off the best china and slept in the bosom of her mistress. The pair were inseparable and quarantine laws were regularly broken. When Pinkie was old and fragile, Mrs Campbell tried smuggling her back to England after an American tour, buying a Mexican parakeet to accompany them in the cabin; when Pinkie barked, she could tell them it was the clever mimicking bird. Unfortunately the secret was discovered, but Mrs Campbell, pleading that her old dog was blind and almost toothless, was let off with a fine of only thirty shillings (150 pounds), and was allowed to keep Pinkie. Her other

dogs included a Japanese Chin, and a Pekingese called Moonbeam. Taken from: "Women & Dogs. UK, 1931

Up until this time it was not unusual for Griffons to have 'webbed feet'. This was thought to be due to the earlier crossings of the breed with the English Toy Spaniels.

Although there were no health problems that seemed to be associated with the web feet, after WWI the authorities in Belgium decided to make a 'stand against the 'web foot'. It was declared a disqualifying fault and breeders were not permitted to breed from any web footed stock. The 'web foot' was soon eradicated at

huge cost as large numbers of quality dogs were wiped from breeding programs.



The breed became depleted and quality rapidly deteriorated.

It seemed that it was the best dogs that were linked with the 'webbed feet' – they were the dogs with the best heads, the large nostrils and the high nose placement qualities that gave the Griffon face its unique characteristics.

With most of the best breeding stock eliminated from breed programs, the Belgium breeders had little to work with and by 1939 there were very few Griffons left. When WWII broke out, breeding ceased and by the end of the war the breed was almost extinct in their home country.

This did not happen in Great Britain. The question of web feet was considered but the English had the fore sight to recognise the qualities that were linked with the web feet and did not declare it a fault. The breeding of Griffons in the UK therefore continued to increase in quality.



These kennel started to produce high quality Griffons, probably the best in the world, and the legacy lives on today in the dogs that they produced.

Challenge and Reserve Challenge winners for 2011.

(For those not familiar with the English system - a quick explanation. It is probably the hardest country in the world in which to gain a Championship title. To get the Championship title a dog must win a total of 3 Challenges. That may sound easy but there are only about 30 Championship shows in the whole year and they do not all have Challenges available for all breeds. In 2011 there were only 20 shows which offered challenges for Griffons. When shows are held that do offer Challenges then the entry is usually 80 to 100 or more Griffons. Non Champion dogs must compete against Champions

so the competition is very tough. A dog that wins its English Championship title has beaten a lot of dogs in order to win it so it is highly valued. Ed.)
