Critiques

BULL TERRIER MINIATURE

Puppy dog

1 - A typey, sound, balanced puppy dog with lots going for it. Good quarters and adequate bone. A nice little package but would prefer the tail to be carried lower.

Junior dog

3 - 15mths, adequate head, good expression with correct small eye, slightly upright in shoulder and straight in rear, would prefer slightly shorter in body.

Intermediate dog

6 - two year old dog, a very good head but lacking in underjaw, body needs more substance, prefer a wider ribcage, tail carriage is incorrect.

7 – adequate head, good forechest and shoulders, would prefer a tad more bone and substance, showed very well, good movement.

Open dog

8 – Adequate head and movement, slightly upright in shoulder, would prefer more substance and bone, this is a terrier type, mouth is OK.

DCC - 7, RDCC - 1

Baby puppy bitch

10 – reverse scissor bite, would prefer more substance but still young, time will tell with this one.

Minor puppy bitch

11 – very feminine looking, adequate bone, good mouth, a very promising bitch. (first)

12 – brindle bitch that needs maturity, both in body and behaviour. Looks whippety at present, needing more width of head and substance through the body. (second)

Puppy bitch

13 – 11.5 mths, nicely proportioned bitch, with an adequate head and good forechest, a well put together puppy.

Junior bitch

15 – a well-trained bitch but lacking breadth of head and is browy, needs more bone, would prefer smaller ears and a stronger rear drive, feet are east-west. (Second)

16 – Another well trained bitch also lacking breadth of head and looking browy, but overall a better shape and with better bone than previous bitch. (First)

Australian Bred bitch

18 – A rather plain head with a broken outline, adequate bone and fair movement but lacking forechest and down on pasterns.

Open bitch

19 – A fair sized bitch with good forequarters and reasonable forechest, would prefer more bone, rear movement is a little close, ticked coat is undesirable. (First)

20 – This bitch is straight in shoulder with a sloping topline, the left foreleg turns out, rear structure was reasonable. (Second)

BCC - 11, RBCC - 13

BOB - 7, ruBOB - 1.

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Critiques

21 – nice young pup, showed OK.

Minor puppy dog

23 – slight mouth fault, adequate bone and movement is OK, a nice young dog. (Second)

24 – good head with a piercing eye, excellent bone but poor movement and straight in rear. (Third)

25 – an upstanding dog with excellent bone, a fair head with well-placed ears, a slight mouth fault. (First)

Puppy dog

27 – this boy has a good head and mouth but presently has ears down. He has good bone but his movement was very loose in front.

Junior dog

28 – superbly placed eyes with piercing expression, ears on top of head and correctly placed, good forechest, would prefer more bone. (First)

29 – a pleasing head and good neck, needs to mature, would prefer more substance. (Second)

Intermediate dog

32 – a 2.5 year old, this male is all dog! Excellent bone and substance, a lovely forechest and a good head. Moved well. (First)

30 – head is ok with a beautiful eye, very good bone, more of a terrier type, would prefer more substance. (Second)

Open dog

33 – an adequate head, quite a gay tail and a sloping topline. (Third)

35 – a substantial dog with a good head, adequate bone, carried tail high. (First)

36 – substantial dog with a reasonable head and a strong, firm body. (Second)

DCC - 32, RDCC - 30

Baby puppy bitch

?? – good bone and nice forequarters, an adequate chest, should mature well.

Puppy bitch

39 – adequate bone and a good shape, but short in foreface with a mouth fault, still had a nice expression.

Junior bitch

40 – maturing well, good body shape and forechest, enough bone and a clean head. (First)

41 – adequate bone and fair quarters, a clean head but lacking forechest. (Second)

42 – a solid bitch with decent bone and a nice dark eye but not well behaved, needs to mature. (Third)

Intermediate bitch

45 – adequate bone and a nice head, ticking not desirable and needs training, hard to assess due to behaviour. (Third)

46 – very feminine bitch with an excellent eye, very good outline, plenty of bone, a terrier type. (First)

49 – good body, movement is a little loose in front, difficult to assess due to behaviour, needs training.(Second)

Australian Bred bitch

50 – Good forechest and body, slightly straight in stifle, lovely expression. (First)

51 – brindle and white with a nice head and straight front, would prefer more depth of underjaw and more substance all over. (Second)

Open bitch

53 – a well-balanced bitch with a nice head and good shoulders, adequate bone. (First)

54 – good forechest and head with nice depth of underjaw, enough bone. (Second)

55 – a pretty head and adequate bone but very low stationed, was told she has recently had pups. (Third)
