President's Report

How time flies when you're having fun. It has been a privilege to have served as President for the Bendigo Obedience Dog Club this year - and what a year!

One of my goals was to increase our instructor base so that we had sufficient enthusiastic new instructors and assistant instructors to support the ever-increasing demand for affordable effective dog training. We have a dedicated group of experienced instructors who show up every week, often twice or more during the week, and in all weather conditions to ensure our regular classes proceed 'as advertised'. We also have our specialist class instructors who bring a wider range of skills and opportunities to our members. Welcome to our new instructors Sarah, Jodie, Bryn and Monique.

We have started to introduce class notes for participants to take at the end of each session. Often there is just too much to learn during a class so a 'cheat sheet' to assist practice times has been well received. I hope we can continue to refine this system in the future.

There is a growing expectation from the community for dog clubs to offer practical training designed to help build engagement between handlers and dogs. Research shows that when owners have a better understanding of the needs of their dogs and they are provided with current science-based knowledge, the outcome is most likely to be a well socialised dog. Dog incidents are less frequent as handlers understand triggers and have strategies to cope with anxious or reactive dogs. I aim for classes to be fun, safe and informative over a wide range of skills and that the Bendigo Obedience Dog Club will continue to be a trendsetter.

As a Club we have had to deal with some inconvenience during the year with the demolition of the old, inaccessible toilets being replaced, temporarily, with Portable Toilets and the limitations they naturally have. It hasn't always been pleasant! Now, however, as we have the long-awaited new facilities, we can be proud to run events and classes with real toilets that can be utilised safely by everyone.

Into the future we will need to manage the ageing infrastructure and maintain safe practices until further maintenance issues can be resolved. Some of our buildings need restumping, roofing repairs and insulation. Our evening classes would benefit from better lighting across the grounds. Our enclosed outdoor spaces would be more useable if there were fewer grass seeds in summer and more even surfaces. These are the challenges that will require work as the Club goes forward.

Finally, there must be a huge Thank You to all our instructors, committee members and our general members. There are no islands in clubs - every person contributes to the best of their ability. Instructors who show up and share their vast reserves of knowledge, committee members who plan and guide the Club's direction and meet its fiduciary responsibilities and our general members who keep coming back and providing positive incentives for the rest of us to continue giving hundreds of hours of unpaid work, empowering owners to be awesome in the eyes of their dogs.

Secretary's Report

2025 has been a year of new looks, new approaches and new infrastructure. It was with trepidation I took on the role of Secretary 12 months ago, stepping in to fill the enormous shoes left by Heather Turpie who was Secretary for 20+ years. However, the impact and feedback provided by club members has made the efforts of all our volunteers (investing time, treasure and talent) worth every second.

Our club was supported by **197 members** (be it a single, family or pensioner membership) in 2025 – they had a need for training or wanted to strengthen their engagement with their dog and most attended one of our training classes for a term or the entire year.

Five members joined the **committee** for the first time in 2025, bringing new energy and talent to the Club. As Meredith highlighted in her Presidents report, we also saw people step up to **instruct** and assist for the first time and for the 1000th time, ensuring we have capacity to continue to offer our classes. Throughout 2025 we generally held committee and instructor meetings on alternate months, with a couple of combined meetings held.

From a **governance** perspective the Committee approved a new Behaviour Policy and Code of Conduct, modelled on that of Dogs Victoria and available on our website. We have also updated all instructors with current Working With Children Checks and are developing a Child Safe policy. Our First Aid equipment was upgraded and we have a formal register of accredited volunteers.

New committee members Jodie, Deb and Bryn redesigned and built our refreshed **website** – a key portal for members to find information about what we do and how to get involved. This was and continues to be a significant and on-going piece of work. Deb and Jodie also designed and produce our quarterly **newsletter** - The Recall – with a refreshed look with invited articles and features. And designed our new **brochure** which communicates what we offer for new dog owners and local residents.

Some new things come to clubs who are persistent – and after consistent and persistent engagement by Club office bearers over many years, we are delighted with the **toilets** built by the City of Greater Bendigo. I'd like to express my appreciation of COGB Facilities Liaison Officer Karly Bingham for her assistance bringing this long-term dream to reality. Now we will turn our focus to addressing the standard of the club building and training facilities.

In 2025 we used funds made possible by memberships to purchase **equipment** including trial fencing, mobile lights and trailer for winter evening training, agility tyre and training weave poles, tables, and iPads for trial ring scribes. Our grounds and buildings have been cared for and repaired by Clive, Bryn, Meredith and Sian – their time and skills to quietly improve our home grounds are deeply appreciated! And our mobile lights have been made safer by Steve and Nicole and will be in use for the 2026 winter terms – thank you!

Participation in classes

Class participation through out 2025 was high! Our social class 4/5 continues to grow and we reinstated a 4/5 trialling class in 2025 due to the number of members commencing their obedience and rally trial journey. Thanks to check-in coordinators Jodie & Bryn, managing a new google sheet check in system.

Classes delivered...

- Baby Puppies – a critical early step for any puppy to help build socialisation skills.
- Older Puppies – this class is where we see many new members start their engagement and training journey on a Wednesday night.
- Beginners – a popular class in 2025 we ran two Beginner classes in Term 4 after we had insufficient instructors to offer the class in Term 3. This class is also where our new members first gain experience in one of our classes.
- Advanced Beginners – focused on building engagement and skills before dogs and handlers graduate to Sunday classes.
- Class 1 – a foundation class that has been lucky to have had long time instructor Greg bring his expertise each week, but Greg took a leave of absence in Term 4 when others stepped in.
- Class 2 – starting to formalise key obedience and rally skills, this class was supported by a number of instructors over the year.
- Class 3 – refining technique and finesse this class is the final one before graduating to off lead skills.
- Class 4/5 social – developing relaxed and sound social skills in a fun and engaging way, with a lot of off leash work.
- Class 4/5 ring craft – a focused class reinstated in 2025 due to the number of members starting to formally trial in obedience and rally. This class is delivered by different experienced members during trial the season.
- Wednesday morning help class – formalised in 2025, this class offers a more intimate opportunity to build on skills taught in classes 1-5 training and space to work on engagement with dogs and handlers that struggle in busy environments.
- Agility - agility class participation is growing thanks to the delivery of two *Introduction to Agility* programs delivered in 2025.
- Scent Work – scent work popularity is also on the rise with a high number of members participating in one of the two *Beginner Scent Work* programs offered in 2025 and then being supported with informal member groups practising and continuing their training journey in a collaborative and supportive environment.
- Tricks – a long running specialist class offered each week through the terms, building engagement and skills that translate not only to the tricks ring but also to the rally course and dance floor.

Acknowledging achievements in competitions

At the AGM in March the Club gave out awards for 2024 titles gained by members. 59 titles were achieved across 7 disciplines. Nicole Crameri and Bob Pickle took out the 2024 Henri Award for the top performance dog. Thanks to Denise Chrystal for coordinating the compilation of awards each year.

The 2025 year has seen a fantastic number of members participating in a range of trials, having success and fun with their dogs. Our specialist classes have enabled club members to explore and experience a wide range of dog sports with skilled and supportive guidance. We are exceptionally lucky to have so many members donate their time and talent to help each other in progressing through various sports and levels.

Workshops & Demos delivered

We don't have all the skills and knowledge needed to help every dog and handler teams grow, and over the last 12 months we invited specialist trainers to deliver very targeted workshops. These included:

- Tracking 101 Workshop with Mark Murray – in September
- Scent Work Workshop with Jo Bates – in January
- Rally Workshop with Ross Carlson – in March

We were also invited to demonstrate what the Club offers at the 2025 Bendigo Agricultural Show. Meredith coordinated two days of demos of obedience, scent work, tricks and agility skills with 16 members volunteering their time over the two days.

Social events

It wasn't always focused training – we celebrated End of Term Graduations with games and applause at the conclusion of each Term. And our annual Christmas Break Up once again saw dress ups, some new games and relaxed coffee and tea with friendships formed during the year and even had a dog-free Christmas dinner at a local venue.

Thank you to several **businesses who supported us** in 2025: Bart 'n' Print, Zali & Co, Everything K9, LLPetsHealth, LifeWise, 4Legs and Kong. Your donations and support mean we can direct our cash to other things such as new equipment.

The role of Secretary is never glamorous and carries a solid amount of administration, but it has been made easier by the support of Meredith and Sarah, our President and Treasurer respectively, and a number of committee members who were always happy to help out when life and work made it challenging to keep my head above water. Thank you!

I reflect with pride on what we have achieved in 2025 despite some headwinds, and the groundwork laid for the 2026 year.

Agility Trial Report

The Bendigo Obedience Dog Club hosted their annual Agility and Jumping Trial over the 2025 Cup weekend.

Seventy-four dogs took part, completing 475 runs of agility and jumping courses. Novice, Excellent and Masters level dogs competed on 26 different courses designed by three different judges over the two days.

Agility competition courses include about twenty different obstacles: jumps, tunnels, weave poles and contact obstacles the dog runs or scrambles over. Obstacle jump heights are suited to the dogs, jumps at 200mm, 300mm, 400mm, 500 mm or 600mm based on the height of the dog at the withers. Dogs are required to learn obstacles such as hoops, tunnels, weaving poles, A-frame, dog walk, see saw and jumps.

During the course the handler cannot touch the dog, nor the obstacles. The goal is to complete the course without faults and as fast as possible.

A 'clear round' must be obtained to receive a "Qualification" which is no time faults or course faults recorded on the course. As qualifications are gained "Titles" are awarded and the dog will progress to the next higher class.

At the Bendigo Trial 109 Qualifying Passes were achieved from the 475 runs – highlighting just how challenging this sport can be. Bendigo Club members who achieved passes include:

The Club awarded the **Dot Heffernan Memorial Sash for Fastest Qualifying Jumping** round to Loki and Lisa McPherson. And the **Ian McCallum Memorial Sash for Fastest Qualifying Agility** round to Isabelle and Alex Gartmann (handler on the day due to injured owner).

As each course is different, handlers are allowed a short walk-through (typically 10 minutes) before the event starts. During this time, all handlers competing in a particular class can walk around the course without their dogs, determining how they can best position themselves and guide their dogs to get the most accurate and rapid path around the numbered obstacles. The handler tends to run a path much different from the dog's path, so the handler can sometimes spend quite a bit of time planning for what is usually a quick run.

The walk-through is critical for success because the course's path takes various turns, even U-turns or 270° turns, can cross back on itself, can use the same obstacle more than once, can have two obstacles so close to each other that the dog and handler must be able to clearly *discriminate* which to take, and can be arranged so that the handler must work with obstacles between themselves and the dog, called layering, or at a great distance from the dog.

Each dog and handler team gets one opportunity together to attempt to complete the course successfully. The dog begins behind a starting line and, when instructed by their handler, proceeds around the course. The handler typically runs near the dog, directing the dog with spoken commands and with body language (the position of arms, shoulders, and feet).

Because speed counts as much as accuracy, especially at higher levels of competition, this all takes place at a full-out run on the dog's part and, in places, on the handler's part as well. Scoring of runs is based on how many *faults* are incurred. Penalties can include not only *course faults*, such as knocking down a bar in a jump, but also *time faults*, which are the number of seconds over the calculated *standard course time*, which in turn is determined based on the competition level, the complexity of the course, and other factors.

NADAC Agility Trial Report

The Bendigo Obedience Dog Club supported 'Paws to Consider' running two NADAC Agility trials in Bendigo, in June and September 2025.

With separate class divisions for Veterans and Junior Handlers and a variety of games, NADAC dog agility offers something for everyone! NADAC courses are traditionally fun and fast due to the flow and distance between obstacles. The goal is to maintain an environment that tests dog and handler teams with appropriate challenges, while combining speed, accuracy, distance, and teamwork.

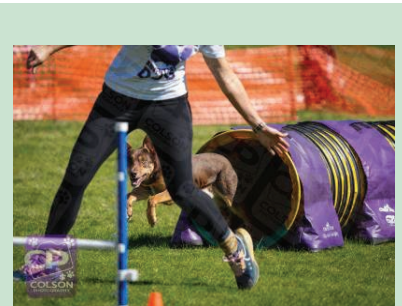
There is only ever a single ring running, which means less distractions for dogs and handlers. Dogs can jump at lower heights meaning older dogs can continue to do a sport they love without the impact on their bodies. NADAC offer courses with no jumping, such as Tunnellers and Grounders, which focus on directional control without high impact on dog joints and muscles.

Over the last couple of years the Club has delivered several 'Introduction to Agility' multi-week programs. As a result, there are a number of members building foundations and kicking off their agility journey – and NADAC is a fabulous place to test your skills in a supportive and low stress environment.

The June trial saw 10 club members competing across 4 different courses in very cold and foggy conditions. In September 10 club members enjoyed a day of achievements under sunny blue skies.

Thanks go to Shirlene Clark from Paws to Consider for bringing a NADAC trial to Bendigo. It is a unique opportunity to trial at our own grounds and not have to travel!

Obedience & Rally Trial Report

Bendigo Obedience Dog Club held its annual Obedience and Rally trial on Sunday 17th August at the Finn Street Recreation Reserve with 98 dogs entered and approximately 70 competitors and their families from all over the state, and a couple from interstate. This event is one of many events we hold annually at the grounds in addition to our regular training.

Country trials are always a lovely day full of support, encouragement, friendship, achievements, and the gaining of insights. But a trial does not miraculously happen – there are hours, days, and weeks of work put in by many behind the scenes to bring a perfect day to fruition. Trial Secretary Sarah Crocker, Club members, and generous volunteers all pitch in for a range of planning tasks, set up, stewarding, cooking, pack up and reporting.

There were four rings running throughout the day – two for Obedience and two for Rally.

Obedience trials demonstrate the dog and handler’s ability to work together with precision and publicly show the training they have done to achieve this. It is essential that the dog demonstrates willingness and enjoyment when working, but handlers can only give single commands to the dog for each exercise.

Classes (the levels that dogs and handlers trial in) are designed to be progressive, allowing the dog and their handler to grow their skills and experience as titles are earned. There are seven levels of obedience in Australia: Community Companion Dog (CCD), Companion Dog (CD), Companion Dog Excellent (CDX), Utility Dog (UD), Utility Dog Excellent (UDX), Obedience Champion (O. CH), and Grand Champion (O. GR.CH.). These titles become more challenging as they progress.

Rally aims to provide a fast-moving and motivational sport for both dogs and their handlers, requiring them to work as a team to complete various exercises in a set course that demonstrates competency in basic obedience exercises.

Handlers are allowed to walk the course to become familiar with it before competing. The Rally course is set out with numbered stations including a start and finish. Handlers and their dogs navigate the course by following the numbers and carrying out the exercises shown on the sign positioned at each of the numbered stations. Dogs work in the “Heel” position between exercises.

Handlers can direct their dog by talking, encouraging with praise, and patting unless specified in the rules. At the entry-level of Novice, dogs negotiate a course having between 10 and 15 stations (not including the start and finish) and work on lead during the test. There is a total of 76 stations available to be placed on a Rally course, gradually increasing in complexity as the level of Rally becomes higher. The higher levels of Rally – Advanced, Excellent and Master – use up to 24 stations including many of the more complex ones and dogs are required to navigate the course off lead with their handlers.

Denise Chrystal, Scent Work Trial Secretary

The 2025 Novice Scent Work Trial garnered a massive 200 entries in four elements. This included the highest number of Club entries to date, eleven handlers and twelve dogs.

Congratulations to all members, many of whom were entered in their very first trial or scent trial. Overall participants achieved 103 qualifications and five Scent Work Novice titles. A great outcome and experience for all.



Tracking Trial Report

The June 2025 Tracking Trial showcases a dog's ability to locate people lost in either paddocks or bush landscapes. Tracking involves training a dog to follow a scent trail and find any discarded articles of clothing along the track.

There are two types of scents, ground, and body scents.

Ground scent: is the scent of the ground disturbance left where the tracklayer has come into contact with. It contains odours coming from the bruising and damaging of grass and foliage, the crushing of roots and the scent of soil bacteria and moulds, released where surfaces of soil has been broken by the tracklayer. As a track ages, the scent of the decay organisms working on the damaged roots and plants is present.

Body Scent: is a personal scent left by the tracklayer coming from normal body odour left in the air. The tracklayer may have also touched a scrub or grass leaving their scent on it. Scent can also come from particles of skin, hair, clothing, fluff, or shoe leather shed on the track.

A trained tracking dog is expected to smell an article belonging to a tracklayer and find the track, following it until it finds the end of the track. A dog must also find and indicate any articles dropped along the track by its tracklayer.

It was great to see the many members of the Club coming out for the June weekend to help – many thanks! I need to thank the competitors who came not only to track their dog but to help with the setup of tracks and remained for the whole weekend. There were also couples who came for the entire weekend. Heather and Sandra were a great help plus they made the sandwiches for the judges and set up the judges boxes on Saturday and Sunday. Thanks to everyone who helped clean up on Sunday.

Again, a great thank you to the property owners Irene and Bill Punton for their continued support of the Club over many years.

This was my last year as Trial Secretary, and I want to thank some people who have helped me over the years. When I first started Denise Crystal put up with me for a few years and I am sure I gave her a few heart palpitations trying to get through to somehow place competitors with the correct judges. I had only been to one trial and watched a dog take off at the first leg. Sad to say I was a slow learner.

In recent years after she retired Heather Turpie brought her trailer to help me move the equipment to the venue in one trip as previously, I had to make three trips in my car. The last couple of years Meredith Marshall has also come to help with the equipment delivery. Sarah Crocker has pre-printed the pass cards for the last few years which was a great help. Thanks to all the other people who have given their time.

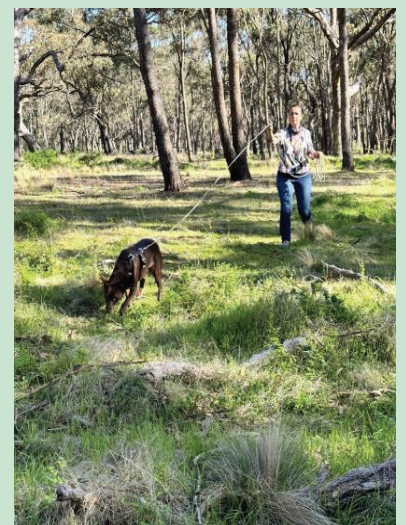
