### Reminders:

**\*Signing prior to class:** it is essential for Covid-19 regulations we know who is in class. Please ensure you sign in prior to starting class each session. This also helps us keep track of people's attendance and those eligible for graduation.

**\*Mobile Phones:** Please refrain from using your mobile phone in class. If you are expecting an important call, please inform your instructor and if the call occurs, remove yourself from the class prior to answering. Check with the instructor prior to re-joining the class so you are aware of what is happening within the class.

**\*Footwear:** For safety reasons, please ensure you are wearing sturdy, closed in footwear at all times. Thongs and high heels are not appropriate and unsafe for class and you may be asked not to take part for your own safety.

**\*Parking:** Please use common sense when parking. Parking behind the clubhouse is restricted to committee members and instructors. Please keep roadways clear to ensure ease of access for all using the carpark. You will need to park on the road if the carpark is full.

**\*Give Me Space:** Please remember to give other members and their dogs who are wearing a yellow high-vis vest space before and after class as well as during training. Please show your respect and support for these handlers by following this as they work hard to help their dogs overcome their barriers and one negative interaction can undo weeks of hard work.

**\*Dogs are to be on lead at all times** unless instructed to be off lead by an instructor. Off lead play before or after class needs to occur on the tennis courts or in the puppy pens. While your dog may be okay, it may be causing stress or over excitement for other dogs or be an unnecessary distraction for people who are still working with their dogs.

# Bendigo Obedience Dog Club Training

## Tip 1; Equipment

There are so many different types of collars, leads and harnesses out there—how do you choose what is right for you and your dog?

Bendigo Obedience Dog Club aims to get dogs walking nicely on lead with just a flat (normal) collar. Other types of equipment such as Martingale or head collar style may be used to assist the training of the dog with t

Things to consider when selecting a collar/lead/harness for your dog:

Leads:

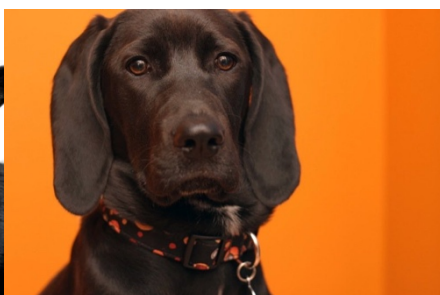
- It may seem obvious, but a small dog needs a thinner, lighter lead than a large dog and an important reason for this may not be one that is obvious. If you have a small dog with a wide heavy lead, the clip is also a lot larger. When your little dog walks/jogs with a loose lead, this clip will be hitting the front of the chest with each step. An oversized heavy clip can bruise the chest of the dog.
- Leads come in all shapes, sizes, colours and length. For training and general walking/exercising we recommend leads 1.2m to 2m long. This length gives your dog some freedom, whilst you maintain good control. Longer leads or lines (2m-5m) are great for training that reliable recall when out and about.

Collars:

- There are three main style of collars: flat, martingale & head collars (refer to pictures below)
- Not all collar options are suitable for all dogs. A head collar won't suit Brachycephalic breeds such as pugs, whilst a flat collar may allow a thick necked dog such as a Staffy to slip it's collar.

Harnesses:

- The biggest consideration with harnesses is that you are going to be attached directly to the strongest part of your dog. If your dog tends to pull when on lead, a harness allows the dog added power to that pull.
- The size of the dog should also be considered. A chihuahua in a harness pulling is a lot less likely to cause you injury than a great dane doing the same.



Ultimately the decision of training tool (or tools) will come down to what works best for you and your dog. What ever you decide, make sure that it is fitted correctly and used correctly. Ill fitting and poorly utilised dog equipment have the potential to cause injury.

## TRICK WORKSHOP – SUNDAY, 14<sup>TH</sup> MARCH 2021

10:30 AM Finn Street Reserve.

The Club has been able to secure the services of Trick Judge, Rochelle Manderson for a Trick Workshop at the Club as above. This will be a member's only event. Registration will be required.

Tricks is a new discipline under the umbrella of the Australian National Kennel Council for which teams are tested individually for competency in executing a set number of tricks in each level and upon qualifying sufficient times are awarded titles that are added to the dogs name. Rules are available on the ANKC website on this link <http://ankc.org.au/media/9325/20-trick-dog-rules-2020.pdf> . Competitions will begin in Victoria 2021, Covid-19 restrictions permitting. Bendigo ODC have scheduled a Trick Test for Saturday, 1<sup>st</sup> May 2021 to be held at the Club grounds. (Members help will be required, details to follow). There are four sections Starters, Novice, Intermediate and Advanced. To compete in these tests the handler and dog must be registered with Dogs Victoria (DV). All dogs can be registered, ANKC purebred pedigree dogs will have been registered by the breeder at birth, however, the owner/handler must also be a member of DV. Other dogs can be registered on the Associate Register. Further information can be found at the office, instructor or committee member.

For the past few months some members have been attending additional sessions to learn about this new sport with the intention of competing in Tests and to pass their knowledge on to members during normal classes these fun new skills. When we think about it, everything we teach our dogs can be classed as a trick, heeling, sitting, coming and so on and many of the tricks in these tests can be incorporated in general living with a dog and other dog sports we can compete in.

As time will be limited on the day we have decided to offer those members who have been learning the tricks a working spot with their dogs and other interested members are offered an auditing (attend, watch, ask questions etc. WITHOUT A DOG) spot.

# Bendigo Obedience Dog Club Rules

## **AMENDED BODC CLUB RULES DURING COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS**



The following Rules of the Bendigo Obedience Dog Club have been adopted for the benefit and safety of all club Members and apply to everyone during training and at any function organised or participated in by the club.

1. Membership tags are to be worn at training, if you don't have it you need to ask for a temporary one or if it is lost purchase a new one. It helps the instructor to get to know you and your dog's name and is proof of your membership.
2. Please be on time for class as they are only 30 minutes long, late comers will be unable to join in.
3. All dogs must be immunised. Proof of vaccination is required when joining.
4. Bitches in season are not permitted at training until 21 days after the first sign of season.
5. Dogs not permitted off lead, unless under the supervision of an instructor.
6. All droppings are to be removed immediately by handler and placed in bins provided. Please take a plastic bag to class.
7. Dogs must not be left unattended in cars during hot weather
8. Dogs suffering from any contagious disease or illness, or who have associated with a dog suffering from a contagious disease must not be brought to the training grounds until at least three weeks after contact and/or cleared by vet.
9. Classes are non-smoking and mobile free. Please make sure you phone is on silent.
10. Sensible footwear should be worn, thongs are not permitted in class. Please avoid loose flapping clothes that will dangle near the dog.
11. Should any member wish to lodge a complaint, or request clarification regarding Committee's management of club affairs and/or the conduct of the weekly training classes, such complaint or request for clarification must either be made verbally at the next general meeting, or be made in writing, to be tabled at the next General Meeting.
12. Be aware and respect our yellow "Give Me Space" vests.
13. Do not approach dogs that are tethered or crated.
14. Instructors have the authority to request any person ignoring club rules to leave the training ground/club rooms or club event.
