#### **CLUB SASHES**

Each year we have 16 special sashes for club members who are trialling. They are given out to the highest qualifying score by a Bendigo member at selected trials. There are 4 for Obedience, 4 Rally, 4 Jumping, 4 Agility. The remaining trials for the year are:

Werribee Oct 19<sup>th</sup> 148 km approx. 1 hr. 50 min Macedon Ranges Oct 27<sup>th</sup> 101 km approx. 1 hr. 5 mins. (Riddells Creek)

As you can see all the trials are within two hours maximum drive and do not require an overnight stay. There are six trials to compete in to win one of four special BODC Obedience sashes and four special BODC Rally sashes. It will be a case of the first four competitors in Obedience and the first four competitors in Rally to gain the highest qualifying score of any Bendigo member competing to win a sash. No one competing at the Ballarat trial on March 6<sup>th</sup> got a qualifying score so that leaves the final five trials.

The Agility/Jumping trials are to be decided as no members are currently trialling in these events.

#### **ONE MIND AGILITY DOG WORKSHOP 2020**

The One Mind Dog Agility Workshop with Lynn Madden will take place on 14th & 15th March 2020. Venue: Bendigo ODC grounds, Finn Street Reserve, North Bendigo.

This is a perfect opportunity to begin or refine your agility journey with the help of an experienced calm, precise and patient instructor, with the added advantage of being able to attend such an event in country Victoria.

Working spots will be limited. Four sessions are planned. Auditing spots will be unlimited. All levels from Pre-Novice to Masters will be catered for. There will be varying costs due to participation level chosen. A flyer will be produced and distributed this weekend to those that have registered interest in attending. Bookings will open from then with preference to those already listed.

Working spots \$100 per session which includes a light lunch. This will include free access to other courses being run on that day. If you wish to attend on the two days, the cost is \$180 for the two days with lunch each day and no other club discount will apply.

Auditing spots are unlimited and cost \$20 per session (no lunch) or extra \$10 if lunch is required. Attend all 4 sessions \$70 (including lunch).

Payment and conditions for both levels of participation as follows: 25% non-refundable deposit required by 31/10/2019. Second 25% instalment required by 13/01/2020. 50% non-refundable payment will secure your spot, but it is not confirmed until full payment has been received. Full payment due Sunday, 16th February 2020.

#### **AWARDING OF TROPHIES**

#### TO ALL MEMBERS

When you gain a title with your dog the Club presents you with a trophy. Please see in the newsletter the form to enter your results. The application covers titles received in the calendar year of January 1 to December 31. All applications must be handed in at the office or directly to Denise Chrystal by January 31 of the next year. Applications <u>must</u> also be accompanied by a 6 x 4 photo, if there is no photo the application will not be processed. It is recommended that titles are applied for as they are gained to make Denise's job as Trophy Manager a lot easier. If you don't apply in time you will miss out as it is not up to the club/committee etc. to chase you and remind you. <u>TROPHY CRITERIA</u>

To be eligible to apply for acknowledgement of an approved working ANKC title the following criteria must be fulfilled.

1. The member must be a current financial member both at the time of obtaining the title and at the time of the Annual presentation.

2. If classes in that discipline are offered by the Club the member must have actively trained in that class.

3. Upon obtaining a title the member must assist or instruct at a training class in that discipline for a minimum of 6 times, thus passing on their knowledge to up and coming members.

4. Assist physically with the running and or preparation of at least 2 major events held by the Club ie. Agility, Obedience or Tracking Trials.

5. Act as an organiser of 3 Fundays.

These activities are to be recorded by the applicant and attendance counter-signed by the Club President, Vice President, Secretary, Trial Secretary.

Upon gaining a title a photo (to be kept by the club) is to be taken either privately or by the Club.

Anyone not meeting the criteria is ineligible for a club trophy. However, your title will be acknowledged by the club and listed with the other members who gained titles during that year.

The criteria were taken from the minutes of the 15th April, 2009 AGM and will be enforced for every member. Trophies are awarded at our Annual General Meeting each year.



# Bendigo Obedience Dog Club Training Tip 2: Jumping Up

Dogs jumping up on people is a very common problem that owners have. Below are two different training methods that improve this behaviour. Both work on the same principle—teaching the dog that a different behaviour will get it want it wants (which is usually the persons attention).

Why Dogs Jump:

- Uncontrolled excitement
- Wanting attention
- Habit
- Jumping has worked before (even if it has been told off)

Training Method 1: Ignore the dog

It may sound silly to just ignore the dog and let it jump up on you, but if it gets absolutely NO feedback, eventually it will decide that jumping is not working and will try something else. NO feedback means, NO looking, talking or growling at the dog.

Ok, so here it is step by step:

- 1. You get home from work (or there is a visitor at the door)
- 2. The dog gets so excited it can't stay still and starts jumping on you.
- 3. IGNORE the dog. Don't talk to it, don't look at it—pretend it isn't there.
- 4. The dog figures out that jumping isn't getting it what it wants and so stops.....maybe stands and looks away.
- 5. THIS is your time to reward your dog. To start with you will need to be VERY quick as it may only last a couple of seconds
- The dog has finally gotten what it wanted—your interaction!! Most dogs will then get excited again and start jumping.
- 7. Repeat the above steps over and over again. Over a period of time (about a month if you and your visitors are consistent and do this everytime it happens, no matter who it is with or where it is) your dog will realise that by NOT jumping, it gets what it wants most from you—your attention.
- 8. If your dog has been jumping for months (or years), this process will take longer than it will for a puppy or dog that has just started the behaviour as it has become a HABIT.

Note: The above training tips are NOT an instant fix. We are changing how the dog ex- presses itself. It WILL take time and consistency in training. Depending on how long it has been a problem, the behaviour may actually get worse before it gets better.



# Bendigo Obedience Dog Club Training Tip 2: Jumping Up

Training Method 2: Behaviour Substitution

This is similar to method 1, but in this one you actively teach the dog the alternative behaviour you want. Training this one is easiest using either a glass sliding door or with a very understand- ing visitor. The steps are the same for both. The example I will use for a visitor coming to the house and asking for a sit.

Ok, so here it is step by step:

- 1. Decide what behaviour you want your dog to do (sit, back away etc)
- 2. Be prepared—have your dog on lead so you can prevent barging out the door to the visitor
- 3. Visitor knocks or rings the doorbell
- 4. The dog gets so excited it can't stay still
- 5. Wait for the dog to settle down before you start to approach the door.
- 6. Approach the door. If the dog starts getting really excited or starts jumping, walk away from the door.
- 7. Repeat steps 5 & 6 until you can stand at the door with the dog calm
- 8. Get the dog to sit & reward the sit.
- 9. Reach towards the door to open it. If the dog gets up, lower your arm and get the dog in a sit again.
- 10. Repeat steps 8 & 9. What you will find is that gradually you will get closer and closer to opening the door without the dog moving. As you start opening the door, each time the dog gets up, close the door and start again.
- 11. Once the dog stays in a sit while you open the door, invite your visitor in (making sure that they give NO attention or acknowledgement to the dog—after all, they are here to see you, not the dog).
- 12. If the dog gets up, the visitor leaves and the door closes again.
- 13. Repeat until the door can be opened and the visitor enters with the dog staying in a sit.
- 14. Keep the dog with you on lead whilst you greet your guest and settle, ignoring the dog.
- 15. The dog will settle with the new environment (visitor in the house). Depending on the dog this may take 15-20 min.
- 16. Once the dog is fully settled, let it off the lead.

Note: The above training tips are NOT an instant fix. We are changing how the dog ex- presses itself. It WILL take time and consistency in training. Depending on how long it has been a problem, the behaviour may actually get worse before it gets better.

#### **Reminders:**

\*Club Phone: We now have a club mobile phone. Call 0497 242 667 for all queries.

\*Signing prior to class: it is essential for safety reasons we know who is in class. Please ensure you sign in prior to starting class each session. This also helps us keep track of people's attendance and those eligible for graduation.

\*Mobile Phones: Please refrain from using your mobile phone in class. If you are expecting an important call, please inform your instructor and if the call occurs, remove yourself from the class prior to answering. Check with the instructor prior to re-joining the class so you are aware of what is happening within the class.

\*Footwear: For safety reasons, please ensure you are wearing sturdy, closed in footwear at all times. Thongs and high heels are not appropriate and unsafe for class and you may be asked not to take part for your own safety.

\***Parking:** Please use common sense when parking. Parking behind the clubhouse is restricted to committee members and instructors. Please keep roadways clear to ensure ease of access for all using the carpark. You will need to park on the road if the carpark is full.

\*Give Me Space: Please remember to give other members and their dogs who are wearing a yellow high-vis vest space before and after class as well as during training. Please show your respect and support for these handlers by following this as they work hard to help their dogs overcome their barriers and one negative interaction can undo weeks of hard work.

\*Dogs are to be on lead at all times unless instructed to be off lead by an instructor. Off lead play before or after class needs to occur on the tennis courts or in the puppy pens. While your dog may be okay, it may be causing stress or over excitement for other dogs or be an unnecessary distraction for people who are still working with their dogs.

#### **Bendigo Obedience Dog Club Rules**



The following Rules of the Bendigo Obedience Dog Club have been adopted for the benefit and safety of all club Members and apply to everyone during training and at any function organised or participated in by the club.

- 1. Membership tags are to be worn at training, if you don't have it you need to go to the office for a temporary one or if it is lost purchase a new one. It helps the instructor to get to know you and your dog's name and is proof of your membership.
- 2. Please be on time for class. If you are less than 15 minutes late please wait until invited by the instructor to join the class. No entry to class 15 minutes after the start, so please don't come late.
- 3. All dogs must be immunised. Proof of vaccination is required when joining.
- 4. Bitches in season are not permitted at training until 21 days after the first sign of season.
- 5. Dogs not permitted off lead, unless under the supervision of an instructor.
- 6. All droppings are to be removed immediately by handler and placed in bins provided. Please take a plastic bag to class.
- 7. Dogs must not be left unattended in cars during hot weather.
- Dogs suffering from any contagious disease or illness, or who have associated with a dog suffering from a contagious disease must not be brought to the training grounds until at least three weeks after contact and/or cleared by vet.
- 9. Classes are non-smoking and mobile free. Please make sure you phone is on silent.
- 10. Sensible footwear should be worn, thongs are not permitted in class. Please avoid loose flapping clothes that will dangle near the dog.
- 11. If you wish to use Club equipment, help put it out and away.
- 12. Should any member wish to lodge a complaint, or request clarification regarding Committee's management of club affairs and/or the conduct of the weekly training classes, such complaint or request for clarification must either be made verbally at the next general meeting, or be made in writing, to be tabled at the next General Meeting.
- 13. Be aware and respect our yellow "Give Me Space" vests. Always ask permission to approach another member's dog and when socialising on lead make it one on one.
- 14. Do not approach dogs that are tethered or crated.
- 15. Before and after class a maximum of 4 dogs running together in each of the puppy pens. Take the larger dogs to the tennis courts. Owners must be with them, at all times.
- 16. Instructors have the authority to request any person ignoring club rules to leave the training ground/club rooms or club event.
