Vendeen Views and News

We begin this section with two very sad losses from our members.

Vale: Ch Rokeena Alyons Amusement

For many people Jean Claude Ch Rokeena Alyons Amusement was one of the first PBGV's that they met and I know that he was responsible for a lot of us falling in love with the breed. Bred from the first ever Rokeena litter, he was one of the only two pups produced by Whispa, Ch Plushcourt Promesse(UK).

His outgoing and happy personality endeared many people to him and he was also an influential sire of

PBGV;'s in Australian and overseas. After his show career was over he retired to live in Western Australia with Maureen & Dave, where he was a much loved pet. He sadly died on 30th March from stomach cancer.

Robyn wrote: Russ & I were shocked and so sadden over the weekend when Maureen rang me to tell me Jean Claude had stomach cancer and had to be put to sleep. He was only 10 years old and it is with such sadness that I write about him now. Russ and I both feel a great loss of this wonderful little fellow who was such a great Ambassador for the breed and had an amazing influence on the breed not only here but overseas as well. Jean Claude was the first PBGV we bred and showed and he did us and the breed proud. He was such a happy little fellow who loved people to the max.

He started his show career with an amazing Runner UP in Group and Puppy in Group at Sydney Royal at only 8 months old under a Scandinavian Judge at a time when there were very few PBGVs being shown in Australia. People & judges really began to look at the PBGV in the ring more closely after that. As for his influence on the breed he has sired Champions in six countries around the world. Australia, New Zealand, USA, Canada, Finland & Denmark. (Not bad for a little PBGV from Downunder).

He was by the wonderful dog Aust, Am, Jap Ch. Charlen's Make Mine A Double, out of the bitch Ch. Plushcourt Promesse that we imported from the UK who was by two French Imports. Not only did Jean Claude put lots of wonderful PBGVs with amazing type and movement in the ring, he put LOTS of amazing puppies into to wonderful family homes all with his sunny happy nature.

A number of people feel the loss of this great little character. Along with Russ & I, Matt Penman who showed him for us in his early career, Bev and Dave who he lived with and loved him so much and last of all Maureen & Dave who he has lived with for most of his life and who love his as a child. Jean Claude slept on their bed, and went with them to work every day. The early end to his life has shattered them and I can only hope the memories they have of him will help them through this difficult time.

I salute this great little fellow and thank him for what he has done for Rokeena and so many people that he touched in one way or another. RIP my dear little Jean Claude.

Louis was bred by Claire Parker and sent to Robyn Hay in New Zealand. Robyn planned to rehome him into a loving pet home when he did not turn out as a show dog

On the 30th May he was sent to Hamilton on the North Island and was collected by a family who were to be his new owners. Whilst in the airport carport something frightened him and he ran away, squeezing through a hole on the wire fencing, with his

collar& lead still attached. For five days there were sightings of him in the area. He appeared to be hiding in a densely covered gully but he was so frightened that he would not allow anyone to come close to him.

Large numbers of people with all breeds of dogs joined in the search without success. Robyn flew up from the South Island to see if he would come to her but sadly did not make it in time. Tragically, only 30 minutes before she reached the location he ran out onto a busy road and was killed instantly.

Robyn wrote: So sad..... took flight yesterday to Hamilton to assist in search for Louis. Unfortunately this morning he returned to the airport where he went missing from, and while staff were trying to catch him, he bolted across a main highway......Thank you so much to all the residents who helped look, and the amazing support and help from the NZKC members RIP little Louis, miss u little auy xxxx

Susan if one of the few people who is passionate about hunting her PBGVs in a country out of Europe and she has reflected her ideas she has leant the breed's hunting ability and added some opinions of others that have obviously been amazed by this great little dog. I decided to share this with you as I found it interesting to read about another side of our pet and show dogs as we mostly know them to be here in Australia. Susan also did a great PowerPoint presentation for the last World Congress in the USA of which I have taken the liberty of extracting adding some photos of her dogs hunting to add to this article. (I am sure she will not mind as she loves as many people to understand the breed as possible. I hope you enjoy it also.

Excerpts from an article by Susan Buttivant of Chaparral Kennels in Canada

Hunting with the Petit Basset Griffon Vendéen



The PBGV is the smallest of the Griffon Vendéen family and ideally suited to hunting hare or rabbit in




the harshest of environments. He is truly a passionate hunter with great courage and tenacity. Both physically and mentally though, he is not deterred by thorns, rough ground or outside distractions. His voice, which he enjoys using, can be heard for great distances and his sensitive nose is superior to many breeds. This makes him very useful on cold tracks.

Although there are a couple of large packs of pure and mixed bred PBGVs, the breed is best suited to

hunting individually, in a brace or in a small pack. His independent nature seems to be stronger than his packing instinct and large numbers of them are difficult to control.

He is often more intelligent at figuring the tricks of the game than bigger dogs and coupled with his speed he is well suited to hunting with or without a gun depending on the territory. Each hound tracks the game independently of the others and their enthusiasm is never lacking

and their enthusiasm is never lacking. He is almost too fast for his nose. The Petit Basset Griffon

Vendéen is first and foremost a hunting hound.

"The Petit Basset Griffon Vendéen is the ideal dog for rabbit hunters. Its small size and busy nature make it a real beater of the thickets. It will hunt any furred game, and many used it to put up pheasants. It is the maid-of-all-work of the small hunter"



"The PBGV keeps all the famous hunting qualities of the breed: the diligence with which they perform their task, the fearlessness in the undergrowth, the bustle and the vigor" (Paul Baubigne)

"All over a hunting dog, he combines a legendary strength with swiftness; he is much faster than other dogs of the same size. His stamina and spirit of enterprise are equal to those of larger dogs, and in dense undergrowth, with a sharp nose and great intelligence he solves problems which would bring half a dozen other breeds to a full stop" (Anon)

"Most PBGVs possess the desire to hunt; they have the ability. In fact, on nose and voice, I have yet to see their equal" (Nick Valentine, Bradley Vale Pack)

The show was judged by Hound specialist, Mr John Bink from the ACT, who is well known for his Basset Hounds but has also owned champion PBGV's in the past as well.

A commemorative catalogue was produced and Jo Meadows did a fabulous job in not only designing the catalogue but also in designing the full page advertisements from the members.

Jo was also the official photographer on the day and the official and candid shots that you see in this report are all from Jo. She provided her services to the club for free and we are very grateful for her generosity and time.

All of our members were very generous with their support for this show and trophies were donated by Beryl & Jo Hession, Robyn & Lesley Williams, Claire Parker, Debbie & Darryl Matthews, Robyn & Russell Wallis, Michelle Parker Brien, Brian Pengelly, Don & Francis Bruce and Robert & Yvonne Lauder.

Beryl & Jo, not only donated some trophies, they also approached others and were able to get some additional donations from Buffalo Kennels, Waynes Leather Leads and Plush Puppy.

Lesley Williams is skilled at wood turning and he made lovely hand turned Huon pine pens for all the Challenge winners and Yvonne and Robert Lauder organised and donated all the ribbons for the show.

Our entry was 34, made up of 8 GBGV's and 26 PBGV's which was a good entry considering that the breed is still rare and there are only 2 GBGV breeders in the whole country and 11 PBGV breeders.

We were happy to welcome Don and Francis Bruce who made the long drive from Mildura to support our show, and Robyn Wallis who came up from Victoria.

The weather was perfect for both the handlers and the dogs – not too hot and not too cold and all in all it was a very pleasant and relaxed day.

At the end the show there was a Child Handlers class as well and our budding Future handling stars showed just how well they could perform- and the hounds showed themselves off beautifully for them.

As it turned out the BIS and Runner UP BIS were full brothers from a repeated mating by Rokeena Kennels.

I would like to thank the Basset Griffon Vendeen Club of NSW for inviting me to judge their inaugural championship show in April. It was a pleasure to judge the show and a very enjoyable day. 

JUDGING THE PETIT BASSET GRIFFON VENDÉEN

First Impressions are important. Before you even put your hands on the PBGV in the ring, does it strike you as being -



A Small/medium sized, slightly elongated but compact dog with a rough unrefined outline, portraying a confident, happy manner which is characterized by a proud head & tail carriage.

If it does not then it is not a correct example of the breed.

Knowing the breed standard well, is very important for both judges and breeders alike, but sometimes one can get so bogged down with facts ,figures and faults that the whole picture of the dog is lost. The best dog is always the one that fits the silhouette or template that portrays the correct balance for that breed and to which you add the sum total of breed type and characteristics it possesses. The soundest dog with the best movement can never be the best PBGV if it does not fit the correct breed silhouette. We will look more closely at silhouettes in a minute.

When assessing the PBGV (or any other dog for that matter) a judge should ask themselves a number of questions.

As judging is a combination of *eye* and hand logic, one has to ask, if the hands feels what the eye is seeing? Often creative preparation of a dog for the show ring can create illusions aimed at confusing the eye. The dog can be made look much better in some areas than it actually is. On the other hand sometimes these illusions can also spoil the appearance of a very good example of the breed. In both these cases the hands should tell you the story.

In the case of *deceptive illusion*, where your hands find an excellent PBGV breed type that has been sculptured to the extent of losing correct breed appearance, a heavy responsibility is placed on a judge.

I do not think a judge should ever put up an inferior dog over an excellent specimen with a good temperament, as this does the breed a great injustice for unfortunately many times dogs are used in

breeding programs, just because they win and bad grooming/trimming will never have an adverse affect on future progeny. Therefore as much as I abhor badly, over trimmed PBGVs, if the dog was the best specimen of the breed in the ring, I would have to award it BOB but at the same time mention to the handler it was such a shame the outline of the dog was ruined and I would not be prepared to take it any further in the group. Then of course this is my opinion only.

The PBGV is a somewhat longer or a *slightly elongated*, compact dog. There are always *parameters* that allow a small allowance for measurements related to general statements such as this. What you have to ask yourself is *does the dog in front of me fit into acceptable parameters for the correct balance of the breed*.

So now you have looked at the balance of the dog, you next need to think about *type*. Type is the sum total of breed type characteristics which make the PBGV able to do the work for which it was originally developed. When judging you need to ask yourself does the dog you are assessing have a sum total which makes it a good or acceptable type of PBGV?

Finally you need to address *soundness*, asking yourself if this dog has enough sound anatomy to do the job for which it was bred.

With all this in mind the best PBGV on the day has to be the one that has the most ticks to all your answers to the above questions.

I mentioned earlier, the correct silhouette for the breed is of extreme importance, so let's look at some examples of this which should make recognizing this more clearly.




Fig. 2 Too long in body for the correct balance




Fig.3 Too high up on leg for correct balance

If the PBGV you are judging does not fit the silhouette of *Fig.1* you have to ask yourself does it still fit into the parameters that you believe are acceptable? If not, it is not an acceptable representative of the breed and you need to judge it accordingly.

Head balance is also important when making your judgment of the breed. The standard asks for the muzzle to be slightly shorter than the skull. If it is too long and it makes the head look more like its cousin the GBGV and if too short it gives it presents a 'toy' appearance.




Fig A Muzzle Too Long




Fig B Correct head proportions

Once you understand the balance of the PBGV, it is not a difficult breed to judge as it does not have any unusual conformation anomalies.

To make judging the PBGV easier it is a good idea to make up your own *mantra* that contains the main characteristics of the breed to repeat to yourself as you go over it.

Therefore, after deciding if the dog fits the 13 to 15inch breed standard requirement, as your hands go over the dog, you should be saying to yourself has this PBGV got -

- A muzzle shorter than the skull, a good stop, oval skull, ears not reaching beyond the muzzle and big dark eye that are easily noticeable under the long eyebrows?
- Does it have an adequate mustache & beard, and a neck long and strong enough to carry this head high?
- Can I feel an equal and well angled front assembly?
- Can I feel strong, without being coarse, straight bone in the legs and are the feet hard & tight?
- Can I feel the front sternum and does the length of keel finish far enough back?
- Is the ribcage long enough and is the Topline firm and the loin not too long or weak?
- Does the hind angulation match the front?
- Is the tail set on in the correct high position to be able to carry it proudly
- And finally is the, rough coat of correct length and texture.

Add your summation of what you have found in your examination to the ideal balanced silhouette along with the disposition and movement of the dog and you will find judging the PBGV a very pleasant experience.
