Insert new

6.1.1.1. (i.e. must be on camera at all times during the meeting). Members may be asked to use the mute button during the meeting.

6.1.1.2. A member participating in a meeting as permitted by 6.1.1.1 is taken to be present at the meeting and, if the member votes, is taken to have voted in person.

THE SIMPLE APPLICATION OF GENETICS WHEN BREEDING

People who are interested in dogs tend to shudder when they hear the word genetics. Geneticists do not set out to blind their fellow mortals with science, but in all scientific subjects there are new words to understand and as a result, the subject has a certain mystique about it. The word genetics simply means the study of heredity and variation in animals (and plants). Heredity is the tendency of like to produce like or, the makeup of organic beings by which offspring have the similarities of parents or ancestors.

Over the years there has been a lot of obscurities written and said about hereditary disease and quite naturally dog breeders have become nervous whenever the word heredity is used. However, the aim of all dog breeders must be to produce pups which are capable of; breathing easily, exercising freely, mating and whelping naturally and living to a reasonably ripe old age whilst fitting into the modern society in which they will have to exist.

The point to understand about inheritance is that it is inevitable. The fact that when a breeder successfully mates a male Staffordshire Bull Terrier to a female Staffordshire Bull Terrier, the puppies are all Staffordshire Bull Terriers, is a perfect example of inheritance. Similarly with any other coupling of dog and bitch of the same breed, the outcome is predictable in that one can say that the pups will be like their parents. It is this point which distinguishes the purebred animal from the mongrel. Purebred puppies will vary within certain very closely outlined limits, but they will all be basically recognisable. On the other hand the products of mating a male Corgi with a female Yorkshire Terrier for example will receive characteristics from their parents, but no two puppies will get exactly the same 'mix', so they will vary tremendously even in the first generation. In the same way other crossbreeds from other breeds will be a bit on the unpredictable side and this is only the first generation.

If taken a little further, when we put the male 'Yorgi' (Corgi x Yorkie) in with a female 'Doodle' (Dachshund x Poodle), the outcome is such as to defy prediction all together! The pups may be quite delightful, healthy and may be the most perfect pets, companions, guards, etc., but one thing they will not be is predictable. And predictability is the purpose of studying genetics as far as pedigree dog breeding is concerned.

We have no right as breeders to bring into the world dogs which have breathing problems as a result of the shape of the heads or the shortness of their noses. We have no right to breed dogs which we know to suffer from skeletal abnormalities of the joints. We have no right to breed from animals which will not mate naturally because of defects of the genitals. We have no right to mate animals when we know that the chances of natural whelping are remote or the offspring will suffer painful defects for their entire life. Similarly, we should not continue to breed a strain of a particular breed which is known to die much younger than the average for that breed, whatever the reason may be.

If you would like to breed dogs you should give the matter a great deal of thought. If you have any idea that there is money to be made out of breeding dogs, forget it. There are a few people who make a commercial success of the venture after great capital outlay, but most of us breed a litter now and then in order to keep our own line going.

'Line-breeding' involves using dogs and bitches with common ancestors in their pedigrees three or four generations back. It is used by the great majority of dog breeders. As a system it will usually help you to evolve the type of dog that you admire, 'fixing' characteristics more slowly over a greater number of generations.

'Outcrossing' uses animals from totally different families. Such a system tends to produce pups which vary greatly, and although the occasional super dog may pop up, there will also be a great number of pretty nondescript ones. Careful introduction of an 'outcross' into a 'line-bred' strain will sometimes bring in qualities which are lacking, but it is not a form of breeding which should be consistently repeated at short intervals.

To review, you should start with as good a bitch as possible and select a dog as her mate on a combination of how his physical virtues and pedigree match with hers. The following is not an exact science, but one thing is certain, whatever the 'mix' between the parents they will each contribute 50 per cent to a puppy's make-up. In the same way, grandparents will have a 25 per cent 'representation' and great grand parents 12 1/2 per cent, and by the fifth generation that one-off Champion in red on the pedigree which somebody will point to so proudly will only be able to lay claim to a mere 6 1/2 per cent contribution.



We exhibit the ones we keep and this involves travelling all over the country. We pay stud fees, we feed the bitch and hopefully, the pups regardless of expense. We incur veterinary fees and we sell the pups we cannot sustain at prices which seem far too cheap. We keep our bitches from the day they are born to the day they die and the average bitch will only produce pups from the time she is two years old to when she is about seven. Most of them will not have more than two or three litters, if you do your sums on those sort of figures you will soon see that financial gain is the last thing you can look forward to. If your motive is gain, you're in the wrong game!

Once you are certain that you want to breed dogs you should start with a bitch. This may seem obvious, but it is surprising how many people believe that they can start with a dog. Keeping a stud dog is very easy, until you want to use him at stud! For a start, if he has not been 'advertised' in the show ring to prove his quality, who will want to use him? Although the average male dog demonstrates his sexual desires by chasing after and attempting to mate every female in sight, when he is actually presented with a bitch to be mated he often fails to perform appropriately. This may be easy enough for the experienced owner to put right, but is most frustrating for both the novice owner and the dog.

The bitch you are going to start with is hopefully to be the foundation of your kennel, the first of a 'new line'. So, she should be a good specimen of her breed without too many faults. You will be very fortunate indeed if you have bought a top quality bitch as your first, but you should ask an established breeder who is involved with a breed club for an opinion of suitability for breeding. It is pointless commencing with a poor quality animal. If the experts advise you to look for a better bitch, take their advice. In time, you will then need to find an appropriate stud dog as a mate for your bitch. The mere fact that dog and bitch are of the same breed only ensures the resultant puppies to be purebred, it does not guarantee that they will be good specimens. With luck you will have learned by observation and from speaking with experts in the breed any shortcomings of your bitch. Every breed has an official National Kennel Council breed standard which defines the breed and you should compare your bitch against that standard.

For example, if the standard says that the ears should be small, the neck of good length, the coat harsh, the hind legs well angulated, and your bitch has large ears, a short neck, a soft coat and hind legs without angulation, you certainly don't want to breed her to a dog with the same faults. Select a dog who has as few faults as possible and definitely not one who is wrong in the same areas. This is the basic application of genetics.

There are various terms used when describing patterns of breeding:

'In-breeding' indicates that the type of mating has involved close relatives, such as grandfather to granddaughter or half brother to half sister. This system tends to 'fix' the good points quickly in the resultant offspring and their descendants, but it also tends to expose any major faults which the family is carrying. It is a system which some experienced breeders have used with great success and failure. Experienced breeders are well aware of the possible dangers. Inbreeding should not be practised until one is well experienced.
