DOPPLER TESTING

I want to say thanks to all the breeders who participated in our Doppler clinics in 2022. Dopplering less than 5 animals is expensive and hard to organise if you live in a regional area, so it was great to see breeders taking up this discounted offer. We will continue this in 2023 but are awaiting Richard Wooley to update his dates and clinics and prices on his website before we book. Werribee UVET recently changed ownership to Green-cross but will still be operating as a specialist and emergency centre for the Western suburbs.

You may not be aware but Richard will test puppies. A breeding clearance cannot be issued for animals under 12 months of age but as bull terriers are mostly born with their problems, it is useful if you want to avoid running on an animal with an issue. Cost is the same as for an adult dog as exactly the same procedure is required.

If you would like to put your name down for an upcoming clinic or would like more information please contact me directly. Your test results are confidential and you are in no way obligated to divulge your results to anyone. The reports are emailed by the cardiologist directly to you.

I am aware that some breeders are waiting for a clinic in the south eastern suburbs and I am trying to organise this.

ORIVET UPDATE

George from Orivet has agreed to look into finding a DNA marker for Bull Terrier heart diseases.

If your doppler tested dog is identified with either mitral valve dysplasia, sub-aortic stenosis, or aortic stenosis, and you would like to help with this research, all you need to do is: fill in the "research submission form" found at link below, include the dogs pet name with a description of your dogs problem i.e. mitral valve dysplasia etc., you should also attached your dogs specialist report. Pedigree is not required, but confidential if provided.

Then at your dog's next vet appointment, ask them to take 5mls of blood in a EDTA vial (all vets can do this). Once the form is done, blood taken, send together to Orivet (normal post is fine as long as vial is protected). It is totally anonymous, you are simply supplying blood from affected dogs to assist with research.

The BTC of Victoria was my first judging assignment outside of New Zealand back in 2011 and it was interesting to see the progression since then. Thanks so much to the club for the invitation to judge, and to the exhibitors for a quality entry of Bull Terriers. I totally enjoyed going over them.

Baby Puppy Dog

1st **KAHA HOWZAT** 25.6.22 By Ch Kaha High Roller ex Bullysik Rik Star

Striking brindle and white, very substantial with tons of bone. He currently has no teeth. His head has a sweeping profile, with good depth of muzzle and underjaw. Front on he has plenty of fill. Well placed dark eyes, ears still on the way up. Plenty of forechest, straight front, short back, top-line runs a little uphill at this stage with a slightly steep croup. Moves around the ring nicely.

2nd **JEWELBULL TOP GUN** 8.6.22 By Glenbull Razor ex Glenbull Dreams are Real

Brindle and white. No teeth very substantial with tons of bone. Ears still on their way, longer in back than first, very good prosternum. Not the profile of first, needs to come up on pasterns and feet. Movement is very loose at this stage, but should tighten with exercise and maturity.

Minor Puppy Dog

1st **JACAMAR GYPSY KING** 26.4.22 By Bullpatchy Sandro Hit ex Jacamar Pogue Mahone

Shapely white with a good coat, very pleasing arched profile to head with depth of muzzle and underjaw and plenty of fill. Well placed, deep sunken dark eyes with small ears set high. Plenty of pigmentation. Undershot. Well laid shoulder, a little short in upperarm. Broad chest, straight forelegs and depth of brisket. Strong withers, short back and level topline. Tail is set OK but carried higher on the move. Well angulated, chunky hindquarters. A tippy, muscular boy with good bone for his size. Moves well coming and going and with drive in profile. Would like him a little tighter in elbow.

Puppy Dog

1st **STURGIS THE BIG LEBOWSKI** 6.12.21 By Glenbull Razor ex Bullraider Brindle Beauty

Shapely, 11 mths white dog with lots of maturing to do. A strong head that could do with more fill in front of the eye and across muzzle. Dark well set eye, ears lower set. Scissor bite with correct canines. Straight forelegs and strong pasterns with compact feet. Deep brisket and correct under-line. Could do with more length of upper arm. Quite short coupled, level topline and well muscled hindquarters. Moves well coming and closer going away.

Junior Dog

1st **BALGAY FAT BOY HARLEY** 11.8.21 By Shirvin Eldorado Man ex Shirvin Dazz Razamataz
Tall, 14 months old, very shiny black, brindle and white, quite distracted by the environment. He has a sweeping profile, long, strong and unbroken with turn down at the nose. Deep muzzle. Could do with more fill across the muzzle. He has a perfect bite, his jaw is wide and square and his teeth are perfectly set, scissor bite with correctly placed canines. Dark well placed eye, ears are wide set. Still narrow in the chest, his forelegs are straight and he has a good lay of shoulder but lacks length of upper arm. Marked roach in topline, correct tail set. He still has a lot of maturing to do. He moves close behind and paddles a little in front.

Intermediate Dog

1st **ZEEJAY HIRED GUN** 18.1.21 By Glenbull Razor ex Villrino Serenity
Substantial white, with an outstanding head. It has a smooth unbroken profile with roman finish. Deep muzzle and underjaw. His head is well filled front on with small, dark well placed eyes. Ear placement is good but ears a little large. Mouth is scissor. Well angulated forequarter with a deep brisket and breadth of chest and body. Decent prosternum. Good bone throughout. Forelegs are straight with strong pasterns and compact feet. Elbows are nicely tucked in, and under him. Longer in back, level topline. Moderate angulation in the rear, has width across thigh. Moves well coming and going, and with drive in profile.

2nd **BULLPATCHY SOUPERLATIVE RIVER** 20.3.21 By Javarke River Pirate ex Bullpatchy Shadows in the Rain

Black brindle and white, does not want to be in the building. Very substantial, strong head that could do with more fill in front of the eyes. Very well filled with an excellent expression, dark eyes and small ears set high. Mouth is scissor with correctly placed canines. Huge bone on this boy! Well angulated forequarter, deep brisket and wide chest and body. Loads of prosternum. Front is super straight with strong pastern. Elbows well tucked in. short back and moderately angulated hindquarter. Has well defined and boned hocks. Difficult to assess movement but looks like he moves OK coming and going.

Australian Bred Dog

1st **YANDOMIR WHERES WALLY** 21.8.20 By Yandomir Aristocrat ex Yandomir Sweet Commotion
Very shapely, masculine large white. 'Two bump' head with roman finish. Would be improved by more fill in front of and under the eye. Well set and carried ears, dark correctly placed eyes. Plenty of pigmentation. Level mouth. Good forequarter angulation with a long, strong neck. Straight front with strong pasterns, has width of chest. Deep brisket with a level topline with a slight rise over the loin and low set tail. Correct underline. Would like a bit more width of thigh, well muscled rear end. Moves very well in front and a little closer behind. In profile there is plenty of drive off the rear.

2nd **CH POTENS DREAD FORT** 19.11.19 By Harrick Remarkable Adam ex Potens Dark Wings
Another shapely white boy, with good substance for size. Long, strong and turned head with depth of muzzle. Well filled with good expression, dark eyes and well set ears. Scissor bite. Well laid shoulder, upper arm is a little steep. Has width of chest and body. Super straight forelegs, strong pasterns and compact feet. Elbows could be tighter. Deep brisket and good tuck up. Strong neck joins withers smoothly into a correct topline and low set tail. Moves freely, a little close behind.

3rd **BRAXSTAR GATEKEEPER** 31.10.19 By Ch Brasshead Gothic Vortex at Boromir ex Ch Braxstar Cover Girl

Very overweight white boy, unfortunately did not want to show himself off today. Presents a lovely picture on the stack. Smoothly turned profile with roman finish. Would like more depth and width of muzzle. Good expression and small well placed ears. Eyes a little bold. Under-shot. Super prosternum and well angulated forequarter. Straight forelegs, strong pasterns and compact feet. His front is wideset but his elbows are still tucked in. Deep brisket, level topline. Good angulation in the rear - balances his front nicely - and well defined hocks.

Open Dog

1st **CH Kaha High Roller** 3.6.19 By Emred Devils Spy ex Bullysik Kryponite

Medium sized, masculine and compact white dog. Gently arched head with roman finish and depth of muzzle and underjaw. Evenly filled front on with a good expression - dark eyes and small ears that are set high. Plenty of pigment. Scissor bite and correct canines. Straight forelegs with strong pasterns and elbows tucked under him. Deep brisket. His angulation is balanced front to rear with a well turned stifle and short hocks. To be picky I would like a tad more length of upper arm. He has length of neck which flows into well set shoulders and slightly roached topline to a correctly low-set tail. Short coupled with adequate bone for size. Moves effortlessly around the ring with good extension of the forelegs and drive off the rear. Particularly well coming and a little closer going.

A really nicely balanced and typy dog.

2nd **BULLPATCHY SANDRO HIT** 20.3.21 By Javarke River Pirate ex Bullpatchy Shadows in the Nite

Super substantial white boy with massive bone, a bit of a lacklustre showman. He has a very strong head, more fill in front of the eyes would improve his profile. It is deep through the muzzle. Front on it is uniformly filled from top to bottom. He has small dark, deeply set eyes which are well placed. Although they are well placed, one ear is soft however, it can be held erectly. Mouth is just under, canines are correctly placed. Very nicely angulated forequarter with a broad chest (and body), straight forelegs with strong pasterns. Loads of prosternum, a strong muscular neck that connects smoothly at the withers into a short, level topline. Low set tail. Hindquarters are a little narrow across the thigh. Moves nicely coming and going with great drive from the rear.

Baby Puppy Bitch

1st **JEWELBUL PRYDE** 6.7.22 By Glenbull Razor ex Glenbull Dreams are Mad
Pretty white, strong head with gentle turn of profile, depth of muzzle and roman finish. Front on it is smoothly and completely filled up with a super expression - tiny dark, well set eyes. Small ears set right on top and pointing straight up. Plenty of pigmentation. Straight forelegs with very good bone, a little down on pasterns but plenty of time for those to strengthen. Plenty of prosternum, width of chest and deep brisket. Has width of body and chunky hindquarters. Slight dip behind the withers on the move, very loose movement at this stage.

Minor Puppy Bitch

1st **BULLROY CANDY KISSES** 5.4.22 By Yandomir Kauzin Kaos ex Bullroy Cosmo Star
6 months. Very shapely white girl with a gentle arch to head in profile. Reasonable fill front on but would like to see more width of muzzle. Dark eyes that could be more obliquely set. Small erect ears. Correct incisors and canines. Compact body with good angulation front and rear. A little more angle of upperarm would complete that picture. Straight forelegs, strong pasterns and compact feet. Elbows tucked in. Deep brisket and nice tuck up. Good length of neck flowing into a correct topline and low set tail. Would like more bone. Muscular rear end. Moves well coming and going.

2nd **BRAXSTAR HOTTER THAN HELL** 22.4.22 By Braxstar Stone Cold Crazy ex Braxstar Fallen Angel
6 months. Feminine white with good bone and substance. Pretty head, profile is smoothly turned with roman finish and depth of muzzle. Reasonable fill. Dark eyes that are a little bold. Well placed ears. Incorrect mouth. Decent forequarter angulation with good length and angle of upperarm, prosternum and depth of brisket. Straight forelegs, strong pasterns and compact feet. She is quite bodied up for her age. Long and strong neck, chunky hindquarters with a slightly steep croup. Moves true coming and closer going away.

Puppy Bitch

1st **BULLROY PEARL WARRIOR** 5.4.22 By Yandomir Kauzin Kaos ex Bullroy Cosmo Star
6 months, shapely and athletic girl. Smooth profile to head, deep muzzle. Could do with more depth of underjaw. Dark well placed eyes. Ears a little low set. Correct canine and incisor placement. Good pigmentation. Forequarter angulation is a little steep affecting placement of forelegs. Straight bone here and stands wide. Good length of neck, short coupled, strong well muscled hindquarters. Throws her front a little on the move but straight coming and very good drive off the rear.

Junior Bitch

1st **AUBIEDYNASTY WHITE SAPPHIRE** 19.5.21 By Credem Avenger At Brasshead ex Romanrazers Chica
A large white girl with great width of body from front to rear. Long, strong head. Not overly turned. Would like more depth to underjaw. Would like more fill under the eyes and across muzzle. Dark well set eyes, ears are low set. Canines and incisors are correct. Straight front, strong pasterns and tight feet. She could do with longer scapula and upperarm to place her forelegs further under her. Plenty of prosternum. Elbows are well tucked in and forelegs are straight. She has strong pasterns and tight feet. Good width of chest and deep brisket. Topline has a slight roach and her tail is set low. Very strong rear end which is well angulated. Moves straight in front though slightly tied at elbow. Rear movement is not as wide, but moves with drive.



Intermediate Bitch

1st **BULLPATCHY DARLING RIVER** 25.10.20 By Javarke River Pirate ex Bullpatchy Charlotte

Striking feminine, black brindle and white, really took my eye when she came into the ring. She has a lovely profile to her head, long and sweeping with roman finish and depth of muzzle. Could do with more depth to underjaw. Lots of fill front on. Outstanding expression, eyes are dark and well placed. Ears are slightly wide set but of good size. Correct incisor and canine placement. She has very good length of upper arm, more of an angle would place her forelegs further underneath her body. Decent prosternum. Deep brisket. Excellent lay of shoulder creating a lovely line from her long neck, over the withers and into her topline. Forelegs are straight, strong pasterns. Level topline. Steep croup causes her tail to be set on at a higher angle than ideal. Short coupled. Plenty of width throughout body, chunky hindquarters with well bent stifles showing breadth of thigh and short well defined hocks. Adequate bone and substance for size. Moves with plenty of drive off hindquarters. Front is straight coming but with slightly excessive lift. A very balanced bitch, which tipped the decision in her favour for **best bitch**.

2nd **CH BULLROARUS ETHEREAL** 3.11.20 By Bulroarus Bobby Dazzler ex Bulroarus White Russian

Showy tricolour, with a cracking profile that arches smoothly from the top of her head to the tip of her nose. Very good depth of muzzle. From the front it is filled right up, with deeply set dark, obliquely placed eyes. Her ears are on the large side and low set. Scissor bite. She has plenty of prosternum, is steep in upperarm with a well laid shoulder. Bone in foreleg is straight. Feet turn out at pasterns. Good width to chest and body, deep brisket and bodied up.

Very good bone and substance. Her long and strong neck joins well into the withers and topline. Quite long through the ribs and back throwing her overall balance off. Level topline, reasonably well set tail. Chunky well developed hindquarters with plenty of width of thigh. Moves well going away, closer coming back.

Australian Bred Bitch

A really strong class!

1st **KAHA BIG BUCKS** 3.6.19 By Emred Devils Spy ex Bullysik Krytonite

White with a fabulous outline, very balanced, compact and typy. Her head in profile sweeps smoothly from the top of her head to the tip of her nose. It is long and strong with depth of muzzle. Well filled from in front, eyes are dark and well placed but slightly bold. Ears are on the large side and wide set. Level bite. She has correct angulation in front, good length and angle of upper arm, shoulder is well laid, placing her forelegs well under her body and tucking her elbows in when viewed from the front. Forelegs are straight with strong pasterns. Brisket is deep and wide. Long neck into strong withers and slightly roaching topline. Slight dip behind the withers. Correct, low set tail. Short backed with well turned stifle and short, well defined hocks. Moves really freely around the ring, parallel coming closer going away. I really like her in profile and she pushed for a place in the bitch line up.

2nd **BULLPATCHY MOONLIGHTS SHADOW** 20.3.21 By Javarke River Pirate ex Bullpatchy Shadows in the Nite

Shapely, striking black, brindle and white. Her head in profile is strong, and has depth of muzzle. Slightly flat in front of the eyes. Head is very well filled front on and she has a great expression - her eyes are dark and well set. Ears are large and low set. Mouth is just under. Plenty of prosternum, deep brisket and bodied up. Straight forelegs, strong pasterns and decent bone for size. Untidy feet. Forequarter is well angulated, her long neck flows smoothly into a correct topline, short back and correct tailset. Muscular hindquarters with bend of stifle. She is hard work for her owner to show. Moves well behind, closer in front.

3rd **ZEEJAY MILLION DOLLAR BABY** 18.1.21 By Glenbull Razor ex Villrino Serenity

Substantial red and white. She has a beautiful head, long and strong in profile right down to the tip. Very good depth of muzzle and underjaw. Completely filled up front on with dark obliquely placed eyes. Ears are wideset. Mouth just under. Loads of prosternum, and good angulation through the forequarter placing her legs well under her body and her elbows tucked in. Straight forelegs, strong pasterns and tight feet. Really good bone throughout. Long neck flows well into strong withers and level topline with a slight dip behind the withers. Super bodied up. Level topline into slightly steep croup which sets her tail higher than ideal. Long in loin. Muscular and strong hindquarters with reasonable turn of stifle. Moves well in front and close behind.

Open Bitch

1st **POTENS RAINBOW SERPENT** 30.12.20 By Jacamar Fury Road ex Potens Dark Wings

Striking tricolour, super shapely balanced bitch with lovely bodylines. Cracking profile on this super strong head with depth of muzzle and underjaw. Head is completely filled up front on with tiny well placed eyes that give her a truly devilish expression. High set small ears that she uses well. Mouth just under. Well angulated forequarter placing her forelegs well underneath. Straight bone, strong pasterns and slightly flat feet. Very good depth of brisket, bodied up throughout. Strong neck flows smoothly into withers and short back. Correct, slightly roaching topline. Low set tail, sweeping underline. Strong, moderately angulated hindquarters. Athletic white, reasonable profile with depth of muzzle, would be improved with more fill in front of the eyes and across the muzzle. Dark eyes that are well set though a little bold. Correct canines and incisors. She has straight forelegs, strong pasterns and flattish feet. Could do with more width of chest. Well laid shoulder that creates a smooth line from her neck to her loin, slightly roaching here into a correctly low set tail. Deep brisket and graceful underline. Adequate bone for size, she has a well angulated, muscular rear. She moves smoothly in profile, parallel in front and close going away.

I think the takeaway for me this trip is the excellent hind quarters on the majority of your dogs. You can see the second thigh from a distance and the stifles are wonderful. Also, there were a great number of good bites which we struggle with. Here in NZ, we are seeing our all breeds judges refusing challenges for tight canines which means we have to put more emphasis on correcting this fault. If you have any quick fixes, please share! Thank you again for your hospitality and your acceptance of my decisions.

Baby Puppy Dog

1 Kaha Howszat Baby Puppy in Show

Striking brindle and white with a smooth sweeping profile, loads of fill and small dark eye. Incorrect bite. Straight front with good length of upper arm and well laid shoulder. Nice bone and substance with elbows tucked underneath fore chest. Well angulated hindquarter. Hard to assess movement today but shows glimpses of goodness.

2 Jewelbull Top Gun

Brindle and white with a lovely profile, doesn't have the fill of first place and soft ears spoil his expression. Correct bite. Loads of bone and substance, a little out at the elbow and untidy feet. Lovely short back and nice turn of stifle. If he can trot as nicely as he walks then his movement should be classed as good.

Minor Puppy Dog

1 Jacamar Gypsy King Minor Puppy in Show

Chunky white boy with a long strong head, correct bite, nice profile, and tiny triangular eye which gives a great expression. Nice deep muzzle with decent underjaw. Neck flows into a level top line with good depth of brisket. Short back, well-muscled hind quarters with good turn of stifle and nice tail set. Moves nicely coming and going.

Puppy Dog

1 Sturgis The Big Lebowski Puppy in Show

Upstanding white boy with black eye marking. Slightly broken profile good length of foreface with tiny dark eye, correct bite could do with a little more fill. Straight front with nice bone, good length of neck and short back with a correct tail set. Moves nicely coming and going.

Junior Dog

1 Balgay Fat Boy Harley

Splashy black and white. Has a nice profile and good length of muzzle and a correct bite. His expression is spoiled round eyes and off-set ears. Well-constructed fore quarter with nice shoulder placement. Good depth of brisket rounded hind quarters with good turn of stifle and correct tail set. Super shiny coat. Moves well in front but close behind.

Intermediate Dog

1 ZeeJay Hired Gun

White with red markings. Very powerful head with loads of fill, wide skull, and good depth of underjaw. Scissor bite with tight canines. Great bone and substance, straight front with nice tight feet. Deep brisket. Well-muscled hind quarter could do with a little more turn of stifle. Moves nicely both coming and going.

Powerful white boy with a lovely varminty expression. Slightly broken profile but front on has plenty of fill, nice eye, and ear placement with a correct bite. Super straight front with lovely bone and right up on his toes. Good length of upper arm and well sprung ribs. Short coupled with chunky second thigh but could do with a little more turn of stifle.

2 Ch Potens Dread Fort

Wide skull with good expression but could do with more fill under the eye. Correct bite. Adequate bone and substance with straight front and lovely prosternum. Slight roach over the loin. Strong hind quarters with good turn of stifle and correct tail set. Moves close both coming and going.

Open Dog

1 Ch Kaha High Roller Challenge Dog, Open in Show and Best in Show

Eye catching, compact, square, tight, and balanced are words I would use to describe this dog. His head is smooth and well turned with tidy ears and a correct bite. Good length of upper arm and lay of shoulder gives him a lovely prosternum along with ensuring the neck flows beautifully into a nice short back. Front feet are tight and elbows are tucked back highlighting his lovely straight front with strong round bone. Short loin with well-developed second thigh and a good tail set Hindquarter angulation is very nice with well let down hocks.

2 Bullpatchy Sandro Hit Reserve Challenge Dog and Intermediate in Show

His head is wide deep and well filled with a lovely strong underjaw. Reverse scissor bite. His small ears and deep-set dark eye give him a superb expression. He has maximum bone and substance for size with a well-muscled neck and strong short back. He has lovely depth of brisket, is short coupled and has strong well angulated hind quarters. Moves nicely in front but a little close behind.

1 Kaha Dancing on My Own

Pretty brindle and white with plenty of bone and substance. Screaming profile with nice length of foreface, plenty of fill and a nice eye set. Her bite if it holds will be correct. Nice length of neck with balanced angulation all round. Would like a couple of inches less in back. Tricky to assess movement today.

2 Jewelbull Pride

Pretty white baby with a lovely expression front on and tiny dark eye. Not sure what her mouth will do at this point. Straight front but pasterns are loose. Good bone, slight roach over the loin. Short back with correct tail set. Lovely turn of stifle. Hard to assess movement today but she does lose her topline on the move.

Minor Puppy Bitch

1 Braxstar Hotter Than Hell

Tricky class to judge as there were three very nice bitches to choose from. My first place winner is lovely and balanced. Pretty head with lovely expression, correctly placed dark eye and plenty of fill. Slightly undershot with in-standing canines. Gunbarrel front with perfect cat feet. Elbows are tucked under with good prosternum and depth of brisket. Elegant neck flows into a level top line. Hind quarters are well muscled with lovely turn of stifle. Moves nicely in front and a little close behind.

2 Jacamar Back To Black

Cobby black brindle and white with a sweeping profile, good fill and length of foreface, dark eye and a scissor bite. Good bone and substance for size. Nice length of neck and short back. A little hard to assess today but looks ok in front but may be a little close behind.

3 Bullroy Candy Kiss

Upstanding white puppy with a lovely long head, smooth profile but could do with a little more underjaw, correct bite. Lovely length of upper arm with well laid shoulder. Short back with lovely hindquarters, good second thigh and nice turn of stifle. Correct tail set. Once she gets going she moves well both ways.



Puppy Bitch

1 Bullroy Pearl Warrior

Compact white bitch with a sweeping profile and a dark triangular eye, could do with a little more fill under the eye, correct bite. Straight front with tight feet. Good bone and substance for size. Well laid shoulder and deep brisket. Short coupled with good second thigh and turn of stifle. Tail set correct. Moves well both coming and going.

Junior Bitch

1 Aubiedynasty White Sapphire Junior in Show

Elegant white bitch with a slightly broken profile, adequate fill, small dark eye and a correct bite. Straight front with nice feet. Good length of upper arm with a well laid shoulder. Well-muscled hind quarter with lovely tail set. Paddles a little in front but moves nicely behind.

Intermediate Bitch

1 Bullpatchy Darling River Challenge Bitch and Intermediate in Show

This girl turned my head as soon as she entered the ring with lovely bone and substance but still retaining that classic look of a feminine bitch. Her head is filled turned, has length and strength with a beautiful expression due to the wicked dark eyes. Scissor bite. She has a gun barrel front which showcases her strong round bone. Brisket is deep and ribs are well sprung. Nice length of neck, sweeping into a level top line and short back. Her hind quarters are strong, broad, well-muscled with good turn of stifle. She was handled superbly and in beautiful condition.

Australian Bred Bitch

1 Bullpatchy Moonlight Shadow

Shapely black brindle and white with a cracking profile, lots of fill, lovely expression and a correct bite. Another cracking fore quarter with good bone, nice length of upper arm and well laid shoulder. Deep brisket with good prosternum. Short back with lovely tail set, good second thigh and well-turned stifle. Moves nicely both ways.

2 Kaha Big Bucks

Feminine white bitch, pretty head with nice fill and expression. Just one tooth out of place. Her front is not her fortune. Well sprung ribs. Strong hind quarter, good second thigh and lovely turn of stifle with a correct tail set. Moves well coming and going.

3 Zeejay Million Dollar Baby

Heavysset red and white with absolutely cracking head. Lovely in profile, long and strong with perfect fill and tiny dark eye. Reverse scissor bite. Straight front with good bone and nice feet. Short in upper arm which spoils the flow of the neck into the top line. Good hind quarter with nice turn of stifle. Moves nicely coming but a little wide behind.

Open Bitch

1 Potens Rainbow Serpent Reserve Challenge Bitch

Outstanding tri colour with a screaming profile, wonderful fill and expression with lovely depth of muzzle and good under jaw. Dark eye and tidy ears. Bite is reverse scissor with tight canines. Front is clean, straight with good angulation and nice depth of fore chest and good spring of rib. Good length of back and nicely angulated rear with good turn of stifle and well let down hocks. Correct tail set and well muscled second thigh. Moves well coming and going.

2 Yandomir Bewiduful

Feminine white with pleasing head front on, adequate fill good expression and tidy ears. Correct bite. Straight front with good bone, untidy feet. Short coupled with adequate hind quarter angulation with a nice tail set. Moves nicely coming but a little close behind.

Xylitol Poisoning In Dogs: A Deadly Sugar Substitute

Xylitol is a sugar-free substance used as a sugar substitute. It's commonly called a "sugar alcohol," and is naturally found in certain fruit (in small amounts). While xylitol is completely safe for humans, it results in a severe insulin release when ingested by non-primate species. Acute poisoning will occur in dogs, resulting in two main syndromes: hypoglycaemia (i.e., a life-threateningly low blood sugar) and acute hepatic necrosis (i.e., severe liver failure).

Xylitol is commonly found in many household products including the following:

- Diabetic snacks (e.g., gums) and foods
- Baked goods/ cake and biscuit mixes
- Chewing Gums, Mints and candies
- Mouthwashes and Toothpastes (in large amounts!)
- Chewable sugar-free multivitamins and prenatal medications
- Nasal sprays
- Protein bars and supplements
- Medications (including oral pills over the counter like melatonin or prescription medications like gabapentin). Particularly important if your vet prescribes a human drug for your pet.



Symptoms of xylitol poisoning in dogs include the following:

- Weakness or lethargy
- Depression
- Walking drunk
- Acute collapse
- Vomiting
- Trembling or tremoring
- Seizures
- A racing heart rate
- Jaundiced gums
- Black-tarry stool
- Diarrhea
- Bruising
- Abnormal mentation
- Clotting problems
- Death

If you think your dog was accidentally poisoned by a sugar-free product, first, stay calm! Next, read the ingredients to see if the product contained xylitol. The general rule is that if xylitol is listed in the first 3-5 ingredients (typically in order of the amount that they appear in the food or product), it is likely to be poisonous!

Note that other sound-a-likes like sorbitol, maltitol, and erythritol are not poisonous to dogs. Likewise, other sugar-free products such as stevia, saccharin, sucralose, aspartame, etc. are also not poisonous to dogs. If your dog gets into one of these other sound-a-likes, it's not poisonous. No need to worry, as long as you're positive there's no xylitol!

With xylitol poisoning, it is imperative to calculate whether a toxic dose has been ingested. In dogs, doses > 0.1 g/kg are considered toxic and result in profound, sudden problems. Higher doses (> 0.5 g/kg) of xylitol have been associated with acute hepatic necrosis. Many pieces of

candy and gum contain various amounts of xylitol ranging, on average, from 2 mg/piece to 1.0 grams/piece. Unfortunately, not all sources are disclosed by the company (e.g., how many grams of xylitol may be in each piece of gum) so sometimes it's hard to calculate a toxic dose.

If your dog did ingest a poisonous dose of xylitol, treatment includes the following:

- Checking a blood sugar level with your veterinarian. If it's normal and ingestion was recent (within a few hours), your veterinarian may induce vomiting. If your dog is [hypoglycaemic](#), administration of intravenous (IV) dextrose (i.e., sugar) is a must, followed by hospitalization and IV fluids for a minimum of 12-18 hours.
- If your veterinarian induced vomiting in your dog, make sure they skip the charcoal – no need for your veterinarian to give activated charcoal (i.e., a black liquid product that binds up some poisons). Charcoal does not reliably bind to xylitol, so it's not necessary.
- If a toxic dose was ingested and not vomited back up, your veterinarian will recommend hospitalizing your dog for IV fluids, dextrose supplementation, and symptomatic supportive care.
- Careful monitoring of blood work (including the liver enzymes, electrolytes, and blood sugar) is imperative.
- If your dog ingested a dose approaching the liver-toxic amount of xylitol, the use of liver protectants (e.g., SAMe, milk thistle, n-acetylcysteine) is warranted. Most dogs are sent home on liver protectants for several weeks, while rechecking liver enzymes frequently at your veterinarian, to be on the safe side.

Remember, the sooner you recognize the problem and seek veterinary attention, the less expensive and less dangerous it is to your pet! It is also a reminder to always watch children around dogs. Children love feeding treats to dogs (especially nasty sugar free ones that don't taste nice!) and dogs love stealing food from children, and they don't care if it has real sugar or not!

READ THE LABELS of the food in your home. Dangerous ingredients such as Xylitol are found in products you wouldn't expect.

Other Artificial Sweeteners that are not poisonous to dogs:

Erythritol/ Malitol - These non-caloric sugar alcohols are considered safe for dogs but in large quantities, gastrointestinal symptoms may occur.

Stevia - This is a naturally produced sweetener from the stevia plant. Stevia is safe for dogs to consume, but in large quantities, it can cause diarrhea.

Aspartame - There are no serious health effects aside from minor gastrointestinal problems.

Saccharin - Saccharin is safe for dogs, but can cause gastrointestinal issues, and long-term effects have not yet been tested on pets.

Sucralose - Sucralose is generally safe, but can cause diarrhea in dogs.

Monk fruit - Monk fruit is a newer sweetener on the market. It is similar Stevia, and generally safe if consumed by dogs.
