Class 2 - Minor Puppy Dog

Large white Puppy with 7 month. Long head with triangle eyes and correct ear placement. Would like to see a stronger underjaw – slightly mouth fault. Terrier front and upright shoulder. Nice cat feet. Friendly puppy who need to mature.

Short strong neck, Excellent bones. Wide deep chest. A bit long In back. Very strong hindquarters. A bit overweight and not in best skin condition at this day.

Class 5a - Intermediate Bitch

Mr D Garraway: Clowndog Shieldmaiden

18 month old white upstanding girl. Decent profile which could better filled. Correct mouth. Dark eyes and excellent ear placement. Nice build girl, but not full matured – need more time. Lovely made and shape. Very good shoulder placement and nice forechest. Enough bone for her type. Excellent handling which drove the bitch to show herself excellently.

2 Mrs D Patterson: Potens Needle

21 month old white girl with earmarks. Wide head with decent profile. Keen eyes and correct ear placement. Strong short neck and very good forechest. Wide brisket and strong bones. A bit long in back. Strong hindquarters and good angulations. Correct tail set. Less weight would give her more quality.

3 I & N Lambe: Hautare Seek and Destroy

Heavy 18 month old girl with brindle eyepatch and earmarks. Nice smooth profile. Underjaw should more strong and deep. Skin around neck is a bit loose. Deep wide chest and strong bones. A bit long in back. Strong hindquarters. Would prefer to see her with less weight-

Class 10a - Australian Bred Bitch

1 Mrs C D Cook: BULLPATCHY RHYTM N BLUES

Heavy dark brindle/white 17 month old bitch. Lovely sweep head, but could have a Stronger and deeper underjaw – mouth fault. Correct eyes and correct ear placement. Strong short neck. Deep and wide chest. Strong upright pasterns and well formed cat feet. Round strong bones. Back a tick long, but very strong hindquarters. Moved well on both ways. Runner UP Best in Show

Class 11a - Open Bitch

1 Ms C Krawczyk: CH STARDOM MERLOT TIPPED DIAMON

2 years old bitch with 2 red ears. Decent head with good eyes and correct ear placement. Perfect big wide canini. Deep and nice forechest. Enough bone for size. Topline could be Better and shorter. Would prefer to see her with less weight, but shows a good movement.

2 T Yeoh: YANDOMIR KAUZIN HARMONY

18 month old white girl with ear- and eyemark. Head lacks in fill. Correct eyes – low set Ear placement. Enough bone for size. Topline a bit to long. Better showing as the Winner girl, but head and bite was better by the 1st placed bitch.





BULL TERRIERS IN AUSTRALIA

By Mr. BOB ROBINS, Rurli Kennels, Smithfield, N.S.W.

I must first say how pleased I was to receive the 1957 Club Annual, let me congratulate you folk on a magnificent job, what a wealth of good solid information it contained. Now Bull Terriers in Australia are in my opinion at rather a low ebb as regards quality, but I am glad to say that now some of the better lines of blood have been distributed into the hands of a number of fanciers there are hopes of improvement.

One or two of the bigger kennels who had procured the imported stock so very badly needed here, bottled it up, and were charging up to 25 gns. a service, and when, as in my case with no results. So you can see how very serious the position was, but luckily it is changing. Then again, those same "breeders!!!" did not take full advantage of what they had, by scientifically mating, consequently, they have to a very great extent lost their advantage, which has been quickly remedied by a few good old fanciers, and I think things are changing for the benefit of the breed some of us love. Let me say I am close on 70 years of age, and have been attempting to improve the breed for nearly 50 years, so feel somewhat qualified to speak.

Now, as regards the individual imported dogs that,

in my opinion, have given the breed a boost, I would say say those I have underlined have been responsible, and I consider Romany River Trout the best dog or bitch ever to come to this country, but unfortunately full advantage was not taken of her while she was alive. I personally, tried very hard to procure those blood lines, and lately have been successful in my quest. I have a dog and two bitches (pups) that will go piaces, I hope, and I am sending stock far and wide to South Australia, Tasmania, etc., where they are winning. The commercial angle seems to be most prominent in England, and that has been the trouble here too, like you, we have had too many "dealers," and not enough "fanciers and lovers" of the breed. Don't misunderstand me when I make that statement, I think every person is entitled to make his hobby pay, but it can be stretched too far at the expense of the breed. Now for a few suggestions: I consider the B.T. Club of G.B. should consider appointing corresesponding members to keep in touch with coves like myself for our mutual benefit.

I am a member of the Hackney Horse Society, they adopt this suggestion, and it is much appreciated I can tell you, there is much I would like to know, such as

type improvements, various weights of dogs, why you allow anyone in England to buy a dog and attach your own prefix to same puzzles me, there are many things to discuss re the breed. We are rather unfortunate here, in that we have few judges with a sound knowledge of the breed, and usually we have to make do with "all-rounders" (perish the name). Then again, some of those same all-round judges from England who came here, did not tend to improve matters either for our particular breed. You folk in England have a selection of Stud dogs we can never hope to have here, so you can see how very hard it is to keep "the flag flying." Again, the types differ so that one has to keep wide awake and study back to see just what previous good ones were bred from.

I personally do not like the light boned, leggy. long caste type of dog. I consider there is a huge job ahead of the true fancier here, one very good fancier wrote to me and said, "For all their advertisements the English breeders do not really seem to like us, do they?" There are noted exceptions I suppose, but you have to find them, that's the job, eventually I concluded that it was almost impossible to deal with the big kennels, especially as I noticed that many of their successful dogs, though carrying their prefix, were really bred by

a smaller breeder, then bought by the big fellow lof course this is true.

Well I think I have rambled about enough, we have our ups and downs in breeding, with plenty of bad luck I suppose, but we are still coming back for more. The Bull Terrier is worth all the trouble. It is the only breed of dog. People say to me, "You are a dog lover," I reply, "Im just a Bull Terrier fanatic, crazy, one-eyed and biased, but its a disease."

Bull Terriers are eminently suitable for the tropics, Bull Terriers are eminently suitable for the tropics, and they thrive very well in Kenya. They like the sun, and they are incomparable guards—a fact for which Bull Terrier owners in this country at present have reason to be grateful. There are not a great many of them about at present. I think the quality of our dogs has improved a lot; there are fewer of the leggy, long-tailed, dish-faced 'Kenya' Bull Terriers about, albeit the courage of these is as high as their more good-looking cousins.

The most famous Bull Terrier is Jock, the Police dog, who has two medals, with a bar to one, for bravery, and in spite of being half killed on more than one

occasion by his adversaries, still survives to go out on patrol. We have a small but enthusiastic Bull Terrier patron. We have a small but enthusiastic Bull Terrier club, with a membership of between 3Q and 40, and also we get the occasional Bull Terrier competing in Obedience.

We hold three championship shows a year, and although the numbers shown and registered are small, the youngsters look very promising; but it is becoming increasingly difficult to find suitable dogs for our bitches. Imports are badly needed, but few people care to take the risk in these difficult times.

THE WESTERN STATES OF AMERICA.

The majority of Bull Terriers in the Western States are concentrated in Southern California (Los Angeles— San Diego) and around San Francisco.

About 40 shows a year are held in California and receive more entries in Bull Terriers than do the Eastern shows.

The general level of quality and type, however, is poor. Champions are made of specimens which most certainly would never receive a c.c. in the United Kingdom.

Imports from England during the last three or four years into California are gradually making their impression, and some sensible line breeding is in progress and is having a beneficial effect.

It being very difficult to sell puppies, there are very few litters raised in the West, in spite of our perfect puppy climate.

In the West we suffer a severe handicap due to great distances—Los Angeles is 120 miles north of San Diego and 400 miles south of San Francisco, while New York, 3,000 miles away, is half-way to England.

These distances and their attendant transportation costs together with a reluctance on the part of the fancy to appreciate and breed for a more modern type are factors which deter progress.

The Golden State Bull Terrier Club is active in promoting the breed in California.

AUSTRALIA.

By Major F. C. Carroll. Minley Bull Terriers.

No large kennels are maintained, but breeders—including several from U.K.—are most enthusiastic. Only one or two dogs in Australia would stand a chance of winning c.c.s in England, but improvement is taking place, greatly aided by importations containing Ormandy, Romany and Gazur blood. Strange to me is the reluctance of some owners to make their dogs freely available, usually quoting a fantastically high fee. This is a serious drag on the breed's progress in Australia.

CEYLON.

Maylands. By Mabel G. B. Blacker (Mrs.)

The hot humid climate of Ceylon is ideally suited to the physical make-up of the Bull Terrier. With his short coat, strong constitution and happy-go-lucky temperament, he thrives, and has many firm friends among dog-lovers in this little tropical island.

Importations from leading kennels in England have improved the breed to such an extent that visiting judges have often expressed pleasurable surprise at the high standard of our dogs. It is now not uncommon to see Bull Terriers carrying off premier awards at our Entries have always been extremely good.
