Rescind the following agreed procedures:

25 May 2024

Item 2.0: Confirm the criteria for the selection of a National Reserve Judge. Rationale:

Criteria for the selection of a National Reserve Judge shall be:

- There are no geographical requirements for residence of a National Reserve Judge
- The person is generally accepted as a Breed Specialist by having bred and shown Cocker Spaniels for 15 years or more

The person is still actively involved with the cocker spaniel breed, or a Cocker Spaniel Club.

8 April 2023

Item 3.0: Amend wording for criteria for National Judge selection.

That the judge for a National Show be selected from the <u>breed specialists</u> on the current English "A(1)" list published in the Cocker Spaniel Club (England) year book. Current is taken as meaning the latest at the time of selection."

1 May 2011

Item 4.0: Use of 'A' List Judges in year of a National

Rationale:

NCSC (Aust) ruled that clubs cannot pay for the airfares of an 'A' List Judge in a National Year ie if they are in Australia on holiday they may be used but not brought out expressly for the purpose of judging in a National year.

9 March1996

Item 6.0: Qualifications on National Show Judges

Rationale:

S McFadden spoke of the CSS of NSW's dissatisfaction with UK judges being used in the same year as the National Show. The Secretary explained that at present, the rules governing the engaging of judges is that no club should engage a UK judge and pay all expenses **except for a National Show**. This means **every year** and not just a National Show year, the only proviso being that it was not to preclude a visiting UK judge who had paid their own fare as it would be foolish to pass up this type of opportunity.

6 March1993

Item 8.0: UK Judges

Rationale:

The matter was discussed as per the NSW query and it was resolved that exemptions would be available on UK specialist judges if they were not specifically engaged for the show and they paid the majority of their expenses eg air fare etc. The exemption would also apply to a judge being obtained for payment of a fee from a club.

Procedure B

PB1: Selecting a Judge for the Cocker Spaniel National Championship Show

The judge for a Cocker Spaniel National Championship Show shall be selected from the <u>breed specialists</u> in the current English A(1) list published in the Cocker Spaniel Club (England) Year Book. Current is taken as meaning the latest edition of the year book at the time of selection.

PB2: Selecting a Reserve Judge for the Cocker Spaniel National Championship Show

The criteria for selecting a Reserve Judge shall be:

- There are no geographical requirements for residence of a National Reserve Judge
- The person is generally accepted as a Breed Specialist by having bred and shown Cocker Spaniels for 15 years or more
- The person is still actively involved with the cocker spaniel breed, or a Cocker Spaniel Club.

PB3: Use of 'A' List Judges in the year of a Cocker Spaniel National Championship Show

NCSC (Aust) member clubs cannot expressly engage and pay the airfares of a UK 'A' List Judge for the purpose of judging a speciality show in the year of a Cocker Spaniel National Championship Show.

However if they are in Australia on holiday they may be engaged to judge a specialty show in a National year.

26 April 1997

Item 5.0: Sub titles

Rationale:

- 1. There is to be no variance to the actual title National Show
- Application to use a sub-title can be submitted in writing 90 days prior to a National Council Meeting to enable member clubs to discuss and approve the addition.
- The addition of a sub-title is only be considered in exceptional circumstances and where there is no other avenue for the proposed use and purpose.
- The use of a sub-title should have no commercial or political content or inference.
- Sub-title is not to appear on the cover of the catalogue or on the relevant trophies but can appear in the schedule and inner catalogue.

5 Feb 1994

Item 7.0: Undercover

Rationale:

Notice of motion from the CSS of SA "that all Nationals be held under cover or cover be available should the weather dictate." C Smith moved the motion, seconded K Bennett and carried. It was suggested that clubs take out rain insurance which would cover the cost of a large marquee if necessary.

3 June 1990

Item 10.0: Criteria for National Shows

Rationale:

K Bennett moved that a criteria be established in regard to the schedules for National Shows and suggested future two day shows, seconded P Little and carried.K Bennett also moved that if an entry was excessive then the second judge is to be a Cocker Spaniel specialist, seconded K Twomey and carried.

8 Aug 1997

Item 11.0 Bi-Annual Shows

Rationale:

National Show to be conducted bi-annually and member clubs are asked to refrain wherever possible from contracting UK specialist judges.

Procedure C

PC1: Naming

There will be no variance to the title of Cocker Spaniel National Championship Show.

NCSC (Aust) members can apply for approval to use a sub title, by submitting a motion to a meeting of the NCSC (Aust).

The granting of a sub title will only apply in exceptional circumstances.

The use of a sub-title should have no commercial, political content or inference. If granted the sub-title is not to appear on the catalogue cover or relevant trophies but can appear in the schedule and inner catalogue.

PC2: Scheduling

The Cocker Spaniel National Championship Show shall occur every two years, rotating between NCSC (Aust) member clubs in an agreed order.

The Show may take place over two days. The host club determine the order of judging.

PC3: Venue

Host clubs must ensure that the Cocker Spaniel National Championship Show is held under cover or that cover be available.

Background

Traditionally there has only been one kind of logo used at Cocker Spaniel National Shows.

Proposed change and benefits

Developing a themed logo offers clubs the opportunity to promote features of their state and makes merchandise more attractive, particularly for exhibitors that have attended multiple Nationals.

Sales of merchandise increase the income to clubs which is required to stage such a large event.

Action after the motion is approved

Clubs will have a clear understanding of how a themed logo and the current NCSC (Aust) logo can co – exist as they prepared for a Cocker Spaniel National Championship Show.
