

The plaque was presented to me by the members of the Society. ALL ABOARD - COACH TRIP TO MELBOURITE -

ONE 'WOW' OF A WEEK-END !!

THE DOG IN THE SHOW RING.

For the New Exhibitor - and perhaps also for some of the not so New !

Learn from the Steward when your class will be called and be ready to take your dog promptly after the preceding class has left the ring.

Give your dog the finishing touches of grooming just before you take him into the ring. Get your arm band or number from the Secretary and make sure the number is

A slip lead (Choke collar style) is handy as it can be taken on or off instantly and is always adjustable. This makes the use of a collar unnecessary in the Show Ring.

If leather collar is used, it should be round. The lead (Flat preferred) should not be more than six feet long; it should be light not heavy.

Keep your dog always on the left hand side and between you and the Judge. Do not get too close to somebody else or his dog.

Keep your eye on the Judge and keep your dog showing every instant. Keep your dog alert with a motion of the hand or a spoken word (or you may resort to common use of a bit of boiled liver or other titbit the dog likes although this and squeaking toys are necessary evils).

When gaiting the dog, if the dog gets out of gait, slow him up with a sharp jerk on the lead, or stop him dead and start anew.

- Don't wear your hat in the Ring.
- 2. Don't smoké in the Ring.
- Don't pay so much attention to one part of the dog that you overlook other important parts.
- Don't call the Judge's notice to a fault by trying too
 much to conceal or minimise it.
- 5. Don't call your dog by its registered name or any other
- Don't converse unnecessarily with the Judge or the Steward or other exhibitors of the ringside. Better say nothing at all.
- nothing at all.

 7. Don't tell the Judge about your dog, his pedigree and his wins at some other show.
- 8. Don't "Hog" the attention of the Judge.
- Don't argue with the Judge as you leave the ring, if you don't agree with his placings. Ask him, after he has finished all his work, to explain his reasons, if he feels so inclined.
- Don't have the jitters, be calm and collected; if you are nervous you transmit your excitement to the dog.
- Don't let the dog boss you; keep both the dog and yourself under control.
- Don't punish or scold your dog in the ring; it shows poor training and lack of control.
- 13. Don't fuss with your dog if he is showing well.
- 14. Don't have your dog facing a strong light nor place him in a dark part of the ring.
- Don't let the Judge's hand come close to the mouth of a hiting dog.
- 16. Don't get between the dog and the Judge.
- 17. Don't loaf in the ring before or after your class is
- Don't mope around, stand idly or gaze absent mindedly; keep your mind and eyes on your dog, with a side glance at the Judge every second until the
- ribbons are handed out.

 19. Don't get too close to another dog or person purposely or not purposely. The other fellow may be a bigger bully than you.
- Don't try to draw attention to yourself; the dog is on show not you.

THE DOG GAME

Nigel Aubrey-Jones

To justify our presence in dogs, most of us have some sentimental reason that we unashamedly expose when given the opportunity. It is our defence against those who do not understand why we devote so much time to the study, ownership, companion-ship, competition and breeding of dogs — when they claim that our time and effort could or should be engaged in more worthwhile aims. It is difficult to explain the bug to those who have not been bitten.

The different effects

People involved in dogs are affected in different ways. The effect is like alcohol — under its influence some improve and others do not. Dogs can make the dullest people into sparkling and exciting conversationalists, and intelligent people the most uninteresting bores. Dogs can reveal the honest and expose the deceitful. Those suited to being involved in dogs can experience exhilarating elevation, and those who are not can become boisterous bad sports.

Dogs never discriminate

Through the ages dogs have given man admiration, gratitude and sympathy when he needed it most. Stories of the love and sacrifices dogs have made for man have filled thousands of books. While their owners have become more cynical and bitter about each other — dogs have never discriminated against their masters. In fact, dogs appear to have done everything for man —except judge him.

The right to challenge corruption

Why is it, then, that the world of dog breeding and showing is so often accused of attracting more than its fair share of individuals of doubtful integrity? Particularly so when there is so little evidence to substantiate the accusations of bribery and corruption, and when the rules governing dog breeding and showing make it so easy for those with proof to expose it. The sport of dogs is run as fairly and as honestly as the breeder, exhibitor and judge wish it. The governing body is not inundated with valid or substantiated official complaints. Consider the numbers involved each year in registrations, shows and entries, in addition to the number of handlers, breeders, exhibitors as compared to the and judges participating infinitesimal number of complaints, reprimands and suspensions. Your conclusion has to be that the sport of dogs is as clean and healthy as any other, if not more so. Everyone who participates in the sport has the opportunity to prove it otherwise by virtue of no basic evidence to the contrary - in spite of the right to challenge any corruption the integrity of dogdom has the endorsement of its supporters.

Dogs cannot talk

Dogs cannot talk. People can and do. Sometimes a lot of empty talk, even in the highest of doggy circles by people who should know better, about influence and corruption. If those who talk of being able to influence judges did have this power, they would most certainly go to great lengths to conceal it. It is unfortunate that the erroneous impression that the judging of dogs is a matter of gaining favour and influence is most prevalent among the newcomers into the sport. They assume that the slighest social contact with a person who judges dogs allows them them dangerous privilege of inferring they can extend influence for both themselves and others. The seasoned and experienced quickly recognize this as a substitute for lack of genuine dog knowledge. The wise are wary of the influence peddlers, knowing that they seek more influence than they can possibly give.

The loser

There are few sports that have given so many so much for so little in return, as the sport of dogs. A sport that knows no national boundries, that has been responsible for cementing many great international friendships. We have an obligation to preserve and defend its integrity. We know, or should know, that good dogs can and do win or are always thereabout. They have proved that they can survive the test of the most corruptible of judges. Very few good dogs have ever been lost to their breed — the only one that loses is the judge who missed him. We have said of dogs, "To their virtues be ever kind and their faults a little blind." Perhaps it is as well that dogs cannot talk.
