"ANNUAL CONTEST OF COCKERS"RULES FOR 1988

1. The Annual Contest of Cockers 1988 will run from Saturday 31/10/87 to Sunday 30/10/88. Entries close Monday 7/11/88, judging to be conducted Saturday 10/12/88.
2. Only Challenge Points awarded at all Championship Shows can be counted. (In Group and In Show awards do not count). The competition is open to all financial members of the N.S.W. Cocker Spaniel Society. Interstate Challenges are accepted.
3. The fourteen Cocker Spaniels who accrue the highest number of points will be eligible to compete also BIS at the February and August Cocker Spaniel Soc. of NSW Shows will be invited to attend and compete making the number of finalists sixteen (16). In addition 2 reserve dogs will be nominated in the order they finish after the first fourteen (14). Proof of points will be required on or before the closing date (Monday 7/11/88) and Challenge Certificate copies must be produced for all wins claimed.
4. The Returning Officer Mrs. Denise McEneaney, 10 Edgecliff Road, Glenhaven 2154 must receive entries including - photocopy of Challenge Certificate - Black & White Photo of the Dog - write up on Dog (approximately 100 words) Pedigree, by Monday 7th November, 1988 at 8 p.m. Photo and Pedigree to be retained till after judging of the contest, those of the winner will be permanently retained for the Club records.
5. Only FINANCIAL members of the CSC of NSW are eligible to compete. Points will be counted from when a person becomes a financial member of the NSW Cocker Spaniel Society. Points are only transferable from member to member if a dog changes ownership.
6. Where any dogs are owned in partnership, all partners must be financial members of the Cocker Spaniel Society of NSW for the points to be counted.
7. A panel of three judges will be selected. The drawing of the heat numbers will take place in public on Saturday 10/12/88.
8. The Panel of three judges will be published as soon as practicable and contestants will be notified by mail.
9. The Finals will be held in conjunction with the Cocker Spaniel Society of NSW Christmas Party. At a venue to be announced.
10. The decision of the Sub-Committee and the Judges will be final and no correspondence will be entered into.
11. The returning officer/Society will not be responsible for delayed or non-receipt of advice of challenge points. An advice of challenge points will be published each month in the Gazette. It is the responsibility of the member to advise and check receipt of points.
12. Members who are unable to attend the Final Judging must refrain from entering same. Recognition will not be given to dogs absent on the day and they will be replaced by a reserve. A reserve may replace any entrant withdrawn or an invited BIS winner of the CSS of NSW Show. Any Nominee withdrawn by the owner at any time will be final. ALL WITHDRAWALS MUST BE IN WRITING.
13. A trophy will be awarded to the winner of the Annual Contest of Cockers.

DIETING DOGGIES Well, a new product is apparently about to hit our market and will be a 'first' in dog feeding ideas. Is your dog overweight? Help is near with the introduction of a Reducing Diet for dogs released by Pfizer and called Clinic Diet.

FLEA PLAGUE - It is recorded that a resident of Miami had a flea and tick plaque in his lawn so he dowsed it thoroughly with petrol and threw on a match. He got rid of the fleas and ticks - but also his house, garage, car and all his possessions. Beware!

TEETH

Because dogs eat much the same food as we do, their teeth should have much the same care as ours. Breeds known to be prone to dental trouble can from an early age have their teeth cleaned by their owner with a soft brush and mild mouth disinfectant. Toothpaste is not suitable; anything unpleasant to a dog's palate will make it resent having its mouth handled at all, which will cause trouble when it is necessary to worm the dog by mouth, or give medicines by mouth during sickness.

As an experiment, a group of owners cleaned their dogs' teeth every second day over a period of time. This proved effective; there was eighty per cent less tartar on the teeth of the treated dogs than on those of other dogs, at the end of this time.

So it shouldn't be so odd to say - "put that toothbrush down at once, Johnny, it belongs to Butch."

SYMPTOMS OF TARTAR DEPOSITS AND BAD TEETH: The mouth shape, acidity of saliva, hardness of drinking water, and the diet, all affect the tartar deposits on dog's teeth. Tartar will sometimes be laid down in large hunks, so that a tooth cannot be seen at all. The tartar creeps up under the gums, making them red and liable to bleed easily. This encroaching tartar reaches the socket of the tooth, causing infection and loosening the tooth itself.

In some breeds, many dogs lose most of their teeth between the ages of two and five.

If a dog's breath smells bad, and makes you reel when the dog tries to land an affectionate lick on your face, or when an animal has its head on one side when eating, or is constantly dribbling or pawing its mouth, get attention from the vet. Bad teeth can kill a dog with poisons distributed to tonsils, or the system generally. It is unfortunate that many dogs suffering from teeth trouble are the worst anaesthetic risk, but many teeth can be scaled without anaesthetic, or just with tranquillisation. It is essential that treatment be carried out or the dog will be in pain and misery. Anaesthetic techniques have so improved that the risk to squash-faced breeds is now eliminated.

DO YOU HAVE TROUBLE WITH YOUR SHOW ENTRIES ???

Have you ever arrived at a Show, quite convinced you were entered and the numbers just didn't arrive, only to find you were NOT entered. Think of all the time spent bathing, trimming and preparing your dog, to say nothing of the travelling and the early morning start!

Remember these points when you sit down to do your entries -

1. DON'T RUSH when doing up the entries. Do one at a time and envelope and address it before going on to the next. This way you won't send your entries to the wrong show.
2. Get someone else to check the entries. A brief look at a catalogue shows the rather large number of omissions or errors made on entries. It's quite easy to make an error and a quick check by another party can save you and the Show secretary a lot of heartache.
3. NEVER SEND CASH through the mail.
4. If your numbers are not returned by the normal time - and you have sent a stamped addressed envelope - check with the Show Secretary.
5. SEND YOUR ENTRIES in plenty of time before closing date. It's off your mind and of great assistance to show secretaries. Don't leave them till you have to give them to someone at another show. It's not fair to put the responsibility on someone else.

Just a little time and attention to points like this can ensure you never arrive and find you're not entered and your submission of CORRECT entries with all the
