Dog Sports Report

From the 1st of July 2024 to the 31st of August 2024

2024 heralded a progressive changing of the guard as one generation of dogs made their final exit and the young guns started to come of age. Numbers are still good and growing steadily which is pleasing to see.

Recently we also had the sad news that Carol Chambers had passed away. Carol and her sable rough boy Shiloh (Nauglamir Shilohs Winter Drums CDX RM RAE) were for quite some time wonderful ambassadors for our breed being very competitive in obedience and rally. Carol was a lovely person, and she will no doubt leave a hole in our small community down here in Victoria.

AGILITY:

The first weekend of August was a busy one all over the country. Up in Rockhampton Naomi Shaw and Nakor (Ch Sunshard Advocate of Illusions TK.N JC) for once stayed close to home attending the trial held by their home club. This as usual included a certain amount of chaos, however team Gingernuts (*pictured*) finally pulled their paws out and nailed a pass in Strategic Pairs. Nakor also managed a pass in his Novice Jumping class.

A few weeks later over the weekend of the 18th of August, Naomi travelled up to Mackay for their agility trial. Nakor was feeling his oats after a week of boredom due to Naomi being otherwise occupied (apparently one needs to work to fund these adventures! Who knew!) so



the first bit of the trial was a wright off with lots of running hard and fast and being quite ridiculous! The following day however Nakor and Tully teamed up for a team Gingernuts run in Strategic Pairs with both the lads on their best behaviour. This earnt them a pass and a first place in their class. Nakor then backed this up with a 2nd place in his Novice Agility class... sans the pass card, and another 1st place in his Novice Jumping class *with* the all-important bit of cardboard! Nakor was at least very thrilled with the giant squeaky caterpillar he won... not sure Naomi was though!

DANCING WITH DOGS:

Julie Brown and her current team of sable roughs spent the weekend of the 20th and 21st of July at the Riverland trials. The trials were freezing cold and blowing a gale and everyone was very happy to get home on Monday and spend the day slowly defrosting. Especially Julie, who spent most of Sunday with her judge's hat on. The team managed an impressive 7 passes over the duration of the trial including the final passes needed for Sayla's Heel Work to Music Novice (HTM.N) title. Sayla will now be known as Collieston Suncatcher CCD RN FS.N HTM.N TK.N

LURE COURSING AND SPRINT DOG:

Lure coursing and the new Sprint Dog trials are incredibly popular, to the point that the first Sprint dog trial in Queensland broke Show Manager. Entries have ended up being capped by clubs to make trials achievable, but everyone seems to enjoy it, especially the dogs!

So it was that on the 13th of July South Australia held their Inaugural Sprint Dog trial, which was hosted by the Adelaide Lure Coursing and Racing club. Three Collies managed to secure entry, with all three happening to walk away with a matching set of 37 points out of the 100 points they need for their N.SPRD title. These

were Eva Drage's Rocky (Brafferton Black Ice CDX RAE TK.S RM SWA TD JC), and Inka (Brafferton Incan Sea Treasure CCD TK.S RAE SWN TD CA) and Karen Mingham's Zoe (Ellerran Carry Me Home SWN FDCH JC)

The Adelaide Lure Coursing and Racing club backed their Sprint Dog trial up by holding a Lure Coursing trial on the following day. Eva attended this with Inka chasing the final pass they needed for Inka's Coursing Ability Advanced. Inka of course came home with the cardboard making her the first Collie to achieve this title. Inka will now be known as Brafferton Incan Sea Treasure CCD TK.S RAE SWN TD CAA

Back in Victoria, a fortnight later over the weekend of the 21st of July the Saluki Club of Vic hosted one of their lure coursing events at the Moora pony club grounds. Being July it was decidedly chilly, but that didn't deter Heather Johns, Amy Butler or Katrina Wenzler one bit. Indeed, like all true devotees (or should that be lunatics?!) they even camped up there for the weekend! Fortunately, the rain mostly stayed away but oh



was it cold! All the dogs enjoyed themselves and came home with passes. Amy and Katachi collecting two more passes towards their Coursing Ability (CA) title. Katrina and Ahsoka collecting a pair of pass cards towards their Coursing Ability Advanced (CAA) title. (these Titles need 8 passes with 2 successful runs being deemed 1 pass) Meanwhile Charlee at her first lure coursing event, ran like the red devil and gained the two passes required for her Junior Courser title and a nice little bonus of the sash for the Best Junior Courser in trial. Charlee will now be known as Brafferton Dragons Treasure TDX JC (pictured)

Roughly a month later, Geelong ODC held the inaugural Victorian Sprint Dog trial on the 27th and 28th of July. Numbers were tightly capped and reached capacity within a few hours but let me tell you team "Blue Go Fast" weren't about to let that pass them by! So off Katrina and Amy went with the two blues, one fluffy, one smooth to chase some plastic bags up a 100m chute. Needless to say, all four members of the team had a lovely time. Despite the club having their usual luck with the weather, wind, rain... hail you name it, and Geelong turned it on, did anyone care? Not likely!! Two passes each and lots of fun had by everyone and the question on everyone's lips... when's the next one!

The 25th of August saw Naomi Shaw taking on the Bruce Hwy again, down from Rockhampton to Durack. Another 8 hour one way drive just so Nakor can have a few minutes of turbo charged fun.... The things we do! Still, Nakor made sure Naomi's efforts were worth the drive by gaining the final pass he needed for his Junior Courser title as well as the first leg towards his Coursing Ability title. Nakor will now be known as Ch Sunshard Advocate of Illusions TK.N JC

OBEDIENCE:

Obedience numbers are holding steady, and we are getting a bit of a revival happening in the sport after a quiet period. There are quite a few new people in the wings learning and waiting for their dogs to be ready. Obedience is the dressage of the dog world and requires a great deal of time, work and patience to do well.

Kath Drew spent the first weekend in August going back to her roots, returning to the trialling ring in fine style. She competed in CCD with Ryder. The pair managed to gain three passes, a first place, a second place and a title. You can't wipe the smile off Kath's face, and we are so pleased to see her back out and trialling again. Kath as some of you may remember was heavily involved with obedience back when she lived in

Perth, most notably with Ch Cathgarry Captain Keane UD AD ET. But back to Ryder, who will now be known as Ch Cathgarry You Spin You Win CCD RN (pictured)

Back down at KCC, Westernport ODC held their annual trial on the 17th of August. Monica and Mogh (Neut Ch Raaybeam Capt Jaytee Kirk RA) won the novice class but sadly just failed to snag some cardboard.

RALLY:

Rally is still steadily ticking along; we've had a few new dog and handler teams come into the

sport this year which is helping to balance those who have retired. Of course, a few of the usual suspects were out and about as always.

At the Canine Obedience Club's trial in Townsville on the 20th of July, Gus (Adarstern Hey True Blue CDX RA TKI TD) earned himself a perfect score 100/100 in Rally Excellent and a first place. Gus rewarded himself for this incredible effort by spending Sunday snoozing on Julie's bed, not forgetting the pillow thank you very much. Not to be out done Chloe Lewty's boys also joined in, trialling in novice for a pass each. Rebel beating his housemate for 1st place, this pass also gave Rebel his Rally Novice title. While Neo (Lexwood Winter Is Coming SWN TK.S JC) had to be content with 2nd place. Rebel will now be known as Lexwood Blackfyre Rebellion RN HT CA TK.S

On the weekend of the first of August, Kath Drew and Anissa Ruitenberg, travelled out to Orana K9 Training Club's trials to compete in rally and obedience. Kath having never attempted rally before managed to gain 3 rally novice passes a third place and a title. Ryder will now be known as Ch Cathgarry You Spin You Win CCD RN. Meanwhile Anissa competed with her two tri colours, with each of the girls gaining two passes and Darcy (Ch Cliffglynn The Perfect Storm) a 2nd place to boot.

The first weekend in August also saw the Victorian State Rally trials. The State Rally trials are held on the Sunday of the weekend at KCC Park. We had the usual suspects present and some mixed results. Katrina and Chivas (TS Grand Ch T Ch Sunshard Beyond the Dream CCD RE RAE TK.S WPD) managed a nice masters pass, as did Amy and Deo. In Advanced Katachi managed to come home with two passes from her first foray into advanced.

On the same weekend right up the other end of the eastern seaboard, Chloe Lewty and Neo went out and gained that final Rally novice pass he needed with the most lovely score. This gave Neo his title. Neo will now be known as Lexwood Winter is Coming SWN TKS RN JC



The 11th of August was the Mudgee & District Kennel & Obedience Club double rally and obedience trials, Kath Drew and Anissa Ruitenberg entered three dogs between them and came home with a positive bundle of pass cards. Kath and Ch Cathgarry You Spin You Win snagged two novice passes in their rally class, while Anissa and Raven claimed two novice passes to complete their title. Raven will now be known as Ch Cathgarry To The Moon And Back RN

On the 17th of August, Katrina trotted off to KCC for Westernport ODC's rally and obedience trial. It was a lovely day, weather wise and Ahsoka worked well at her first go



off lead picking up her first rally advanced pass. She also managed to snaffle the judge's encouragement award. (pictured)

SCENT WORK:

There are now a number of Collies in Australia competing in Scent Work, with several more that we know of still in the training stages. It is a relatively low impact sport which makes it accessible for both dogs and handlers who may find the other performance fields a bit too physically demanding. Most dogs really enjoy the chance to do something that allows them to use their primary sense. In some states the trials are run primarily by obedience clubs that have chosen to incorporate the new sport, but in Victoria the trials are generally run by the subcommittee or sport specific clubs. Due to the number of entries, clubs often hold trials restricted to one level and or element.

Para District Obedience Dog Club is one of the older clubs in Adelaide, and they hold regular Scent Work trials. On the 9th of July they held an Advanced Vehicles trial. Eva Drage and Rocky (Brafferton Black Ice CDX RAE TK.S RM SWA TD JC) attended this trial accompanied by Karen Mingham and her blue rough girl Zoe (Ellerran Carry Me Home SWN FDCH JC). The girls had a very good day with both dogs coming home with pass cards. However, the icing on the cake was that they both placed! Rocky taking 1st place and Zoe taking 2nd.

In Queensland, Yuggera Canine Club is an established All Breeds club which regularly holds various sporting trials as well as conformation shows. On the 24th of August the club held an Ultimate trial, this is the highest level in Scent Work and only a few dogs are currently eligible for it. At this particular trial, the search area was a large workshop with an adjoining outside area. The dogs were allowed 8 and a half minutes to find all 7 hides.

The dog and handler go into these areas not knowing how many hides there are and have formal distractions, such as toys and sealed containers of food to contend with as well. Keish Wall and Lady who is one of the few Collies eligible for this level went to this trial and did very well to gain a pass, as the pass rate was only around 26%

TRACKING:

Entry levels at tracking trials this year have been very high across the board due in part to the introduction of the Tracking Grand Champion title. This combined with the fact that we currently have less and less land to track on has led to most trials being balloted. We have had a few Collies attempting tracks 9 and 10 but half the challenge has been getting a track.

The State tracking trial has for many years been held at Inverleigh just outside of Geelong. This year it fell on the weekend of the 24th of August. Only two Collies made it through the inevitable ballot. They were Elliot Glass and his tri colour rough MissBess who passed her test 4, completing the first leg of her Tracking Dog Excellent title. Katrina and her blue girl Ahsoka also made it through the ballot which meant she could go out

and attempt her test 10. The track was hard going, but pass they did which made Ahsoka the first Tracking Grand Champion Collie in Australia. Ahsoka will now be known as T Gr Ch Sunshard Talk Without Speaking RN CA (pictured)



TRACK AND SEARCH:

Track and Search is one of those sports with an end goal. Once a dog has completed each track up to Track 10 they are no longer eligible to trial. This has meant that the last two seasons have been quiet for Collies as 2023 was a bonanza year with multiple dogs gaining their Track and Search Grand Champion titles and thus being retired from the sport. We have had only a couple of dogs trialling in the meantime. Added to this has been the introduction of the Tracking Grand Champion title which has meant a few dogs have been out working on their last two Tracking tracks instead.

The Tracking club of Victoria hold a few Track and Search trials each year, the base for the July trial usually at KCC. This year it fell on the 7th of July, and we had just one lone Collie entered. Katrina's blue rough girl, Ahsoka. Ahsoka's track was in Keysborough, and she went round really nicely to find her tracklayer, thus giving her the final pass she needed for her Track and Search Dog title. Ahsoka will now be known as T Ch Sunshard Talk Without Speaking TSD RN CA

TRICKS:

Tricks which started out as a branch of Dances with Dogs is now a very popular and busy sport in its own right. We have a little tribe of Collies and their handlers out competing all over the country and clearly enjoying themselves with many using it as a stepping stone to other things.



Over in South Australia on the 21st of July, Julie Brown was at the Riverlands trial attempting very successfully to trial and judge over the weekend. The dogs did a very good job of that with 7 pass cards in multiple sports between them. Rowan also picked up the
