

Dog Sports Report

From the 1st of January 2024 to the 30th of June 2024

Well on to 2024, and we are still in this funny place at the moment. There is a slow changing of the guard happening as older dogs retire or leave us and younger dogs start coming on board. We also have a few handlers out due to injury and life (isn't it full of unexpected surprises) but happily a few new people are balancing the numbers as they make their first forays into the wonderful and often challenging world of dog sports. It is also lovely to see more dogs with titles at both ends of their names, something that is quite common in some breeds but relatively rare in Collies.

AGILITY:

Agility has been a two dog show this year, with Amy out for much of the last 18 months which just leaves Naomi Shaw in Rockhampton and Paula Wilkins in Perth to carry the flag.

Naomi's young boy Nakor (Ch Sunshard Advocate of Illusions TK.S) is only now coming of age. Still on the 28th of April Naomi and Nakor ventured up to Mackay doing a grand job of abandoning the household chores for a couple of quick runs in jumping novice. It was a pretty successful trip, as while Nakor had a bar down in the first run and then handler errors to contend with in the second he still managed a 1st place in the first run and a 2



second he still managed a 1st place in the first run and a 3rd in the second.

At the Dogs West State agility trial Paula stepped out into the Masters jumping ring where she and Juno (T Ch Ellerran Dream Big RN TSD TK.S SD JDX) did a steady clear run and gained 4th place. Juno is a 500 dog which means she is in the same height class as the multitude of very competitive Border Collies, so it is great to see a Collie out there holding their own!

DANCING WITH DOGS:



Dancing with dogs is one of those sports that looks deceptively easy, it really isn't as it has a lot of moving parts and is often quite challenging, when it is done well it is seamless and great fun to watch. The new tricks trials have helped open up the door for people to try freestyle and heel work to music. We still only have a handful of Collies trialling in the sport, but boy do they do us proud. In NSW we have Dolly and Greta who spent some time over summer attending various trials and gained enough passes to qualify for their free style to music started title in mid-January. Dolly who is a successful show dog can now add freestyle titles to her bow and will now be known as Ch. Vedamea Cross My Heart TK.N FS.S

A bit over two months later in mid-March Western Australians Vicki and Pixie completed the final pass they needed for their Freestyle novice title. They followed this up a few weeks later on the 5th of April when they decided to dip their toes in to the Heel work to music classes. This was a resounding success with Pixie gaining her first started quali and a 1st place. Pixie will now be known as Mazarelli Pixie CCD FS.N RN TK.I

To top it off on the 13th of April Dogs WA hosted their annual State Dancing with dogs trials, Perth has a very strong Dancing with dogs community so Vicki was doubly delighted with how Pixie performed. Pixie gained a 3rd place quali in her Heel work to music started class and then backed that up with a 2nd placed quali in her Freestyle intermediate class. She also gained a 2nd place in one of the specialty classes. So, all in all they had a fantastic day, the important thing to remember about all this is that not only is Pixie doing a great job as a performance dog, but she and Vicki are showing us that physical limitations are no boundary. After a lot of soul-searching Vicki decided to continue trialling and she competes with a mobility aid but still does amazingly well.

LURE COURSING:

Lure coursing is a bit quiet at the beginning of the year and we only have a trial or two going on but even so on the 19th of May Eva and Inka (Brafferton Incan Sea Treasure CCD TK.S RAE SWN TD CA) were out at the Adelaide Lure coursing club to gain the 4th of the 8 passes they need for Inka's CAA title. A week later Eva drove over the border to the Saluki club of Vic's lure coursing trial, resulting in two more passes toward her CAA title.

A month later, on the 16th of June Eva and Inka were out chasing plastic bags again. The Adelaide Lure coursing club are lucky enough to have the beautiful oval at Roseworthy, which is now part of Adelaide Uni to use for their trials, which is relatively close to the city and about the perfect place for a trial. Inka certainly agreed with the location and did her thing with her usual zest and came away with the 7th of the 8 passes she needs for her CAA title.



OBEDIENCE:

With the usual suspects either between dogs or taking a break there hasn't been a lot going on with Collies in the obedience rings in the first half of the year. However, at the Easter trials this year Monica Neiwalda and Mogh (Neut Ch Raaybeam Capt JayTee Kirk RA), gained their first novice pass and 1st place as well as High Scoring Smooth Collie in Trial. The High Scoring Collie in trial rosettes are proudly donated by the Collie club to encourage Collies in the performance rings at selected trials. The brainchild of Shelley Donald who sponsored them for a number of years, they are much sort after and greatly admired by other non-collie competitors.

RALLY:

Rally on the other hand is bubbling along quite nicely thank you very much! On the 10th of March, Vicki and Pixie (Mazarelli Pixie CCD FS.N RN TK.I) were out showing everyone how it's done in the rally rings, with a lovely 2nd place in her Advanced class with an oh so close to perfect score of 99.

Back in Melbourne a week later Southern ODC who have their grounds in Bangholme held the traditional season opener. Amy was only meant to be judging in the morning but unfortunately another judge had to pull out so there she was judging both AM and PM trials! Some performance trials allow judges to compete as well as judge (though clearly not the level they are judging at) since we have such a small pool of judges and ultimately the dogs either do what they need to, or they don't. Most judges won't do this since it is undoubtedly a lot of pressure, but well what do you do.... So off she went. Miss Katachi (Sunshard Shape of

Happiness TD JC), Deo's blue daughter managed a 97 in novice while Deo(Dual Ch (RO) Drambuie Dry and Dirty CCD CD TDX TSD RAE AD JDX GD SD SPD ET) gained a pass in Masters of 86.

The 31st of March was the Easter trial at KCC park, with all the usual Easter related shenanigans going on. Stuffed bunnies on the courses (one of the signs in Rally is a figure of eight around two cones with toys or sealed food containers as distractions on the other two corners of the "square") cheeky dogs, fun and games. However, Monica Neiwalda and Mogh, survived all this to come out of their excellent ring with a pass towards his title.



At the other end of the country a week later, on the weekend of the

6th of April Collie people were out in force up and down the east coast. Anissa Ruitenberg and her rough tri boy Darcy gaining their first and second Rally Novice qualies, and Chloe Lewty and her rough tri boy Rebel, also clocking up their first Rally Novice quali!

Meanwhile in Perth on the same weekend Pixie and Vicki were out collecting their second Rally Advanced pass.

To wrap it up a week later at Bathurst Royal Anissa Ruitenberg and Darcy gained the final pass he needed for his Rally Novice title, a lovely place to pull it off! Darcy will now be known as Cliffglynn the Perfect Storm RN (pictured above right)

Back in Victoria on the 14th of April the usual suspects ventured off to Croydon ODC for their annual April trial. Oh, how we all love Croydon, lovely grounds, great judges, and let's be honest here the amazing canteen that never fails to please. We all usually come home with happily full bellies if nothing else. Well, a group of us ventured out for the day but it was Amy that came home with cardboard. Deo and Taisa both gained a Masters pass in the AM trial, and Deo an extra one in the PM trial. However, it was Katachi who was the star of the show. In the morning trial she gained the final pass that she needed for her Rally Novice title and won the ring, she then rounded out the day with a spare novice pass. Katachi will now be known as




Sunshard Shape of Happiness RN TD JC (pictured below)

The 19th of May was wet, not just sprinkling merrily wet but actual let's see how many coats we can soak through wet. It was also cold and if you've ever been to Berwick ODC's ground in Narre Warren you'll know that it is like a small cauldron, so after a while it was like standing in a wet, chilly puddle. No sane person would choose to stand out in this would they? But Amy still in a sling post op was judging. So, there we stood, getting wetter by the second with the score sheets rapidly resembling paper-mâché, never mind that though because sling or not she and Deo had made it back into a ring for a beautiful 3rd place pass in Masters. All I can say is the things we do for our sport. It took a week to dry all the jackets!

The following week the Border Collie Club of SA hosted a rally trial which Frankie and Tania Adams attended. They started off a very successful week with the final pass they needed for their Rally Novice title and a 2nd place. Frankie will now be known as Ch Foxbell Frank Zapper RN (*pictured right*)

Meanwhile on the same day at KCC park the Working dog club were hosting their annual double Rally and Obedience trial. While I was occupied filling in pass cards, Amy and Deo trotted out again with Amy only just out of her sling and claimed another pass and 2nd place in Masters, while Robyn Walls and her tri rough boy Sonny went out and sailed around their Advance classes to gain the final two passes, they needed for their title. Sonny will now be known as Sunshard Ode To Joy RA TD



Up in delightfully sunny Queensland on Thursday the 6th of June, Yuggera held

a Rally trial with Naomi Shaw judging. Chloe Lewty and her team of Lexwood boys decided to have a second attempt at Rally at this trial and both boys managed a lovely matching score of 98 out of 100 for their troubles. This gave Rebel (Lexwood Blackfyre Rebellion HT TK.S CA) his second Rally Novice pass and Neo (Lexwood Winter is Coming TK.S SWN JC) his first.

Over the Queen's birthday weekend, the Gippsland Obedience clubs pull together and run three days of Rally and Obedience trials. It is great fun, very relaxed but often freezing! This year was no different with the Gippsland ODC's trial held at their Morwell grounds being held on the Monday. The food was great, and the trial was as always well run but the weather... well.... at least it wasn't pouring! Amy and Deo had a very successful day coming away with two Masters passes, from two.

SCENT WORK:



Scent work is most decidedly the popular thing right now. It's accessible for most people, doesn't require masses of equipment, and training is relatively easy to find, and most importantly the dogs love it! We have quite a few dogs currently trialling with several more learning how it's done. For the moment trials are being held year-round which is not the norm for most sports which generally break over the summer.

The season started off on the weekend of the 13th of January. Hastings and District ODC held a twilight scent work trial at their lovely grounds in Hastings. Bryan and Sandra Crowley had a wonderful time with Durif, one of their trio of blue rough boys, gaining a pass in his Advanced Vehicles element. This pass gave which gave

him the final leg for his Advanced title. Durif will now be known as DUAL Ch (T) Ellerran Durif Parti Hi Lights SWA TSDX (*pictured*)

At the other end of the week, over in Adelaide Eva and Rocky (Brafferton Black Ice CDX RAE TK.S RM SWA TD JC)were out doing scent work too with Rocky gaining a pass in Advanced Interiors.

A few weeks later and Noarlunga City ODC in Adelaide hosted their own twilight trial, on the 2nd of February. Karen Mingham and Zoe (Ellerran Carry Me Home SWN FDX JC), who did a 100km round trip to attend were joined by Eva and her two roughs to round out the Collie entries. Zoe made her 3 minutes of sniffing count and gained an Advanced Exterior pass for her efforts. Eva and Rocky, also had some success with Rocky gaining his first Excellent pass in the Containers element.

The end of February marked the beginning of Keish Wall and Lady's (Ch Mazarelli Lady of the Breeze RN TK.N SWA) run through scent work, with the pair out regularly and having a lot of success and fun along the way. At the Caboolture KC's trial, they picked up a 2nd place quali in their Excellent Vehicles element. Then over the week from the 7th to the 14th of March, they attended two further trials at Yuggera and Logan. At her first attempt at Masters level in the Containers element Lady gained a pass. Then a week later in her Advanced Vehicle element she not only gained a pass but won the ring!

In scent work you can progress through each element (containers, interiors, exteriors, or vehicles) at each level or work towards a title over all elements at each level. In the lower levels the handler knows how many hides (places where scent is hidden) there are but in Masters they do not. There could be none or there could be any number up to 3 - it's up to the team to work this out. The classes can be quite large with 30 dogs in a single class not being unusual.

After a week off Keish and Lady ventured out to the Sunny Coast scent work trial where Lady gained multiple qualies in Masters. One in Interiors, and two in Containers, this also gave her the final pass she needed for her Scent Work Container Element title (SWC). So Lady will now be known as Ch Mazarelli Lady of the Breeze RN TK.N SWA SWC

By the 14th of April the SA contingent were out again and about to begin a run of trials. The first at Gawler, where Eva and Karen had their blue girls at the Advanced level doing both the Vehicle and Interiors elements. Both girls gained passes in their Vehicle element even under some challenging distractions, and Inka (Brafferton Incan Sea Treasure CCD TK.S RAE SWN TD CA) also passed her Interiors element.

A week later over the weekend of the 20th of April, saw both girls and blue roughs at Bendigo. Eva and Karen made a weekend of it coming over from SA to compete. Karen and Zoe gained a pass in their Advanced Interiors element while Inka and Eva came home with a pass in three Advanced elements, Interiors, Exteriors and Vehicles.

Finally on the weekend of the 27th of April Para Districts ODC held their Scent Work trial, this trial was limited to Excellent and Masters levels and Eva and Rocky participated in three of the four elements. They came home with a 2nd place pass in Containers, and a pass in Vehicles as well as the teamwork award.

On the 9th of May Lady and Keish set off for Yuggera DC's scent work trial where Lady finally gained the final pass in her Excellent Exteriors element that she needed to complete her scent work excellent title. Lady will now be known as Ch Mazarelli Lady of the Breeze RN TK.N SWE SWC

After a few weeks off on the 26th of May Keish and Lady trotted off to Redlands where she collected another quali in her Excellent Containers class and a 1st place. While Keish was delighted with the quali and the win,

Lady was far more delighted with the hippo toy she won for her efforts!

On the 7th of June the Dobermann Club of QLD hosted a scent work trial at Durak in conjunction with a big weekend of trials and shows. There were multiple Collies entered in this trial, including Chloe Lewty and her boys. While she and Neo (Lexwood Winter is Coming TK.S SWN JC) had a few little issues in Advanced, Rebel (Lexwood Blackfyre Rebellion HT TK.S CA) gained a quali in Novice



Vehicles element, which put him halfway to his scent work novice title. At the same trial Keish and Lady were entered in Masters. Lady did a wonderful job as she does and came away with the final pass she needed for her Scent Work Vehicle Element title. This means she will now be known as Ch Mazarelli Lady of the Breeze RN TK.N SWE SWC SWV

Over the weekend of 21st June the Dogs SA Scent Work Advisory Committee hosted a large trial at SACA park. There were a lot of Collies entered at this trial at least 7 that we know of. Firstly, there was Amanda Ware and Grace (Joshwyn Amazing Grace) (*pictured previous page*) who did exceptionally well, with 4 passes, including a 1st place in Advanced Vehicles, and a 3rd place in Novice Interiors and a partnership award. Then there was Denise Adams and her smooth sable girl Elsa (Ch Yaxeka Let It Go TK.S SWN FS.S) who gained a quali in her Advanced Containers element. Then we have Eva and her two, Rocky came away with two qualies in his Excellent elements, one in Exteriors and one in Vehicles, while Inka gained passes in the same two elements but at the Advanced level. Finally, we had Bryan and Sandra Crowley, who spent the weekend in SA with their team of blue boys. Durif managed a quali and a third place in his Excellent Exteriors class while the grand old man of the team Rioja (*pictured right*)



went out and gained a second place quali (one of only two) in what was a very challenging Excellent Interiors class.

TRACKING:

Tracking is currently in the midst of a perfect storm. January heralded the introduction of the Tracking Grand Champion title, and the extra tracks associated with that which of course, are more complex and difficult for both dogs and handlers but also clubs and judges to incorporate. The retirement of judges, the lack of available land and massive entries have meant a return to balloting. This means that there are fewer chances for the Collies we have competing to get out there as so many people are being balloted out. Tracking trial entries in Victoria are very healthy and often hover around the 100 mark and that puts a lot of pressure on clubs who can currently only cater for about half that number. Still there are a few managing to make it through those ballots!



The German Shepherd Club held their tracking trial at Ballarat over the first weekend in June and as is usual there was a good Collie entry. There were some success stories and of course some tales of not quite. On the 9th of June, Katrina and Ahsoka (T Ch Sunshard Talk Without Speaking RN CA) managed to score a test 9 track the first of the Grand Champion tracks and Ahsoka didn't let the side down ignoring the delights of sheep bones and bunnies to be one of the few teams to gain a pass at this level.

On the following day Elliot Glass and his associate registered Bessie completed her test 3 with a grading of good giving both Elliot and Bess their first ever title. Bess will now be known as MissBess TD (*pictured left*)

TRACK AND SEARCH:

After last season most of the Collies who were out doing Track and Search have gained every title available and like Tracking this is a sport where once you have completed all the tracks your journey is finished. So currently, there are only a handful of Collies trialling and at present most of those are out due to handler injuries and the like, so the only one left standing is Katrina Wenzler's young blue rough girl Ahsoka (T Ch Sunshard Talk Without Speaking RN CA). So, on the 26th of June Katrina made the long drive up to Wodonga again for North East Tracking and Scent club's Track and Search trial, for Ahsoka's debut into Track and Search. Little Miss certainly didn't let the side down, passing her test 1 with a grading of good and then being lucky enough to not only be offered a track on but to make the most of it and pass her test 2 as well. All in all, it was well worth the long drive. (pictured)



TRICKS:

Tricks is another sport that is currently very popular. Again the dogs enjoy it and it is a comfortable and accessible stepping stone to the more difficult and challenging Dancing with dogs titles. There are a few Collies participating in Tricks and there's no doubt a few more just waiting to dip their toes into the rings.

The 4th of February, saw Gawler ODC holding their first trial of the season. An evening trial on a very hot day at check in the temperature was still hovering at 37C which is the cut off, but fortunately by start time it was cooler. Julie Brown and her team went out for some fun as did Lynne Green with her rough sable boy, Tasgall Believe It or Not TK.S who actually won the novice ring! Julie's team did well with Rowan (R.CH. Collieston Rhythm And Rhyme CDX HTM.A FS.A TK.I JD AD SD SPD GD) claiming two qualies in advanced for a 1st and 3rd place, while her son Kudos gained his final started pass and a 2nd place! Kudos will now be known as Collieston Quintessential TK.S

A month later over in Perth, Vicki Long who is proof that mobility issues don't need to stop you getting out and having fun did just that with Miss Pixie. Together at the Western Classic they made their debut in the Intermediate level. Much to Vicki's surprised delight, Pixie not only gained a pass but she won her class.

Back up in Rockhampton on the 17th of March, Naomi escaped briefly from her judging appointment in another sport to sneak her incredibly opinionated smooth boy Nakor into his Novice tricks class. Well clearly Lord Barks-a-lot thought this was the perfect excuse to show up how good he is as he came away with a pass and 1st place.

On the 28th of April Naomi Shaw snuck off to Mackay, abandoning her other half to the household chores while she and Nakor went off in the pouring rain to play at tricks and agility. Nakor gained two passes in his novice tricks class and a 1st and 3rd place and his title! Nakor will now be known as Ch Sunshard Advocate of Illusions TK.N

On the 9th of June, Naomi snuck off (as you can see there's a lot of this going on!) briefly from her role as chief of CC of QLD show set up to do one tricks intermediate run with Nakor. This was his first go at the intermediate level and he was clearly bored with showing and Durak and thought tricks was much more fun pulling off a score of 78/80 before rushing back to the rest of the committee to finish setting things up!
