Dog Sports Report

From the 1st of September 2024 to the 31st of December 2024

The performance season is always a bit of a rush against time at the end of the year with the majority of sports taking a break over the summer, if for no other reason than the temperature. Most sports have a temperature cut off just as shows do but in the case of Endurance the cut off is 24C. Tracking being done in the bush and paddocks also needs to be done before the snakes come out for spring. So, the trials come thick and fast from August onwards.



AGILITY:

On the weekend of the 21 and 22nd of September, Naomi made the pilgrimage back up to Mackay. Mackay and District ODC hosted a double agility trial in conjunction with the rest of their 50th Anniversary event which saw them hold trials across multiple sports. There were a few of our QLD smooths out at these trials doing well in various rings which is always good to see. Saturday was a bit of a circus, which is what we've come to expect as it always takes Nakor (*pictured*) a run or two to get over the absolute excitement of being out

there, but he did put his big boy pants on just long enough to gain a pass in his Novice Jumping dog class.

A week later and much closer to home, Naomi and Nakor attended their home club's final agility trial of the year. Nakor (aka Sir Barks -A lot) enjoyed himself no end, and much to Naomi's surprise managed to come home with a pass and 1st place in his Open Jumping class. This coming after having a bit of a brain fail moment in each of his other apparently easier classes. On the first day of spring, our NSW contingent Greta Piazzoli and the lovely Dolly (Ch Vedamea Cross my Heart TK.N FF.S) having gained their started title with panache were out dipping their toes in at the novice level of freestyle. Dolly worked magnificently coming home with a lovely qualifier and a first place.

We then had to wait until the 9th of November before we had Collies out in the DWD rings when our South Australia stalwart Julie Brown went out with her young boy Q. They worked very well even with Q's rather notorious boy brain to complete both his Freestyle Started and his Heel Work to Music Started titles in the one day. Q will now be known as Collieston Quintessential RN TK.S FS.S HTM.S



LURE COURSING AND SPRINT DOG:

On the 21st and 22nd of September Geelong ODC hosted the second of their 3 Sprint Dog trials. Typically for the club the weather was quite changeable, but the dogs didn't care. Amy, Heather, Katrina and I travelled up for the weekend and had a great time. The six Collies all had fun with 5 of the 6 coming away with double passes. The exception being my boy who really had no idea and instead bounced and barked on the spot! Never mind, we can leave the zooming to the more fleet footed of the team. Team "Blue Go Fast" (pictured) out did themselves with both Ahsoka and Katachi coming home with their novice titles. This made them the first Collies (Rough and Smooth) to gain these titles and they will now be known as Ahsoka (Rough) T GR CH Sunshard Talk Without Speaking RN CA TSD N.SPRD and Katachi (Smooth) Sunshard Shape of Happiness TD RA JC N.SPRD



Team Collie had an interstate addition at Bendigo on the weekend of the 19th and 20th of October. The Saluki club hosted their final lure coursing trial for the year at the Bendigo show grounds and Amy and Heather were joined by South Aussie Karen Mingham and her blue rough girls for the weekend. The dogs had a lovely time as did the humans with all the Collies coming home with cardboard. Karen's Georgie (Ellerran Sell Me Your Dream SWN FDCH JC) and Heather's Charlee (Brafferton Dragon's Treasure TDX JC) both gaining passes towards their Coursing Ability titles. Charlee also snaffled a 4th place on the Saturday. Finally, Amy's Katachi gained the final pass she needed for her Coursing Ability title making her Sunshard Shape of Happiness TD RA N.SPRD CA. This makes Katachi the first smooth in Australia to hold a CA title.

On the weekend of the 9th and 10th of November Geelong ODC hosted the final Lure Coursing trial of the season at the Geelong Show grounds. Katrina and Heather Johns ventured up for the weekend, camped out on the grounds and had a wonderful time. Katrina's blue girl Ahsoka gained the final qualifiers needed for her Coursing Ability Advanced title (CAA) making her T GR CH Sunshard Talk Without Speaking RN TSD N.SPRD CAA. While Heather's Charlee gained another double pass towards her Coursing Ability title (CA).

Sprint dog apparently needs to be renamed Swamp Dog, as for some reason known only to those upstairs the trials seem to be beset with endless cascades of rain and soggy wet grounds. Which is exactly what happened when Naomi Shaw and Nakor decided to go and put their go faster boots on at Durack on the weekend of the 16th and 17th of November. Nakor of course takes his running fast sports very seriously indeed and came away with the final points he needed for his novice title. He will now be known as Ch Sunshard Advocate of Illusions TK.I SPD JC N.SPRD which is somewhat more impressive (if less descriptive) than his other name - Sir Barks-A lot.

Back down south, over the weekend of the 30th of November Geelong hosted the final Sprint Dog trials of the season and you'd think being the beginning of Summer you'd be safe from the rain, wouldn't you? But no, after an utter deluge the week before their grounds resembled a shallow lake, so the trial got moved over the road to somewhat better drained ground. Not that that stopped anyone mind you! Sprint dog involves the dogs running down a 100m chute after the lure (which is generally a white plastic bag) as fast as their little paws can go. Most of the dogs think it is great fun and can't get enough of it. We had multiple Collies entered and lots of titles gained. Heather Johns' pair of red devils, Teddy and Charlee both gained the final points they needed for their sprint dog novice titles which will make them Ted N.SPRD, and Brafferton Dragons Treasure TDX JC N.SPRD respectively. Amy Butler and her smoothies also went for the weekend, with both mother and daughter coming away with titles. Deo added the entry level sprint dog title to her endless alphabet soup making her Dual Ch (RO) Drambuie Dry and Dirty CCD CD TDX TSD RAE AD JDX GD SD

SPD N.SPRD ET, while Katachi one upped her mother by up grading her novice title. This will now make her Sunshard Shape of Happiness RA TD CA SPRD. Sadly, Katrina and Ahsoka, missed out on their title upgrade by a frustrating 2 points, or .2 seconds. Ahsoka claims this is due to the water hazards she had to run through. Parting the waters slows a girl down, don't you know!

OBEDIENCE:

On the 15th of September Ballarat ODC hosted their annual double rally and obedience trial at the lovely Victoria Park. Damien Pree and his sable rough Sprite (Brafferton Faerie Dragon) made their first appearance in a trial ring. They did a wonderful job and came home with a lovely pass, a 3rd place and the highest scoring member in trial sash. We are really looking forward to more updates on Damien and Sprite's adventures.

On the 10th of November Gippsland ODC held their annual double obedience and rally trial. Amy and I ventured out for this trial and she and Deo competed in open. Deo is very enthusiastic about open (especially this jumping over things bit) possibly a bit too enthusiastic as it cost her a pass card but she still claimed a third place.

The 26th of November saw OTEC run their annual FOOs trial on the Tuesday night at KCC. These trials are always well attended even with them being held on a work night. It was warm and the dogs found the going really hard work, but Amy and Deo completed their open run with a pass and first place, her first pass at that level.

In the Obedience rings at the Collie club trial, we had Deo in Open with Amy and Chivas in Novice with Katrina. No cardboard to be had but lots of moments of brilliance and the promise of bigger and better things in the future.

RALLY:

In NSW on the 15th of September, Coral Moffat decided now was the time to try working off lead. So, at Kyeamba Kennel Training Club's rally trial she and Cleo (Brafferton Its About Time) had a go at Rally Advanced, and while Carol found some of the signs a bit challenging (don't we all!) they still came home with a nice pass.

On the following day over the border in sunny and apparently very hot Queensland, Ann Walsh and her blue rough boy Jack trotted out to Bundaberg to complete their Rally Advanced title. Jack decided that a 2nd place, a quali and a title in the morning was quite enough to ask of an older gentleman in the heat. Jack will now be known as Trenwyth A Touch Of Frost CCD RA TK.N

The following weekend, the 21 and 22nd of September saw Mackay and District ODC holding their 50th Anniversary Trial. Julie Doig and Gus ventured out on both days in Rally Excellent and did an amazing job with one of his two passes being a 1st place on a perfect score. We believe this trial also gave him his excellent title which makes him Adarstern Hey True Blue CDX RE TD TK.I (*pictured*)



The 26th of September was Rally day at Melbourne Royal Show. The Royal generally only does place ribbons, but this year we had some lovely title sashes and qualifying rosettes donated by the Fairbairn family. They were beautiful and highly sought after. Three of us entered the Royal which hosted a double trial, but unfortunately Katrina's blue girl found the whole thing a bit much this year and my boy just missed out on a

second pass when we encountered our least favourite sign. Walking backwards is most certainly not my strong point and one can't really blame Taisa for bouncing out of the way of my never very straight steps! Amy's girls however went out and did their usual completely reliable thing and came home with two passes each, and a title for young Katachi, who will now be known as Sunshard Shape of Happiness RA TD JC N.SPRD

At some point in October, we aren't sure exactly when, Joan Tobin and her sable rough boy Quinn gained the final pass they needed for their Rally Novice (RN) title. Joan and Quinn reside in Perth and by all accounts have had a very successful time in the rally rings. Quinn will now be known as Coltie Shine Like The Stars RN. *(pictured)*



Gippsland ODC in Morwell held their annual double Rally and Obedience trial on the 10th of November. Amy and I ventured up and took the two older smooths out in Masters. Deo managed two Masters passes and Taisa managed one. Then just because she likes to keep things interesting Amy managed to step in a hole and damage herself badly enough for a trip to the local emergency department. Our performance community is, luckily for us, brilliant and made sure we all made it home safely. Fortunately, Amy was back to normal a few weeks later but it certainly created a chaotic end to the day!

Croydon seems to have issues with wet weather for their end of year trial and the one held on the 24th of November was yet again wet. The trial was moved back a few weeks from December to reduce the likelihood of a hot day but now it just seems to rain! Sometimes you just can't win! Thankfully the grounds are lovely since the upgrade and drain very well which is just as well otherwise it would have resembled a swamp. We had one of our new triallers, Nicole Boden and her lovely Ellie (Cayano Sweet Elegance) *(pictured)* out on their maiden voyage and despite the rain and some first trial teething problems they walked out of the ring with a solid pass towards their first title. Amy was also entered with Deo and judging yet still managed to walk away with a nice Masters pass.



The weather for the Collie club trial on the 14th of December was lovely. What could have been a hot and unpleasant trial was saved by a glorious cool breeze and resulted in some lovely work. We had a nice entry of Collies in the trial with a few new triallers, some of whom are from our rally training class. Typically, Katrina decided that she'd follow the path of madness and try to trial *and* run the trial itself. So, she and Chivas, went out and gave it their best shot managing a pass in Masters and High scoring Rough in trial. Not a bad day at the office really, meanwhile Amy and Katachi bounced around the Excellent ring for a very

excellent 97 at her debut at the higher level and snatched the High score in Rally rosette out of her mother's paws. Deo also managed a very nice score in Masters but not enough to beat her daughter. Meanwhile Taisa also picked up another qualifier towards his Rally Champion title. Monica Niewalda and Mogh also managed to gain an Excellent pass, which was the final one they needed for Mogh's title. Mogh will now be known as Neut Ch Raaybeam Capt Jaytee Kirk RE

SCENT WORK

On the 17th of September, Queenslanders Keish Wall and her lovely sable rough Lady earned the final Masters Interior pass, for her Scent Work Interior Element (SWI) title. This was at a night trial held by Redlands ODC on the southside of Brisbane. Lady and Keish now just need three final exteriors passes to complete her Masters title. Lady will now be known as Ch Mazarelli Lady of the Breeze RN TK.N SWC SWE SWV SWI

Back in Adelaide on the 20th of October Eva and Rocky (Brafferton Black Ice CDX RAE RM TK.S SWA TD JC) set off to Noarlunga ODC to compete in their Containers trial. Rocky gained a pass in his excellent class which now means he can trial in Containers at the Masters level.

About a month later, on the 16th of November, Eva and Rocky were back out sniffing at Para District's final Vehicles trial for the year. Rocky gained his third pass in this element, which leaves him with a handful of passes across the other elements to complete his Scent Work Excellent (SWX) title.

TRACKING:

The Ballarat Tracking trial is the traditional finale for the tracking season in Victoria each year. It is always held on the first weekend of September at the Haddon Gun club. This year we had Bryan and Sandra Crowley who made it through the ballot which meant both boys, handled by Bryan could go out and attempt their test 9s. The two blues worked really well in challenging conditions, with Durif completing his test 9 with a rating of Good. While Enigma completed his 9 with a rating of Very Good. Leaving them both with one final track to complete their Tracking Grand Champion title.

TRACK AND SEARCH:

On the weekend of the 1st of September Gippsland ODC held their annual Track and Search trial. This year the weather was dry but very wild with some very strong winds and the dogs really did find it very hard work. Scent disperses quickly in high winds and buildings create a great deal of swirling air currents which don't help matters, but it must be said that our dogs do have the most incredible sense of smell and will somehow find enough scent to follow along walls and fences. Taisa, who was the only Collie entered, came home with a pass and his tracking dog excellent title. Which one has to say has been a hard-fought battle. He will now be known as Dual Ch (T) Sunshard the Alchemist CD RM TSDX

The German Shepherd Club of Victoria hosted their annual Track and Search trial at KCC on the 13th, 14th and 15th of September and finally we had more than one Collie entered! The weather was what can only be described as moody, windy, wet and sleeting of all things! There were four Collies entered, Taisa who went out and completed his test 7 with a very good. Amy's Katachi, who also got a grading of very good for her



test 1. We also had the pleasure of Bryan and Sandra Crowley's two rough blue boys, Enigma and Durif. Enigma (*pictured*) worked well to pass his test 7. While Durif motored around to gain his test 8. Both boys were graded with a very good and worked very well. Durif's test 8 gave him his Track and Search Champion title, so he will now be known as TRIPLE CH (T) (TS) Ellerran Durif Parti Hi Lights SWA.

To complete the season on the 28th of September, Western Australians Paula Wilkins and Juno (T Ch Ellerran Dream Big TK.S SD TSDX JDX AD RN) also passed their test 7 with a grading of Excellent. Juno like many Collies absolutely loves her tracking and does a super job of carrying the breed flag out west.

TRICKS:

On the first day of spring, Greta Piazzoli and Fergie (Kendea Caught On Tape) competed in Fergie's first performance trial and she clearly decided that Dolly wasn't going to get all the attention and came home with a very nice pass.

On the weekend of the 14th & 15th of September Naomi and Nakor went to a triple tricks trial in Bundaberg where they competed in intermediate. Nakor of course felt the need to voice his very loud opinion on things at times but still managed to come home with 3 passes and one second place.



The weekend of the 21 and 22nd of September saw Mackay and District ODC hosting a double tricks and agility trial in conjunction with the rest of their 50th anniversary trials. Naomi Shaw travelled up from Rockhampton with Nakor, Saturday was a bit of a circus but Sunday he managed to make up for that by gaining the final tricks pass he needed for his Intermediate title. He will now be known as Ch Sunshard Advocate of Illusions TK.I JC

In Canberra on the 13th of October, Alison McCann and her sable rough boy Joey (Tyronelea Aye Aye) (*pictured*) took the plunge and entered their first tricks trial.
