A stray female cat took up residence on her front porch and presented her with a litter of kittens.


Mother and kittens are doing well and Jocelyn now has them in the same


needed.

Eddie is 93 and still going strong.







Jennifer's Story

This is a sad story of neglect and lack of care which concerned several of our members.

Karen and Bert Olsen, are reputable breeders who are members of our club. They had a litter of



Griffons and had some pups available for sale at the beginning of this year. They were provided with names of members who were

on our Griffon Buyer Register and after interviewing and talking to a number of them they selected a home which sounded as if it would be an ideal home for their little rough girl, Jennifer.

Sadly this was not the case and it is now clear that these people had not been honest with Karen.

Jennifer at 4 months when she left the breeder's home

Jennifer's Journey

Jennifer left for her new home at 4

months of age in a healthy condition. She was a happy, lively, well socialised puppy.

Jennifer when she left home

Karen found it difficult to maintain contact with the new owners, despite numerous phone calls and 5 months later she was contacted by them and informed that the Jennifer was impossible to house train and they wished to return her.

Karen and Bert were lucky to get her back but she was in exceptionally poor condition and further discussions with Jennifer's vet in Sydney disclosed the fact that Jennifer had been found wandering the streets over two km from home.





Karen and Bert

were so shocked at her condition when they took her off the plane that they immediately took her to their vet and she was found to be in a state of severe malnutrition and emaciation.

When Jennifer left home at 4 months of age she weighed 3.8kg

When she was returned home at 9 months of age she still weighed 3.8 kg and had no body fat at all.

Her skin was dry, dehydrated and flaking and the coat was brittle and matted with patches of bald skin. The coat was so matted that they couldn't get a comb through it.


Patches of bald, flaking skin can be seen through the sparse brittle coat



Her condition was consistent with long term neglect including lack of adequate nutrition leading to starvation and malnutrition.

She was severely underweight as these photos show. Only the long hair is hiding the ribs and her head appears to be large because her body weight is so low.





The weight chart shows the grades of a dog's weight. Grade 1 is 20% below a dog's normal body weight. At this stage the dog loses muscle condition as the body starts to break down muscle in order to try and get nutrition.

Karen and Bert's vet graded Jennifer at Grade 1.

Jennifer's mental condition had also changed. She had left as a happy, playful pup. When she returned she was highly agitated, insecure, bouncing off furniture, running constantly to Karen and Bert and the other dogs and unable to settle. She was barking constantly and found it difficult to respond to any human attention. In fact, she showed all the signs of high levels of stress.

She urinated frequently and showed signs of fear immediately afterwards. She was so nervous would run away when Karen or Bert tried to pick her up.

She was constantly ravenous but was unable to keep the food down.

Because of her extreme hunger and thirst she had to have an injection from the vet to settle her tummy because after having been starved for so long she was having difficulty digesting food.

Karen and Bert had to be very patient with her and feed her multiple small meals during the day so that her stomach could cope with the food.

When Karen contacted the ex-owners to discuss Jennifer's neglected condition they joked about it and said they couldn't remember the brand of food they were feeding her. In fact, they refused to accept responsibility for her condition and seemed to think it was the fault of the dog for not eating.

With a settled routine and patient care she slowly started to settle and within the first week of her

return she gained 700gms, clearly showing that her condition was caused by neglect and inadequate care and nutrition.

She was seen at the end of the first week by the President and secretary of our club and to their experienced eyes she was a dog that clearly showed signs of long term malnutrition and neglect.


Jennifer Today

I am pleased to say that now after 3 months of care, stability and sensible training, Jennifer has blossomed into a happy little Griffon.

She is more relaxed and no longer manifesting all the signs of extreme stress. She is calm, happy, no longer barking and is now responding to Karen and Bert instead of running away.



She has gained weight and is now properly house trained.

Karen has been able to strip out all the dead, harsh, dry coat and with proper grooming and nutrition she now has healthy red coat coming through.

Her muscle tone is also returning now that her body now longer needs to use it for survival and she is more active and energetic.

As her body condition improved Karen noticed that she seemed to be sore so took her for a visit to a canine chiropractor.

He found her to be in quite a bit of pain with muscle and back soreness, possible caused by the malnutrition and possibly because she was running the streets and getting incorrect exercise for a puppy.

She is now a lot more comfortable and this is just part of her ongoing recuperation process.

Our Club's Actions

Bert and Karen are club members and like all members they follow the club's Code of Conduct for Members.

The people who bought Jennifer and subjected her to such long- term neglect were also club members.

Like many people they had joined the club and placed their name on the Griffon Buyer Register. The club takes breaches of the Code of Conduct seriously.

As soon as the club was informed of the circumstances they took immediate action.

The President, Michelle Parker Brien, The Secretary, Jannelle Tremeheere and the Assistant Secretaries, Sheena Jackson and Sharyn Wood, maintained contact with Karen to get all ongoing information.

Michelle and Jannelle were able to go to Queensland and arranged to meet with Karen and Bert to see Jennifer first hand,

Karen and Bert were able to provide the club with detailed veterinary reports on Jennifer's physical and mental condition from their treating vet in Queensland. In addition, they were also able to get reports from the vet in Sydney who had found Jennifer roaming the streets in a distressed condition, 2 km from her home.

Information that Karen later obtained, which she provided to the club, also indicated that Jennifer's owners had not been honest in the information that they had provided to the club or to Karen when she made inquiries as a breeder.

These reports were tabled at a meeting of the club held in September, 3 weeks after Jennifer was returned to Karen and Bert.

The meeting voted to expel the ex- owners of Jennifer, from the club for serious breaches of the Code of Conduct and for cruelty and neglect.

As per the club's constitution, these people were informed that they had been found to be in breach of 7 Points of the Club Code of Conduct as listed below

Points

6. To ensure that all dogs that I own are kept in a safe and secure environment where they are free from physical and psychological harm at all times

11. To socialise and train my dogs so that they will be responsible and obedient members of society and present Griffons in a positive light to the public.

12. To provide adequate food, water, exercise and shelter for my dogs at all times.

13. To provide all necessary veterinary care and treatment and to ensure that all necessary protections are up to date

- 14. To be completely honest with the breeder when purchasing a puppy from them and to truthfully state my intentions for the puppy.
- 17. To always keep in touch with the breeder so that they always know how my Griffon is going throughout the course of its life,

20. To ensure that my dogs will never roam the streets and will be under effective control at all times.

As per the constitution, they were given 21 days to respond and show cause why they should not be expelled.

As a response had not been forthcoming they will be formally expelled at the next meeting of the club and the other two Griffon Clubs in Australia and the Griffon Bruxellois Club of New Zealand will be informed of the club's decision and the reasons.

The following pages have full information regarding the Code of Conduct and the constitution. I would ask all members to read them to ensure that they are familiar with them and are able to fully comply.

Our club takes its role and reputation as a club of high ethical standing seriously and we will not tolerate any actions that are in breach of our high standards or are in any way detrimental to the health and well-being of our Griffons or to other club members.

Code of Conduct

Our club has always made a great effort to ensure that we are always friendly and welcoming. However, we also have very high standards which we insist upon and we have a Code of Conduct for all Members and a Code of Ethics for any member of our club who breeds Griffons. This is why we reserve the right to refuse membership of any applicant if we have information that they have been in breach of our codes in the past.

These two codes are on the club website and I have included the Code of Conduct in this newsletter. The rules regarding behaviour are applicable to all forms of social media, including emails, messages, Face Book posts etc as well as behaviour at shows and in public. When emailing or speaking to members it is important that this is done with courtesy.

I stress that the club considers this important and will enforce them.

If you have recently joined our club please read them and ensure that you are able to comply. The rules regarding Care and Maintenance of Griffons are applicable to all members at all times. The club is prepared to take disciplinary action if formal complaints are made regarding any breach of this code of conduct as per the club constitution, particularly points 26 and 27. The constitution is also on the website and I have included the relevant section.

FROM THE CONSTITUTION

CONDUCT OF MEMBERS

23. A Member, upon election to any category of membership, shall strictly observe and act in conformity with and not otherwise than in accordance with the Constitution and Regulations of the Club and of DOGS NSW and will uphold the honour of and use his best endeavours to further the objects of the Club.

24. A Member shall furnish to the Committee such information within the knowledge of the Member as the Committee may from time to time require and within such time as the Committee may specify in respect of any act or omission on his part or of his agent or servant in and about his conduct at any exhibition or show or in respect of any matter dealt with or regulated by the Constitution Rules and/or the Regulations of the Club or of DOGS NSW.

25. If called upon so to do by the Committee, a Member shall supply upon Statutory Declaration duly made by him or his agent or servant as may be determined by the Committee any information by the Committee pursuant to Rule 18.

26. If upon such inquiry, the Committee is of the opinion that a Member has wilfully infringed any of the Constitution Rules or Regulations of DOGS NSW or of the Club or has been guilty of any conduct prejudicial to the Club or to a member thereof, the Committee may call his attention to such infringement or conduct by a notice in writing addressed to such Member and shall call upon such Member to show cause why he should not be expelled from the Club or have his membership suspended.

27. If such Member does not within a period of twenty-one days of the date of the aforesaid notice, either resign his membership or offer an explanation of the circumstances, either in person or in writing as he may elect to the Committee at a meeting thereof convened for that purpose, and if such explanation is not acceptable to the Committee, it may recommend to the Members at the first General Meeting thereof convened subsequent to such inquiry that the Member be suspended from membership for such period as the Committee may think fit or that such Member be expelled from the Club. At such meeting, the Member shall be entitled to be heard and to give his explanation of the circumstances and to call witnesses on his behalf.

28. If the recommendation of the Committee or an amendment thereof is approved by a Resolution passed by a majority of three-fourths of the Members voting in person thereat, such Member shall forthwith be suspended from membership or expelled as the case may be, and he shall have no claim whatsoever against the Committee or any Member thereof or against any Member so voting. Any member so dealt with will have the right to appeal to the Board of Directors.

As a member of The Country Griffon Bruxellois Club of NSW Inc. I agree to the following:

Behaviour

- 1. To treat all members with respect and courtesy at all times
- 2. To refrain from making public comments about other members that could be interpreted as offensive, bullying, belittling or insulting
- 3. To ensure that any disagreements are dealt with in a polite and civilized manner, especially in public when representing the club
- 4. To always remember that I am representing the club and the breed when out in public with my Griffon
- 5. To discuss and present the Griffon Bruxellois breed in an honest and positive manner to the general public.

Care and Maintenance of Griffons


- 6. To ensure that all dogs that I own are kept in a safe and secure environment where they are free from physical and psychological harm at all times
- 7. To ensure that any dogs that I breed, only go to a home where they will be loved, valued and kept safe and secure, to take whatever safeguards that I feel are necessary to achieve this.
- 8. To ensure that no dog I breed will be passed onto a 'puppy farmer' or someone who will indiscriminately breed from my dog without a concern for the welfare of the dog or the future of the breed.
- 9. To never allow my dog to be mated indiscriminately or to a dog of another breed
- 10. To respect my breeder's wishes if they do not want the dog to be bred from
- 11. To socialise and train my dogs so that they will be responsible and obedient members of society and present Griffons in a positive light to the public.
- 12. To provide adequate food, water, exercise and shelter for my dogs at all times.
- 13. To provide all necessary veterinary care and treatment and to ensure that all necessary protections are up to date.
- 14. To be completely honest with the breeder when purchasing a puppy from them and to truthfully state my intentions for the puppy.
- 15. To always contact the breeder first if at any time I am unable to keep the Griffon and give the breeder the opportunity to take the dog back, regardless of the dog's age.
- 16. If I am unable to contact the breeder I will work with the club to suitably rehome my Griffon if I am unable to keep it
- 17. To always keep in touch with the breeder so that they always know how my Griffon is going throughout the course of its life
- 18. To ensure that any Griffon I own never ends up in a pound or rescue organization.
- 19. To only buy a puppy from a reputable and registered breeder or from a rescue organisation.
- 20. To ensure that my dogs will never roam the streets and will be under effective control at all times.

Show Leads--\$15

The club has a limited number of superfine show leads for sale. These leads have been handmade and are in a red brown colour specifically chosen to blend in with the red Griffon colour so that they look almost invisible and do not break the line of the dog's neck. They are a slip lead and so light that the dog cannot feel the lead. They are perfect for puppies and for dogs that do not like the weight of a lead around their neck.

When used correctly, they allow the dog to gait with a firm but loose lead and are barely visible.



The Story of Kia

Our latest Rescue Griffon

Kia's story started when some of our members saw her advertised on Gumtree for \$500. The advertisement said that she had just weaned pups.

We were immediately concerned that she would be bought by a puppy farmer and continue to be bred from so Jannelle, our rescue officer immediately contacted the seller as a private individual. After several days of discussion and negotiation the seller agreed to allow Kia to go to Jannelle. It then became a joint effort between the Queensland and the NSW Griffon Bruxellois clubs as the seller was in a hurry to get rid of her and if she was not picked up by the deadline provided then she would go to another person who wanted her as well.

Lysander Hooper, from the Queensland club picked her up for us and took her straight to Jocelyn



Croad's home. Lysander had been told by the owner that Kia had 5 week old pups and it was obvious that she had been force weaned from them as she was dripping with milk and in some discomfort.

She was in very poor condition. She was underweight, her coat was long and matted, her toenails were so long that she could not walk properly.

Her coat had the harsh, dry and brittle texture consistent with poor nutrition and she had dreadful bowel problems with green, jelly like gastric faeces.

In addition to her physical problems, she was also terrified. She did not want to leave her crate

and shivered and trembled in fear. When she did emerge from the crate she ran into the bedroom and hid under the bed refusing to come out.

In the end Jocelyn had to set up a trolley in her lounge room so that she could see everyone but would feel secure and kept her on the lead whenever she was outside.

She was taken to the vet the next day for a full check- up. As well as being in a poor and undernourished condition with digestive issues, she had awry mouth, heart irregularity and had been bred from many, many times.

She was wormed and vaccinated as well as having a full health check

She had so much milk that mastitis was a real concern and Jocelyn had to take steps to get her milk dried up as quickly as possible. Jocelyn has bred Griffons for 50 years and Kia was lucky that she was with someone so knowledgeable so that her milk did dry up without side effects. Had she gone to a novice then it is highly likely that she would have developed mastitis and in her poor physical condition she would have become extremely sick.

The vet considered that her digestive issues were caused because she had not been fed nutritious

food but had been fed cheap rubbish. He felt that after a few days of high quality food she would improve and he was correct. The vet was unable to make a firm diagnosis on her heart condition as he did not know how much of it was due to a lack of nutrition and physical exhaustion from repeated litters and neglect.

Kia started to become used to Jocelyn and after ten days Lis Hollingshead gave her a bath and a haircut. She was cut very short to get rid of all the dead, brittle matted coat Kia started to become more confident and realised that she was



safe with Jocelyn. Kia having cuddled with Jocelyn after about 2 weeks

Once she relaxed she showed that she had a sweet, affectionate personality who loved attention. She also loved sitting on the lounge watching TV, something that was a novelty for her

Kia after 3 weeks

Because of the heart irregularity the club decided not to fly her so after she had been with Jocelyn for a month, Jannelle and Michelle drove from Newcastle to Queensland to pick her up.

Kia after almost a month of good care and nutrition. She is still lean and her coat is still brittle and dull but she has shown huge improvement and is now a happier little girl

In the time she had been with Jocelyn she had shown huge improvements. Thanks to Jocelyn's experience she had dried up her milk, she had started to become confident with people and

other dogs, she no longer hid under the bed and she was a much happier Griffon. The next chapter in her life was about to begin. **Kia in the Hunter**

She travelled very well, especially considering that she had

probably been crated most of her life, and she soon met all of Jannelle's Griffons.



Kia has been with Jannelle and her husband Adam since August and they have continued the good work started by Jocelyn. She had continued to gain weight and has continued to gain in confidence.

Regular baths, grooming and good nutrition have all turned



her into a happy healthy girl who loves cuddles and enjoys being with her family.

Kia is now healthy enough to be desexed and this will be done in November.

She has had regular vet checks and the heart condition has improved and the vet thinks it is unlikely to ever bother her She will still need ongoing socialisation but is a far more confident girl than the terrified, sick little girl we rescued.

Because she was bred so often she will never have a totally svelte figure and will always have slightly saggy boobs but this is nothing to worry about.

From this- after one month of care when she first came to Jannelles

Until we rescued her we suspect that she had a miserable life, crated, neglected, half starved and constantly bred from every season.



She was just a breeding machine and her sole purpose was to make money for her owners. They fed her the cheapest possible food and

spent as little as possible on her. As soon as she was past her best breeding life they got rid of her and didn't really care who got her. We saved her from another puppy farmer and a further life of misery

Kia is now well enough to go to a new forever home where she can live the life she deserves.

She will be available at the end of November after she has recovered from her desexing

She will only go to a special home who can meet her needs. She is 6 years old and has a long and happy life ahead of her. If you feel that you can offer Kia the home that she needs then please contact Jannelle at <u>nevaending@hotmail.com</u> and talk to her

There will be an adoption fee to cover some of the costs involved.



Rescue Costs and Support

Kia's rescue and ongoing rehabilitation would not have been possible without the help and support of so many people.

It has been yet another example of interstate cooperation between the Griffon breed clubs and shows the true and genuine care that people have for Griffons.

In total costs have been about \$1,500. Part of this was her purchase price and the rest has been the veterinary expenses.

All food, transport costs, grooming costs etc have been donated free of charge by our members. In addition, the club raised money at The Dog Lovers Show which helped defray her purchase price and some of the vet expenses.

We also received some generous donations from interstate and NSW Griffon owners who wanted to assist when they heard about her on our Face book group

I would like to thank the following people who have helped with Kia. **Lysander Hooper** – Queensland- who dropped everything and dashed out to collect Kia at a moment's notice.

Jocelyn Croad- Queensland- who kept Kia for the first month and despite having her husband ill in hospital was still able to do so much for her in the crucial first weeks when she really needed an expert hand.

Liz Hollingshead- for her first groom

Jannelle and Adam Tremeheere- NSW- who carried on Jocelyn's good work and have spent the last 3 months training, grooming and feeding her – in other words transforming her completely







Pets and Wills

While many people do not like to think about what will happen if they suddenly die it is something that needs to be considered if you have pets. As the article states- Your dogs are considered as property, not family members, under the law.

You cannot assume that your family will look after them should anything happen to you.

Rescue organisations have thousands of sad stories of well -loved pets who have suddenly found themselves homeless when their owner has died and the relatives do not want to keep them. It is a good idea to talk to people in advance and ask how they feel. It will protect your pet if you make formal arrangements with someone who is willing to look after your pet for the term of its natural life. Even if it means allocating money for the care of the pet.

PETS AND WILLS

What is the legal status of pets and can they be included in my Will?

Pets are legally the property of their owner and therefore can be gifted or provided for under a person's Will in the same fashion as any other property. Inclusion of pets in Wills is a good way of ensuring provision is made for the animals should a person die. If pets are not specifically mentioned in a Will, such as made a gift to a relative, friend or animal charity, then technically it could be said that the pet forms part of what is referred to as the "residuary estate", that is, all that is left of the deceased's estate after legacies and other specific gifts are dealt with, and it will be the residuary beneficiaries who are entitled to the pet.

What provision can be made for my pet in my Will?

As pets do not have the same status in the law as humans, namely they are considered to be property themselves and are therefore incapable of legally owning or being gifted property, making provision for them does require thought and planning ahead. There are several ways of ensuring provision for a pet.

Informal arrangements made outside a testator's Will

Informal arrangements for the care of pets, such as arranging for family or friends to care for the animals, are often made and may work if the person nominated is dependable and outlives the pet owner. However, more people are increasingly making the decision to give clear directions for the inclusion of their pet in their Will.

Formal arrangements made within the testator's Will

1. Gift of Pet and Legacy to a Family/Friend

- Involves leaving the pet together with a sum of money for its care and maintenance to a friend or family member.
- May work well where there is a trusted family member or friend who outlives the testator. However, there is a risk that the nominated


