Presidents Report

Championship Show

We held our 2nd Championship show with judge J Ziljmans from The Netherlands officiating and this time the weather was far more pleasant than it had been the previous year. Once again we had a strong entry with over 50 Griffons entered and very few absentees.

Point Score

The club point score competition was once more a great success with strong Griffon entries at the designated shows, thanks to the enthusiasm and support of our members.

The winner of the 2013-2014 Point Score was Ch Raweke Apple Cider handled by Jane Wistuba and owned by Jane and Michelle Parker Brien and bred by E & J Croad. He had a strong lead for most of the year which he reinforced with a Runner Up In Group award at the penultimate point score show.

Promoting the breed

The club was also active in promoting the breed to the public and our club had a breed stand at the Pet Expo at Rosehill Racecourse in February. Thanks to the hard work of Ros and Dave Finch, ably supported by Janine Brown and Felicity Beggs, the club also won first place in the Breed pageant.

We also had our usual Breed stand at Dogs NSW – Dogs on Show day-with many thanks to Ros and Dave Finch, Jannelle Tremenheere, Claire Parker and Jane Wistuba who manned the stand. The day was certainly a Griffon success as Jannelle Tremenheere's Griffon, Dumbledore (Gr Ch Balliol Gellert Grindalwald) won best in group as well from a strong entry of 150 dogs.

Rescue

Fortunately very few Griffon require rescue due to the fact that the majority of Griffon breeders in Australia are ethical and the clubs all promote and advocate responsible breeding practices.

All Griffon breeders who are member of our club abide by a strict Code of Ethics. However there was one dog at the end of last year — a little old Griffon man called Snoopy who was in the RSPCA at Yagoona in Sydney. He had a number of health issues and according to the RSPCA was too scared to go to a home with other dogs. We did everything we could to get this poor little dog out before Christmas. A number of our caring members offered to foster him and Jane Wistuba visited him with her 2 Griffons. He was shy with them but not as scared as we had been led to believe. Jane was willing to adopt him permanently so he could live his life out happily but he RSPCA refused to release him to us. They did however advise me in January that he had found a permanent home as an only dog. I was pleased for Snoopy but was very sorry that he was forced to spend 5 weeks in the traumatic environment of a shelter when he could have spent the time in love and comfort in one of our member's homes.

We do however have a fund for Rescue and Health and are ready and willing to help any Griffon or Griffon cross who needs help.

Health

Our club continues to support health research for Griffons. We ensure that members are kept fully informed about the latest health research findings and problems and support proven, reputable research.

Membership

Our membership has remained fairly stable over the past few years and at the moment we have just 64 members who are all owners of Griffons.

We encourage members to participate in club activities and our Christmas gathering held at the home of Ros and Dave Finch was very successful.

Our puppy buyer membership also encourages breeders who join up new Griffon owners at a nominal rate as part of the Puppy package.

Committee

As in most clubs in this busy life we have a small but very hardworking committee.

I would like to thank the Secretary Jannelle Tremenheere, Treasurer, Dave Finch and the committee members- Jane Wistuba, Ros Finch, Claire Parker, Ashleigh Barber, Marcia Mulhearn and Kerri Taylor for their help and support in the past 12 months and I look forward to working with them again in whatever capacity I am elected to fill.



Beware of Ticks



Summer coming in Australia and already the ticks are out. This is what the paralysis tick looks like. Don't delay if you see one.

There can sometimes be confusion about which ticks are dangerous, and when to rush your pet to the vet.

Engarged Paralysis Tick

Here are two examples in our photos - the grey/light green one is a Paralysis Tick & your pet should have medical attention immediatelywhereas the black one is a Bush Tick, which is generally harmless to cats & dogs.

You can see the difference in the placement of the

legs on these examples: the Paralysis Tick always has the legs at the front in that 'V' shape, and other ticks such as Bush Ticks/Cattle Ticks/Brown Dog Ticks have the legs quite spaced out around the body.

Harmless Bush Tick-engorged



- Colour- Paralysis ticks are a grey green in colour Bush ticks are dark blacky brown
- 2. Look at the legs

You can see the difference in the placement of the legs on these examples:

- The **Paralysis Tick** always has the legs at the front in that 'V' shape.
 - Other ticks such as **Bush Ticks/Cattle Ticks/Brown Dog Ticks** have the legs quite spaced out around the body.

Here is a good rhyme to remember it:

Spaced out arms - do no harm

Legs near the head - get the vet out of bed

Health Matters

Neutering your Male Dogs

There is a lot of pressure now put on pet owners to neuter their male dogs. Much of this is because there are so many dogs in the pounds that neutering both male and females is one way to reduce excess breeding.

However, if you are a responsible Griffon owner (as all our members are), and you keep your male dog safely confined in a yard and do not allow him to indulge in indiscriminate breeding then this is not an issue for you.



The other argument put forward by vets is that if you do not neuter your male dog he will get testicular cancer.

I make no comments for or against but it is important that owners have all the facts before putting their Griffon through surgery and anaesthetic

Neutering Male Dogs

With regard to the pros and cons of neutering males:

On the balance, it appears that no compelling case can be made for neutering most male dogs, especially immature male dogs, in order to prevent future health problems. The number of health problems associated with neutering may exceed the associated health benefits in most cases.

On the positive side, neutering male dogs

- eliminates the small risk (probably <1%) of dying from testicular cancer
- reduces the risk of non-cancerous prostate disorders
- reduces the risk of perianal fistulas
- may possibly reduce the risk of diabetes (data inconclusive)

On the negative side, neutering male dogs

- if done before 1 year of age, significantly increases the risk of osteosarcoma (bone cancer); this is a common cancer in medium/large and larger breeds with a poor prognosis.
- increases the risk of cardiac hemangiosarcoma by a factor of 1.6
- triples the risk of hypothyroidism
- increases the risk of progressive geriatric cognitive impairment
- triples the risk of obesity, a common health problem in dogs with many associated health problems
- quadruples the small risk (<0.6%) of prostate cancer
- doubles the small risk (<1%) of urinary tract cancers
- increases the risk of orthopedic disorders
- increases the risk of adverse reactions to vaccinations

This published material also addresses the question of whether or not to neuter a dog specifically to prevent testicular cancer:

THE MARK

 Testicular tumours are not uncommon in older intact dogs, with a reported incidence of 7%. However, the prognosis for treating testicular tumours is very good owing to a low rate of metastasis, so testicular cancer is an uncommon cause of death in intact dogs.

For example, in a Purdue University breed health survey of one breed, deaths due to testicular cancer were sufficiently infrequent that they did not appear on list of significant causes of "Years of Potential Life Lost for Veterinary Confirmed Cause of Death" even though 40% of these dogs were intact.

- Furthermore, the dogs who were treated for testicular tumours had a 90.9% cure rate.
- This agrees well with other work that found 6-14% rates of metastasis for testicular tumours in dogs.
- The high cure rate of testicular tumours combined with their frequency suggests that fewer than 1% of intact male dogs will die of testicular cancer.

In summary, though it may be the most common reason why many advocate neutering young male dogs, the risk from life threatening testicular cancer is sufficiently low that neutering most male dogs to prevent it is difficult to justify.

Undescended Testicles

The material does touch on the matter of undescended testicles.

An exception might be bilateral or unilateral cryptorchids, as testicles that are retained in the

abdomen are 13.6 times more likely to develop tumours than descended testicles 12 and it is also more difficult to detect tumours in undescended testicles by routine physical examination.



Latest Research into SM/CM



There is currently research in the UK, led by Thomas Mitchell, into the effect of skull shape on the condition.

This is not new research but it is now in the process of a thorough study and it seems that the smaller skulls without adequate back skull are more likely to develop the condition.

The Griffon breed standard does call for a fairly large head that is rounded but not domed and wide between the ears. Ahead that meets the requirements is less likely to have the problems that n that is domed and has a short back skull giving restricted brain room.

Maybe those old breeders who drew up the standards knew what

they were talking about after all

Grooming Your Rough Griffon

1. Trimming the Nose Roll and tidying the head

Rough Griffons need to be regularly trimmed and groomed because they do not shed their coats. In this article we will look at trimming the nose roll and head only. In future issues we will look at



trimming other parts of the body and hand stripping for beginners

Here you see some of the basic equipment needed to groom a rough Griffon

A steel comb,

A pair of thinning scissors, with teeth as fine as possible,

Rubber Thumb stalls (if you want to hand strip)

A three way stripping knife (if you want to hand strip)



Plus a non slip surface for the Griffon to stand on in comfort.

The hair on the nose needs to be kept short so that it does not irritate the eyes


1. Start with the face. The hair in and above the nose roll should be kept short or it can irritate the dogs eyes, causing infections and possibly even eye ulcers. As can be seen this girl has very long hair above her nose. 1st comb it out.





2. Use your thinning scissors and gently trim the hair. Always use blunt tipped scissors and always start from underneath the eye from the side. In this way the dog will not be

alarmed.








4. Now that you have trimmed the nose, you can now check the long hair on the top of the head. Ideally the hair on the head will be short but not shaved. You can scissor this hair with your thinning scissors or you can gently strip it out. Stripping should never hurt as you are only removing dead hair. If it hurts then you are pulling too much hair at once or you are pulling it from the base instead of the tips- both are wrong techniques

5. To strip gently pull the hair up and spread it with your fingers. Grip the very tips of the hair only as can be seen in this picture. Then pull the hair gently but firmly. If it is ready to come it will come straight out. If it is not ready it will not come and you should not force it as it can hurt the dog





6. Do not do this. Do not grip a clump of hair together to pull as it will hurt the dog- you must always spread the hair out before pulling as in the picture above.







8 The finished head-tidy and neat with the soft Griffon expression. The hair is now away from the eyes so that they will not be irritated and weep. Compare this with the head at the top of the page before trimming.



Brisbane Royal

The Griffons at Brisbane Royal were judged by a replacement judge who filled in at the last minute when the appointed judge became ill. The Griffon judge was Mr Stavros Argyrou (Cyprus) and he offended many of the Toy exhibitors with his rough and inappropriate handling of the dogs. He approached the dogs on the table by very heavily putting his hand on top of the dogs head. Any experienced Toy judge knows that you always approach a dog with the hand under the dogs chin so the dog is not alarmed by a large and strange hand descending from above.

He also showed the usual FCI obsession with counting teeth, despite being told by the stewards that



in Australia it is not customary to open the mouths of Brachycephalic Toy breeds. Exhibitors have become resigned to this FCI teeth fixation and the dogs could have coped with it if he has been gentle in his actions. Unfortunately he wasn't. He was very rough and abrupt and tried to prize the dogs' mouths open. His actions were so rough that 2 of the Minor puppies were badly frightened by him and they panicked so much that he couldn't even touch them so were excused from the ring. I understand that at least one of these pups is now afraid of the ring and the table due to the fright received.

Griffon exhibitors watching with disapproval at the judges rough handling

This is really inexcusable behaviour from a judge, especially with puppies of 6 – 9 months who are teething and have very sensitive mouths at that age.



Griffons in particular, have very sore mouths when teething – it is a breed idiosyncrasy, and it is a reflection on how little empathy he had for the dogs.

Once exhibitors realised what he was doing they opened the dogs mouths themselves and saved their dogs the trauma of his rough handling. However, due to the setup of the ring, it was impossible for exhibitors waiting to enter the ring, to see what was happening in the ring so they were unaware of his behaviour until a number of dogs had been judged.

This is a situation which I hope that they rectify next year as it is ridiculous that exhibitors had no idea of what was happening in the ring and it became very confusing when they had several dogs to show. Combined with the problems of the assembly stewards contradicting each other with their instructions, exhibiting was a very stressful experience.

It was only one of the many problems encountered by exhibitors due to poor organisation and planning.



The judging was very late and Griffons did not even enter the ring until after 4.30pm. By the time judging was completed it was after 5.30pm and everyone had left the exhibition area. The BOB winner was unable to collect the prizes or get the BOB photo taken as everyone had left at 5pm. This was bad enough for the Griffons but there was one more breed following us so they finished even later.
