Our First Championship Show

We are very pleased to be able to announce that Dogs NSW has given approval for our first ever Championship show. The date we requested was the Sunday before Good Friday. This is a moveable date, depending on when Easter.

When: Sunday 24th March. 2013

Where: Hillsborough Dog Show grounds in Newcastle, one and a half hours north of Sydney.

Judge: Griffon specialist, Mr Shane Thomas, (Sibermoon).

Mark this date in your diary as we hope to get as many Griffons entered as possible.

This date was chosen as it will allow exhibitors to exhibit at our show, exhibit at Sydney Royal and also exhibit at a number of other shows during the following Easter weekend, if they choose.

More details and the schedule will be available in later newsletters and we will also invite members to donate ribbons or trophies for this show.

I am pleased to say that the Griffon Bruxellois Club (UK) has already very kindly donated some prizes for Best in Show and best Opposite in Show. We thank them for these kind donations.

Our catalogue will have a section for advertising for all members and exhibitors at \$20 per page.



Uproar at Crufts

Crufts 2012 will be known more for the uproar over the compulsory health tests than it will for the dogs that won. The Kennel Club decided that the winners 15 breeds would be health tested after judging and if they did not pass the health test then they would not keep the Best of Breed award.

No exhibitor objected to the health testing but most were appalled at the way it was carried out

Exhibitors were told that the vet examination would be no more than a judge would do. In a number of cases this was not the case. The winning Bulldog and Pekingese both had torches shone into their eyes- the Peke was not even permitted to have a drink before the examination- and both were failed. The Basset Hound was subjected to a 20 minute examination and failed (a judge would only take about 2min) and the Clumber Spaniel, a champion in 30 countries, was declared to have entropian and conjunctivitis.

The Bulldog had had a complete health screening before Crufts and was declared fit and healthy by the vet – she was failed because of a slight scar on her eye(not noticeable in normal light) caused by an accident as a puppy. The Pekingese was taken to a vet the day after Crufts for a complete health check and no problems were found- she too was fit and healthy. The Clumber had undergone exhaustive health testing before Crufts including a full ophthalmologist examination and was declared clear and healthy. After the Crufts vet claimed that she had entropia she was again taken to an ophthalmologist who said that there were no abnormalities with her eyes.

To make the situation worse, the exhibitors whose dogs failed were in many cases ethical, caring breeders who had worked hard to eradicate health problems in there breeds and who health tested all breeding stock before any breeding took place. Furthermore the judges who placed them as Best of Breed were some of the most knowledgeable and expert judges in the world.

The exhibitors whose dogs failed had no recourse after the vet's decision. They could not request a second opinion and when they got a second opinion after the show which cleared there dogs it was too late. It was almost as if the Kennel Club wanted to humiliate its best breeders and judges.

The Kennel Club is not representative of English dog exhibitors as is the Kennel Club in Australia.

Here, everyone who wishes to show and breed registered dogs must be a member of their state Kennel Club which in turn gives them automatic membership of the Australian National Kennel Club (ANKC). In the UK only a small handful of people are members of the KC which is reminiscent of old time British elitism; everyone else just has to pay their money to register litters but get very little in return. And it would appear that the Kennel Club is not very choosy when it comes to registering dogs- they seem to be happy to take the money without asking too many questions.





Following Crufts, the Canine Alliance was formed which quickly gathered a huge membership of disgruntled exhibitors and breeders. It was a case of "I'm as mad as hell and I'm not going to take it anymore!" by the normally patient and stoic English exhibitors.

A committee was formed comprising of some of the most influential people in the UK dog world, including Howard Ogden of Beauview Griffons.

The Alliance is adamant that they are not against health testing and they all want healthy dogs but they want the Kennel Club to go about the process in a more logical and fair manner – and not persecute the very people who are doing the ethical thing.

It will be very interesting to see what comes of this in the future.

Here in Australia clubs and breeders have had more input into Kennel Club decisions and in many cases it is the breed clubs that have pioneered and funded health testing and breeding restrictions. In a number of breeds in Australia the KC will not register a litter unless specific health tests have been carried out. For instance in a number of breeds the parents must be hip scored and have clear eye certificates from a canine ophthalmologist before the KC will register the offspring. These breeding restrictions have come about because caring breeders and breed clubs have identified particular health issues as a problem and have worked to eradicate them.

In Griffons there have been no specific health issues that have been widespread through the breed. SM/CM has been identified in some Griffons, although this appears to be in a minority and in particular lines but a number of breeders have undertaken expensive MRI diagnosis of their dogs to help with research into this problem and are continuing to support research.

As a club we will work with others nationally and internationally to ensure that all that can be done to breed healthy Griffons will be done.







Rally Obedience was only introduced into Australia in January this year and Terri has done very well in gaining this title with a Griffon.

Rally Obedience is a fun type of trialling that combines

some of the attributes of normal obedience – sits, heeling, downs etc with a type of slalom course.

Once started by the judge the handler follows the course, carrying out the instructions at each station e.g sit your dog, do a right turn etc. The judge is looking for a dog that can complete the exercises in the course in a prompt and happy way. In the novice class handlers are able to talk to the dogs as they go around the course, unlike standard obedience where the handler is only able to give commands.

Well done Terri and we hope to see Jazzy up there in the near future as well.



WHATS IN A NAME? If anyone has any other stories about their kennel name, send them to me.

Recently in the Facebook Griffon News Group, Cathryn Feaver started a discussion on how people chose there kennel names, also called prefixes or affixes, depending on which country you live.

For those who do not exhibit -A kennel name is the name that goes in front of the dogs registered name. It identifies the breeder of the dog and most kennel Clubs around the world require a breeder to have a registered prefix or affix. For example- if the dog is called Splendid Superstar, then Splendid would be the name of the kennels and every dog bred by that kennel would have the word Splendid in front of it. In some countries the person who buys the dog, if a registered breeder, is also able to attach their kennel name to the dog's name so it could be Splendid Superstar of Fantastic – showing that the dog was bred by Splendid kennels but owned by Fantastic kennels. This is not permitted in Australia but is allowed in the UK and New Zealand.

In the USA if two breeders co own a bitch they are allowed to have both kennel names in the registered names of the puppies. E.g. If Splendid and Fantastic Kennels bred a litter together the pup could be called **Splendid Fantastic Superstar.**

Cathryn received a large number of responses from all over the world and it is interesting to see how people selected a name that in some cases has gone on to become famous on the history of Griffons.

Here are just a few of them from our members:

Caroline Elder Simple - Shiba Inu - SHI, then Griffons - GRIFF = SHIGRIFF

Shigriff Show me the Money bred by Caroline Elder

Robin Simpson Mum's maiden name was Wooding and when she married my dad John, she became Beth Grover. They decided to combine their names and Woodover was created. I took over the prefix a few years ago, following Mum's 'retirement' from Griffons. (You all do realise that you never retire from Griffons, don't you?)





Sandie Feaver Mine is PARIS. My first choice was FERNHILL, but that was already taken. And no it's not PARIS after PAREE, but Paris, Kentucky, USA. My other daughter was living there at the time and Paris was a connection with her whilst she was away.

Jocelyn Walker my Kennel name is Tiroroa - I registered it in 1973 -

Mollie Grocott had Moerangi, and Adele Viner

had Mauiti

(which she felt meant 'little bear') and had Tiroroa which means 'great view' I was up

on a hill with a great view then and I still have an amazing view now!

Jocelyn Croad My first Kennel name was Solario when I was breading

Pekingese and Mollie thought she could come up with something better for both

Adele Viner who was Louseadele and Raweke was the chosen name for me and it is suposed to mean 'little dog or small dog in Maori" so that is how Raweke came about - a lot of Mollies influence.
