BTCV	<p>99/18</p> <p>That the ROM rules 4.g, 4.g.1 and 4.g.2 be amended to</p> <p>4. Judges</p> <p>g. Criteria for Australian Specialist Judges to be placed on the ROM list are as follows:</p> <p>1. ANKC Championship Show approved judges who are current breeders of Bull Terriers and or Bull Terrier Miniatures with a demonstrable involvement in the breed/s over a period of not less than ten years.</p> <p>2. ANKC Championship Show approved judges who, although not current breeders, have bred or owned Bull Terrier and or Bull Terrier Miniatures for not less than ten years and retain close association with the breed/s and have demonstrated an abiding interest and close recent involvement with the breed/s.</p> <p><i>Rationale: To remove the ambiguity of the current wording which reads ANKC approved judges and fails to distinguish between Championship and trainee judges .</i></p>	N		Y	N	Y	Y	Y	N	Y	Carried Effective as of 12 January 2019
BTCV	<p>99/18</p> <p>“That as per NBTC(A) Constitution rule 4.8, all the authority emanates from the member clubs in relation to any matter before the NBTC(A)”</p> <p><i>Rationale: Parts of the ROM rules are ambiguous and until they're revised the NBTC(A) Executive should not be undertaking the decision making.</i></p> <p><i>Example - ROM Rule 3.a. Clubs requiring ROM status for more than one Open Show per year must apply to the NBTC(A) Secretary in writing before advertising the show as a ROM Show.</i></p> <p><i>Clubs are to apply to the NBTC(A) Secretary but does not state what is the approval process.</i></p> <p><i>Given that there is only two NBTC(A) executives, what happens when they don't agree?</i></p>	Y		Y	Y	Y	Y	Y	Y	Carried Effective as of 12 January 2019	
BTCV	<p>100/18</p> <p>“That ROM Rule 2 be amended to read</p> <p>ALLOCATION OF POINTS</p> <p>a. A Bull Terrier/Bull Terrier (Miniature) must obtain seven (7) points to be granted the ROM Certificate. At least one three (3) point award and at least one two (2) point award as defined in rule 2c.1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 are to be included. The other points may be taken from 2.5.6. Points must be obtained under separate judges.</p> <p>b. All points must be gained at an event of an affiliated Club. i.e. a club that is registered with a State/Territory Canine Control.</p> <p>c. Points are allocated as follows:</p> <p>1. Bull Terrier NBTC(A) Member Club Championship Shows</p> <p>i. Three (3) points may be awarded to the Challenge Dog/Bitch.</p> <p>ii. Two (2) points may be awarded to the Reserve Challenge Dog/Bitch.</p> <p>2. Bull Terrier NBTC(A) Member Club Open Shows (one per year) (See 3a)</p> <p>i. Three (3) points may be awarded for Best Dog/Bitch.</p> <p>ii. Two (2) points may be awarded for Reserve Best Dog/Bitch.</p> <p>3. NBTC(A) Member Club Speciality Shows</p> <p>i. Three (3) points may be awarded for Best Dog/Bitch.</p> <p>ii. Two (2) points may be awarded for Reserve Best Dog/Bitch.</p> <p>4. Bi-ennial Trophy Shows</p> <p>i. Three (3) points may be awarded for the Ormandy Box winning Dog/Bitch.</p> <p>ii. Two (2) points may be awarded for the Souperlative Box winning Dog/Bitch.</p> <p>iii. Three (3) points may be awarded for the Sebastian Trophy winning Dog/Bitch.</p> <p>iv. Two (2) points may be awarded for the Sangaree Trophy winning Dog/Bitch.</p> <p>NB: The best dog/bitch receives a maximum of three (3) points</p> <p>5. National Championship Specialty Shows</p> <p>i. Three (3) points may be awarded to the Challenge Dog/Bitch.</p> <p>ii. Two (2) points may be awarded to the Reserve Challenge Dog/Bitch.</p> <p>6. All Breed Shows</p> <p>i. Two (2) points may be awarded to the Challenge Dog/Bitch at an All Breeds Championship Show.</p> <p>ii. NDBTC	<p>54/19</p> <p>"ROM 2.c.5 becomes the Ironbark Show with the allocation of 3 and 2 point ROM accordingly and the National Championship Specialty Shows and the All Breeds Shows sub paragraphs be renumbered 2.c.6 and 2.c.7 accordingly."</p> <p>The Ironbark Show should also be included in the 'Allocation of Points for ROM Award Table.</p>											
ACTBTC	<p>55/19</p> <p>Motion 1 "All Australian ROM qualified judges complete the attached forms, Form A for ROM judges who have been a judge for less than 10 years and Form B for ROM judges who have been recognised for over 10 years. If ROM judges do not complete the relevant form within three (3) months they are removed from the list of Australian ROM judges."</p> <p>Motion 2 "Form B should be sent to Australian ROM qualified judges 5 yearly to retain ROM status."</p> <p>Motion 3 "Paragraph 4.g of the ROM Rules be changed to: 1. ANKC Championship Show approved judges who are current breeders of Bull Terriers and Bull Terriers (Miniature) are required to complete Form A Recognition of Merit (ROM) Application - Australian Breeder judges if they desire to be recognised as an Australian ROM recognised judge. 2. Australian ROM Recognised Judges of over 10 years standing are required to complete Form B at 5 yearly intervals to retain currency of ROM status."</p>											
ACTBTC	<p>56/19</p> <p>" Overseas judges prior to being awarded ROM status in Australia must be licenced to judge Championship Shows or have at least judged three (3) Bull Terrier and/or Bull Terrier (Miniature) Open or Specialty Shows and also must have a minimum of 15 years involvement in the breed."</p> <p>Rationale: It is often harder in some countries to judge at the Championship level for judges as the training schemes are so different worldwide. However a minimum number of shows at Open or Specialty level should be required before being awarded ROM status in Australia.</p>											
NDBTC	<p>72/19</p> <p><u>MOTION</u></p> <p>That the NBTC (A) executive be given the authority to carry out all day to day administration of all council matters without the constraints of having to await voting from all member clubs. If there is a differing opinion on any matter, only then should the member clubs be called upon to vote.</p> <p><u>RATIONALE</u></p> <p>The current process of ALL matters going to clubs for voting is time consuming for both NBTC (A) secretary and member club secretaries, and leads to constraints on the timeliness of actions.
