Criteria for <b>Australian Specialist Judges to be placed</b> on the ROM list are as follows:</p> <p>1. ANKC <b>Championship Show</b> approved judges who are current breeders <b>of Bull Terriers and or Bull Terrier Miniatures</b> with a demonstrable involvement in the breed/s over a period of not less than ten years.</p> <p>2. A Bull Terrier/<b>Bull Terrier (Miniature)</b> must obtain seven (7) points to be granted the ROM Certificate. At least one three (3) point award and at least one two (2) point award as defined in rule 2c.1, 2, 3 ,4 or 5 are to be included. The other points may be taken from 2.56. Points must be obtained under separate judges.</p> <p>b. All points must be gained at an event of an affiliated Club. i.e. a club that is registered with a State/Territory Canine Control.</p> <p>c. Points are allocated as follows:</p> <p>1. <b>Bull Terrier NBTC(A) Member Club Championship Shows</b></p> <p>i. Three (3) points may be awarded to the Challenge Dog/Bitch.</p> <p>ii. Rationale: It is often harder in some countries to judge at the Championship level for judges as the training schemes are so different worldwide. ACTBTC	NOM 161/19  NBTC(A) 129/19 provided the results of the three NOM submitted by the ACTBTC regarding Forms for judges to complete. Motion 1 was lost and 2 and 3 were carried.  The ACTBTC believes that there may have been some ambiguity with Motion 1. The intent was for ALL ROM approved judges who have been awarding ROM points for less than 10 years to complete Form A. Furthermore, Form A should also be used for any future applications by Australian Judges to be granted ROM status.  The ACTBTC believes the current Paragraph 4.g of the ROM Rules (Criteria for Australian Specialist Judges) does not provide enough clarification and guidelines on the requirements for becoming a ROM Approved Judge in Australia. The paragraph is vague.  The Club wishes to propose the following Notice of Motion:  <b>Motion 1</b> "All Australian ROM Approved Judges listed on the NBTC(A) website page complete Form A for ROM approved judges who have been awarding ROM points for less than 10 years. If ROM approved judges do not complete the relevant form within three (3) months or meet the criteria, they will be removed from the list of Australian ROM Approved Judges. Form A is also to be used for all new applications to request approval to become a ROM Recognised Australian Breeder Judge."															Motion withdrawn from nominating Club
