

BABY PUPPY DOG:

- 1st. EMANJARO ASHLEY: (Bred and owned Emanjaro Kennels)  
Terrific head, nice compact body, good quarters, front is not correct and a lot of hard work is going to be required for it. Nice dog, nice shape, good type. Should not be near the ring for another six months, if not more.
- 2nd. KARMAKANE KOMMISSER: (Bred and owned by Mr. & Mrs. D. Wright)  
Ears no problem though only half cocked today. Again front is far from correct - a lot of hard work will be required - quarters neat, tidy; compact body, very good tail carriage, a thick compact head, deep strong muzzle, not the finish of No. 1 it lacks a little in length, but he is only four months. Very worthy.
- 3rd. HANSABOD APACHE LAD: (Bred and owned by Mr. K. Hand)  
Deep brindle and white, beautiful puppy, could very well reverse places. Only tiny - 12 weeks old, front feet require attention, elbows tucked right under, short compact body. A very, very nice little baby.
- 4th. MASKAS APACHE WARRIOR: (Bred S. & J. Kotz, Owned Ms. D Parson)  
Very unfortunate as he has a bad mouth - completely reverse scissors (to be polite) - it isn't one or two teeth but the whole jaw. He has a superb head, beautiful neck, terrific top. As he matures and if the mouth gets no worse, could very well do a whole lot of winning. A lovely baby.

MINOR DOG:

- 1st. FANGORN JOE COOL. (Bred and owned by W. & J. Whiting)  
Superb headed, big dog with a good front, nice body, well balanced, decent quarters, very easily handled, nice head, few orange ticks which will clear.
- 2nd. AMRABULL KENT: (Bred and Owned by W. & M. Carter)  
Smaller dog, more compact, lovely little fellow, got a lot of time on his side. Very neat head not overdone, lovely ears, nice neck, nice top on his body. Could reverse a few places as he gets older.
- 3rd. MONKROMONY FAGEN . (Bred and owned by Monkromony Kennels)  
Being cruel - not a correct mouth but only two teeth wrong. A lovely big brindle, very mature indeed. A bit long in body, excellent front, a remarkable lovely big brindle puppy. Could mature well as only 7 months.
- 4th. PALOOKA ROCKY ROAD: (Bred M. Smith, owned Mr. & Mrs. Ingram)  
My best baby dog at Brisbane. A lot of hard work to do at the front. Well deserved his place in a lot of good company.

PUPPY DOG:

- 1st. WOLDBEST BEAU BRUMMEL: (Bred and owned by A. Wilson & M. House)  
First class, lovely ears and body, very short and compact with good quarters, nicely carried tail, neck is gorgeous, perfect mouth, adequate head - filled, with lovely length and beautiful eye, beautiful bone and feet. A remarkably beautiful dog, ably handled.
- 2nd. KANYAKA MYSTRO BOY: (Bred D.&T. Scarr, Owned W.&J. Whiting)  
Tough, has time on his side, No. 1 beats him in quarters. can't live with him in head because if you can get a better head you'd be going some. Shade light in body, movement not a million dollars. Very tight, very close. First class odg with a great sweeping arcy head, lovely eye, not the best of quarters, but should develop with age.
- 3rd. MONKROMONY MR. WONG: (Bred and owned by Monkromony Knls.)  
A big lad, only 7½ months, everybody will say he's sloppy, but he's not. Stands on four beautiful feet. Young guy who owns him should make something of him with age, excercise and time. Not quite the dynamic finish of head but a great big strong muzzle, beautiful length of head with nice eye and ears, a few ticks which will clear - a very nice puppy.
- 4th. AMRUBULL KENT:  
2nd in Minor Puppy and well deserved his place here. Time is his best friend and he will do some winning, with this fellow. Not quite so big, so classical, but a very nice puppy.

JUNIOR DOG:

- 1st. CASTIG CASANOVA: (Bred and Owned by Mr.&Mrs. R. Cook)  
Completely classical white dog. Young, but could carry a bit more body. Magnificent head, magnificent eye, good mouth, perfect ears, a lovely neck, moves well - handler as nervous as hell. Basically speaking a first class dog and up to any standard I can think of, pushed hell of a hard by.
- 2nd. BIANCHI JESTER BOY: (Bred T. Webb owned by Mr. L. Greenall)  
A magnificently handled brindle who has a cracking head, a shade longer in back, perfect mouth, sound as a bell and has a lot of guts - but under control I hope, which he is this brindle fellow could do a lot of winning.
- 3rd. AZONAX ADAM ANT: (Bred R. Fox, owned by M.J. McQuillen)  
A little corky fellow, a magnificent head again, mouth good, a floppy lug but who cares, He holds the other perfectly. Very well-filled head, a bit 'bossy' in front, very little compact dog who moves well. Again ably handled, but why not- I taught him.

JUNIOR DOG: Cont.

4th DANTARO BOOTSIE: (Bred Dantaro Knls., owned Mr. & Mrs. ROY)  
He's like this judge - overweight. A big, fine-looking lad, could have been up a couple of places higher but must get the weight off him. This speaks for itself, but his big fat gut stops him moving correctly. A lovely dog with a terrific head and lovely ear pieces. His young handler is going to do a lot of walking with him to lose a lot of that weight.

INTERMEDIATE DOG:

- 1st. CH. KILJARKA KALPA: (Bred and owned by Mrs. B. Grace)  
He's an absolutely beautiful big dog. A big heavyweight standing on four perfect feet. Lovely body with some skin marks which we all know are permitted. He has a fine big head with a perfect mouth, ears - well I've seen better they're big they're well carried. A nice big dog with a good head, a lovely neck and perfect shoulders, and a short back. A remarkably nice dog handled exceptionally well. He's got a nice long tail which could be trimmed better.
- 2nd. CH. XIPHERES HERODIAS: (Bred M. Plane, owned by J. Watkiss)  
A bloody good dog and a first class handler. Soundest dog I've seen up to the present. He hasn't got the head of No. 1, he's got better ears. Maybe one would say a shade longer in back, but a very, very sound mover and a pleasure to see him go, and the handler handles him to perfection, we'll have him giving lessons later. A lovely dog with a nice neck, quality throughout. A very tight decision, maybe went on head as both have perfect mouths.
- 3rd. CH. SAEBERT EKKALA: (Bred Mrs. Cam, owned by Mr. & Mrs. Wright)  
A good head, neat ears, neat dog altogether. A wee bit steep in shoulder, not too bad in quarters, a neat well-trimmed tail, quite a nice dog.
- 4th. CH. MONKROMONY WHISKY BOY: (Bred Mr. & Mrs. Goetz owned by Mr. & Mrs. Bull)  
A short compact head, very well packed. He's not so good on the move. We'll leave it at that because he's a nice dog, wee bit steep in shoulder. A remarkably nice black brindle and white, a typical wee thing.

LIMIT DOG:

- 1st. MELOPE MOSS CAMPION: (Bred Mrs. Ovenstone, owned by Mrs. J. Barham)  
On his own, just as well probably for the rest. He's a beautifully big-headed dog, tremendously long, powerful head - a classical with a nice small eye, lovely front, long back to go along with it. Moves quite well, won't use his ears at the moment but I'm sure he'll pick up as he goes on. A big heavyweight. Maybe a bit more roman finish, but we can't have it all.

OPEN DOG:

- 1st. CH. ALASTOR MAJOR BENSON: (Bred and owned by Mrs. N. Baker)  
A fine big dog, terrific headpiece - classical and tremendous head with tremendous neck, lovely big strong neck - must be 20 odd inches round it, great clean shoulders - not the slightest bit coarse, great big heavy thick quarters which he uses on the move. A very devastating dog indeed. Lovely ears, a great big bull terrier, all that I like.
- 2nd. CH. CASTIG CRACKADANLY: (Bred & owned by Mr. & Mrs. R. Cook)  
I judged him in Brisbane, he's a beautiful big classical dog with a classic head, mouth level which threw away some points against the winner. He's a classy dog, quarters a wee bit straight, but as I said earlier, good enough to be a champion in the U.K. Tremendously well-filled head, if you want a football, it's there. A tight decision.
- 3rd. BARDSEY BOSTON: (Bred F. Stimo owned by Mr C. Butson)  
A big shy handler with a four year old dog he seems to be ashamed of. He's got no need to be because he's got everything, a tremendously packed head, his teeth are level, he's a credit to him, but a sleepy-headed devil who would probably be the joy of the party at home. Anyway, I think the old dog deserved this.
- 4th. CH. BODALLA NORTHERN STAR: (Bred and owned by Mrs. Burgoine)  
Upright beautiful young dog, handled well. Not 100% in front, his feet let him down but he's got a nice smart little head, cobby little body and a nice neck. Carries one or two ticks but they're nothing, mere beauty marks. Nice neat dog.  
A Good Class.

Out of the line-up for Challenge the Intermediate Dog went best dog and is over 18 months. At the top of the line was another big white, winner of the Open Class. He has a little bit longer back and very nearly edged him, but didn't on this day. A very tight decision, with the girl at the top of the line with the Open dog pressing like hell. An awfully sound dog indeed. The under 18 month dog went to my challenge winner at Brisbane and would make a Champion without any great trouble. He is a magnificent dog who didn't show with such verve and flair today, but he took the under 18 months over a beautiful gorgeous puppy with a big dark well-sunburnt handler with flowing black hair, whose dog Reserve yesterday.

BAFF PUPPY BITCH

- 1st. ALASTOR GYPSY QUEEN: (Bred Mrs. N. Baker, owned by Mr. T. Bayliss)  
Beautiful little puppy, everything going for her only a tiny quality all white little beauty. Ears right up on top, well filled head, bags of pigmentation, bags of spirit, lovely quarters.

BABY PUPPY BITCH: Cont.


- 2nd. ALASTOR SHE'S ME GAL: (Bred and owned Mrs. N. Baker)  
Again a smart little white, wee bit upright in shoulder but she has a super little head, lovely ears, make a cracking little bitch when she grows up/ also has nice quarters.
- 3rd. SHIRVIN ZEE BELLE: (Bred and owned by V.&S. Healand)  
Brindle and white, level mouth at 5½ months. If her mouth holds she'll be alright. Again, a lovely coloured puppy - one might call her a pæd, an awful lot of white amongst the brindle, classy head fully packed up, quite a nice pup
- 4th. ALASTOR MISTY JEWEL: (Bred and owned by Mrs. N. Baker)  
A tiny baby with again a good head, good ears. A bit sloppy but what would you expect in a baby.  
A nice class indeed.

MINOR PUPPY BITCH: A difficult class because they're all about the same state. If there is anyone here who can judge these and be right, they're bloody better than me.

- 1st. VANITEX JUST TRUMPS: (Bred and owned by Mr. & Mrs. McLean)  
A gorgeous white, throws her feet out a little bit at the front, but a nice enough head without it being terrific. She'll improve. A compact body, quality, ably handled, a very nice little white bitch indeed. Only a very, very baby
- 2 nd. SHIRVIN XQUISITE MAID: (Bred and owned by V&S Healand)  
Bred in line up, a beautiful solid brindle with a white nose and white chest. She just says 'today I'm not going to move'. I, as the judge, saw her move sufficiently well - the ringside may have seen differently, and she is a very nice solid brindle with a gorgeous head, she'll have better days.
- 3rd. BULLYSIMS NEFRITITI: (Bred and owned by Mr. & Mrs. G.J. Sims)  
Stands wide in front, another nice neat headed little thing she can only improve - time is on her side. A cracking head, cracking neck, nice quarters, when she tightens in front she's there.
- 4th. MAHBULL MODESTY BLAISE: (bred and owned by Mrs. J. Barham)  
A brindle who pushed another little brindle into 5th place who has a nice head but an awful back end. This little girl is absolutely solid, built square, not a tremendous finish to her head but a nice brindle bitch, could do a lot for the breed.

PUPPY BITCH:

- 1st. MONKROMONY WHISKY ROSE: (bred and owned by Monkromony Knls.)  
Beautiful bitch, terrific head, nice eye, nice front, lovely feet, short compact body, changing her coat - it's a bit thick - ears beautiful, going to make a beautiful girl, this is something I like.




PUPPY BITCH CONTINUED.

- 2nd. MAOLMHAIR DEVIL DANCER: (bred and owned by D.&D. Cuthbert)  
A gorgeous big bitch, mouth level, super head, slightly long in back but a beautiful bitch and what a headpiece - she can produce something. Well done.
- 3rd. KELLMAN DAISY DUKE: (Bred and owned R.V., D.A. & J.D. Helps)  
Pushed and shoved very very hard, a very very compact bitch, not the head properties of No. 1 but again very compact, beautifully constructed, standing on four beautiful feet and very well handled. Three very good bitches indeed.
- 4th. SUPPONION STELLATA: (bred and owned Mrs. C. McGuigan)  
Not to be overshadowed, a wee bit light in bone, a little light in body, beautiful neck and a perfect mouth, moves well, handler does well. Four lovely bitches.

JUNIOR BITCH:

- 1st. SELCUM SHIKAREE: (bred and owned Miss R. Black)  
A beautiful 15month old bitch, quality from the tip of her nose to the tip of her tail. Compact body, beautiful bend of stifle, perfect front, elbows tucked right under her sides, mouth correct, eyes right, a 100% beautiful bitch; she's a remarkable lovely thing.
- 2nd. AZANAX HEADSTART: (bred by Mr. R. Fox, owned Mr. C.J. Bird)  
Giving a bit away, but still remarkably sound, moves like a bomb, little light in bone for some, she's a terrier throughout, she's snappy, beautiful - and by that I don't mean snappy in temperment but snappy in looks - she's short, she's compact, nice neck, nice little neat head, lovely little ears, a very lovely little bitch.
- 3rd. CHERRICKALK CASCADE: (owned by M. & R. Burgoine)  
Again a quality-type bitch, not the head of No. 1, a nice wee eye, nice legs and feet, nice body, nice quarters, one I would think could do very very well with a nest of puppies.
- 4th. SHIRVIN SUSIE QUE: (bred and owned V. & S. Healand)  
A black and white brindle, a snappy thing. Her feet are not so brilliant, she's well handled, compact, nice bend of stifle, not 100% in front and she wants more body. She's 15months so needs feeding up.

INTERMEDIATE BITCH:

- 1st. AUST. CH. BELANOI SNOW CHERUB: (bred G. Handcock, owned by N. LeQuier)  
A beautiful 20months old bitch, overweight - just wants to lose a pound and very few will ever stop her - beautiful head, turned and packed - this is what they call a well-filled head with a roman downface. Ears are O.K. - biggy, but she's a remarkably nice bitch, fairly good front, nice shoulders, nice neck, nice compact body, but just got too much gut.

INTERMEDIATE BITCH CONTINUED:

- 2nd. ALASTOR RANGATOTO: (bred and owned by Mrs. N. Baker)  
A big heavyweight bitch, the type I like. Remarkable big powerful head - classy, she's still a bitch nobody could ever accuse her of being a dog - a real classical big thin perfect front, perfect mouth, super head, something again that will do a lot of winning, plus, by God, she'll do some breeding.
- 3rd. SUBMAREEN SFANGLES: (Bred Mr. & Mrs. W. McQuillen, owned by Emanjaro Kennels)  
A difficult little bugger, she's very ably handled, she's a wee bit straight in shoulder, she's got an imperfection in her mouth, she's wrong in shoulder and her front action is not right, she's got a compact beautiful body, she's a real classy little dame and her shoulders and a little bit of a mouth fault won't stop her from doing an awful lot. A nice wee bitch.
- 4th. CAMSLANG SHINING STAR: (bred H. & M. Lowden, owned J. Tsosmes)  
Well deserved her place, worked hard for it. Nice little bitch, not the soundest, at 26 months not a bad little bitch at all, quite classy.

LIMIT BITCH:

- 1st. FANGORN JUNGLE BUNNY (bred and owned W. & J. Whiting)  
Nice big 20 months bitch, white, has a bit of hock mone trouble at the sides but that's nothing - it's come with her season. Not so good on the move today, she has a good long well-filled head with a level mouth, all in all she's on the leg a little for me, but she's a very very nice quality bitch.
- 2nd. SUBMAREEN SABRE: (bred W. McQuillen, owned M. McQuillen)  
She would be better in a hammock, she wants a sleep. She sloppy, got a nice head, a light eye, ears are in limbo but she can carry them correctly if she tries. Handler did a lot that's possible with a little rubber doll. She's a nice quality bitch with a beautiful white coat. All in all she's not a bad wee bitch.
- 3rd. BADALLASANDLEWOOD: (bred and owned M. & R. Burgoine)  
A little bit light in bone, a nice type of bitch, a level mouth, a very nice terrier type.
- 4th. PRIGEE PRINCESS OPAL: (Bred and owned Prigge Knls.)  
She might consider herself lucky, she's the only one with a good mouth - a perfect mouth, nice head, a little bit 'bullie' in shoulders, cramps herself up and a wee bit soft in topline, but she's not so far behind the other three. Four very equal bitches.

OPEN BITCH:

- 1st CASTIG CHRISTOBELLE: (bred and owned Mr. & Mrs. Cook)  
Well, you in Aussie land would say "She's a beaut" and she is a beaut. Gorgeous head, gorgeous body, stands four-square, the head is absolutely gorgeous, a beautiful all-rounder.

OPEN BITCH CONTINUED:

2nd. AUST. CH. GILBO TONI: (bred B.Hine, owned Mr. & Mrs. Cook)  
Four year old goes into No. 2, perfect mouth, again with a superb head, nice front, feet not the best in this world, nice body, nice rear end, perfect ears. For four she's a gorgeous bitch.

3rd. AUST. CH. BODALLA SPANISH LADY: (bred and owned M. & R. Burgoine)  
Again beautifully handled, very capable lady who's handled well all day. A perfectly lovely bitch with beautiful neck, a lovely head, good mouth, she's got fur-lined tail, not a fault, just a passing remark - it's absolutely correct, a top class bitch.

4th AUST. CH. WODENSDAE WAG: owned M.K. & D.R Cross)  
A stunner. I put her into fourth place as she's carrying a back leg. No doubt all the wise people at ringside will say she's lame in her rear leg, but she's not. She's a bloody sight sounder with a slight limp than many of them walking up and down the ring. A superb bitch.

From the Open Bitch class came two bitches under 18 months. The first (116) is a superlative bitch in head, but she's had a shocking accident in front and smashed a shoulder and limbs, so she can't win, but the other one is an immature, fat pup of 9 months who missed the puppy class, and I gave it to the other simply on her virtues - the smashed shoulder won't stop her breeding.

My Best Bitch was from Open Class - and it appears I then had to pick the best under 18 months, which was my Junior Bitch - No 116 would easily have been my winner if she was sound. There was a bitch in the ring with two heavy marks on her head, a gorgeous headed bitch a little overweight - she'd have been the Reserve and the Bitch I gave Best Bitch under 18 months was pushed very, very hard and was a good reserve winner.

Now I have my Best Dog and Best Bitch in the ring. The dog over the bitch. - She was my challenge winner in Brisbane and the dog beat her - that says it all. He has a big long neck, a powerful head and is better on the move than the bitch. A high class bitch, a high class dog, and on a touch of the coin I gave it to the dog, a big powerful animal who should do very well for somebody.

I put the Dog Puppy over the Bitch - not a lot between them, the Bitch is beautiful and will have a big future, the dog is ready - he's an absolute stunner, a beautiful high-class thing who Phyllis McCombie gave Reserve Dog to yesterday, a very, very high class puppy - good luck to him.

I put the Open Bitch over the Open dog - she's a bloody good bitch, he's a bloody good dog - there's a lot of very good dogs in depth. The Best in Show is a credit and the dog in Open class troubled him a lot - the three are all very good; the bitch squeezed his place, the dog could knock her any time he wanted to. Then again today we'll have a female one, the Best Opposite Sex, and basically speaking looking at the lineup, it is reserve Best in Show.
