Additionally, the judge must be a financial member of a club affiliated with the National Bull Terrier Council (Australia). 2. Dogs Australia Championship Show approved judges who, although not current breeders, have bred or owned Bull Terrier and or Bull Terrier Miniatures for not less than ten years and retain close association with the breed/s and have demonstrated an abiding interest and close recent involvement with the breed/s. Additionally, the judge must be a financial member of a club affiliated with the National Bull Terrier Council (Australia). 5. APPLICATION FOR ROM a. Prerequisite that for owners to apply for ROM Certificates they must be financial members of a club affiliated with the National Bull Terrier Council (Australia). b. After gaining the points as detailed in Part 2 above, the owner is to apply to the Secretary NBTC(A) in writing or by email and include: 1. ROM Point Certificates (scan or photocopy), 2. A suitable photograph, and 3. Copy or scan of registration certificate. c. The award status ROM shall not be recognised until the ROM Certificate has been received by the owner. d. There shall be only one original ROM Certificate for the owner and one for the breeder, copies of the certificate may be purchased by the new owner.
