Dog Challenge: 3 year old male typical head. Foxy shape. Dark oval eye. Very good dentition. Nice expression. Well set ears. Nice outline with short coupled body. Excellent tail set. Excellent coat texture & condition. Excellent angulations. Free moves.

Bitch Challenge: 2 year old sable female. Feminine expression. Well set small ears. Very correct eyes and excellent presentation. Typical foxy head. Compact body. Excellent tail set. Excellent angulation. Excellent condition with outercoat texture & undercoat. Free moves. Excellent character.

Bitch Challenge: Very correct in size but today she could have slightly less coat under the body. I want to see more daylight under but she has a beautiful head, eyes and expression. Beautiful bones. A legacy to last a lifetime

An introduction to Miyu Pomeranians - Eunice Warner, a prominent figure in Pomeranians for over half a century

Eunice Warner has been a long time member & patron of the Pomeranian Club of NSW, some newer members may not be aware that Eunice along with her late husband Max had bred Pomeranians for over 60 years with Miyu Pomeranians as their prefix. countless Together they bred champions, with Ch. Miyu Royal Sherry winning Best in Show at the Pomeranian Speciality in 1978 and Ch. Miyu Ima Kelly winning the same in 1993. Notably, their most presiguous win was in 1977 at the Adelaide Royal

with Ch. Miyu Lucky Star being awarded Best in Show. A remarkable legacy for a remarkable woman.

Eunice celebrated her 90th Birthday this year, & we thank her for her continued patronage of the club. We hope to interview Eunice in a
