Meet Your Committee - Club President - Wayne Burton

Q. When did your interest in Purebred dogs start and what breed/s have you owned, bred and shown?

A. I purchased my first dog in 1968, an Afghan Hound. A very popular breed at the time and over the ensuing years I owned, bred and exhibited them and enjoyed some success. I also commenced handling other breeds for friends and these included Saluki, Bichon Frise, Basset Hounds and Standard Poodles. I owned and bred Standard Poodle for approximately 17 years and also had Shih Tzu and one Scottish Terrier. Whippets also followed. In recent times I enjoyed part owning an English Toy Terrier which allowed me to be more involved in the Toy breeds.



Q. How and when did you become involved in Yorkshire Terriers?

A. I had always admired Yorkies having seen them exhibited in the 70's and 80's and competed against them with my Afghans and Standard Poodles in General Special line ups. In particular, the lovely dogs of Mrs. Diane Crosby-Browne and her ANCROWNES KENNEL. Exhibiting in the Toy Group I met Alanna Gavan and her beautiful dogs and renewed my fondness for the breed. I guess the Yorkies accepted me and so the rest is history with Alanna and I being married in 2017.

Q. What is your opinion of the quality of the Yorkie breed today?

A. Like many breeds today, Yorkie numbers have declined and we do not see the entries that we enjoyed in the 70's, 80's and even 90's. The breed is not prolific in whelping terms i.e. 1 to 4 puppies is the norm. Demand for "pets" rather than show dogs is high and it takes a lot of commitment and dedication to maintain a Yorkie coat in show condition. However I feel the quality is still very high and our dogs in Australia could hold their own with those I have seen and judged overseas. The problems in the breed are universal - we want level top-lines, small ears and paramount is COAT and COLOUR!!!

I watched an entry of 300, yes 300, at the World Dog Show in Moscow and again an entry of 142 at the WDS in Germany last year with Alanna. Beautiful dogs, correct coats and colour, with just a few we thought could be "coloured". The other problem in the breed is the education of Judges. Too many do NOT understand the importance of coat and colour and tend to display little or no knowledge or understanding of what is required. As President, Owner and Judge I take every opportunity I can to discuss and explain to other judges, the qualities and detail of our unique little dogs. We as Club members need to encourage new owners to show and help promote our Yorkies.

BEWARE of Scammers!

Please be on guard when looking for a puppy - scammers are everywhere, whether it be someone overseas pretending to be in Australia asking you to send money, or a breeder that might be registered with their state body, but who is unethical.

How can you tell what's right? It's difficult, but if it doesn't feel right it probably isn't! A few points to note:

- Can you speak with the seller on the phone?
- Do they only answer emails in the middle of the night?
- Is the price too good to be true?
- Never deposit money into Western Union
- Only do bank transfer or pay cash when collecting your puppy
- Call the registered state body or other breeders for references.

It is important to look for a breeder that is registered with their state canine council for example Dogs NSW, Dogs QLD, Dogs VIC etc. By being a registered with a state body, breeders are bound by a code of ethics. The code of ethics covers topics like the conditions in which the dogs are kept, the age they are bred, the frequency they are bred, how and when they are sold and what should accompany them when they leave for their new home.

As per the Dogs NSW code of ethics.... Upon the sale or transfer of a dog, a member shall supply the new owner with a current vaccination certificate signed by a Veterinary Surgeon, evidencing that the dog has been immunised against Canine Distemper, Hepatitis and Parvo Virus along with microchip documentation.

You must also receive pedigree papers for the puppy. The papers will be Orange if the puppy is on Limited Register (i.e. purchased as a pet) and Blue if on Main Register.
